Montgomery County citizens have already made their choices on vaccination. This regulation, if enforced, will not have its intended effect of raising the vaccination rate materially. It *will* have the unintended negative effect of damaging local businesses that have already been decimated by the pandemic.

Not a *single person that I know* who is still unvaccinated is going to become vaccinated in order to be allowed into a covered establishment in Montgomery County.
