# **PRESENTATIONS**

A. Proclamation presented by Councilmember Jawando, Councilmember Stewart, and County Executive Elrich recognizing CCI Health Services' 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary.

The Council recessed at 9:26 a.m. and reconvened at 9:31 a.m.

## **GENERAL BUSINESS**

A. Announcements - Agenda and Calendar Changes

Ms. Rupp, Clerk of the Council, announced the introduction of Supplemental Appropriation #23-26 to the County Government's FY23 Operating Budget, Department of Transportation, The Chesapeake Bay Trust - Urban Trees Grant Award - \$148,233.

# (1) B. Acknowledgement - Receipt of Petitions

No petitions were received this week.

# (1.5) **PUBLIC HEARING - Expedited Bill 32-22**, Department of Health and Human Services - Structure and Positions

The public hearing was conducted. Additional materials for the Council's consideration should be submitted by the close of business on December 20, 2022. Action is tentatively scheduled for January 17, 2023.

# (2) **UPDATE:** Fiscal Plan

Participating in the discussion were Ms. Michaelson, Council Executive Director; Mr. Howard, Council Deputy Director; Ms. Bryant, Director, Office of Management and Budget (OMB); Mr. Coveyou (virtually), Director, and Mr. Watters, Deputy Director, Department of Finance.

Ms. Michaelson provided a summary of the expected revisions to the County's revenues in FY23 based on actual collections to-date, assumed additional revenue that will be received in the coming months, and estimated annual expenditures based on Quarter 1 spending for the County Government.

Mr. Howard provided a summary of increases in tax revenue in FY23, but an overall reduction in expected revenue in FY24-28. Additionally, Mr. Howard noted that the County Government's FY23 expenditures will be \$19.4 million greater than the FY23 approved budget. This estimate is based on the County's actual expenditures through Quarter 1 of FY23 and are primarily due to expenditures in the Department of Health and Human Services, overtime in Fire and Rescue Services, and higher than anticipated participation in the Working Families Income Supplement. Mr. Coveyou also shared that most economists expect a mild recession in FY23 or FY24.

Ms. Stewart, Chair of the Government Operations and Fiscal Policy (GO) Committee, requested a memo outlining detailed information regarding the additional \$61.8 million in new expenses for this fiscal year and why these expenses were not included in the original budget to consider when finalizing the FY24 budget.

Mr. Friedson recommended proceeding cautiously with spending decisions as there may be a future economic slowdown and rising costs. He requested a report to be presented to the GO Committee or Council of income tax revenue - 3 - 12/13/2022

assumptions and compare that to the expected drop off due to an economic downturn to better forecast future income tax revenue. He also recommended that the Revenue Estimating Group meet regularly and meet with the GO Committee and Council. Mr. Friedson also requested a briefing on the status of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) reimbursement assumptions made in the FY23 budget. Finally, Mr. Friedson noted the need for a change to the dates set for Revenue Estimating Group report deadlines to better align with other revenue and spending estimate timelines.

Ms. Sayles requested information on the spending plans for the excess revenue from FY22 and FY23 and plans to better fund underfunded programs. In response to Ms. Sayles' question, Ms. Bryant confirmed that the County Executive intends to continue funding the County's food distribution centers model in the future. Mr. Watters shared that the services provided are beginning to be reviewed, as the FY24 funding requests for each site are submitted. Ms. Sayles also requested an update on American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds, specifically what funds have been distributed, what has been spent, and what funds are expected to be spent in the future.

Mr. Albornoz noted the expected increased construction costs and its impact to the Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Budget. Ms. Bryant stated that information is still being collected from partners and the State, so the inflationary increase is not yet known for FY24. Moreover, Ms. Michaelson noted that there is expected to be a decrease in the recordation tax, so may be a cause to apply any excess funding from FY23 to the CIP. Mr. Albornoz and Mr. Jawando highlighted the need to coordinate the timing of these decisions with the upcoming FY24 budget submission from the County Executive.

Mr. Coveyou provided an update that residential property sales have decreased, creating the expected revenue reduction from the recordation tax. Mr. Jawando requested information on tax revenue from commercial and residential property sales, and sales price information.

Ms. Balcombe requested when the Council considers supplemental appropriations, that the Council also receives a report of the impact on the reserves and what reserves spending has already been approved.

Mr. Katz requested data on the tax payments of the top 50 highest paying residents.

Noting an ongoing concern with procurement delivery delays and cost increases, Ms. Luedtke requested data on procurement activities starting in FY20 or FY21, illustrating the timeline of when a procurement decision was made and when the item/service was delivered/implemented, and if there was a cost increase if delivery/implementation was delayed.

At Ms. Sayles' request, Mr. Watters will provide Council with the Grant process timeline for FY23. Ms. Sayles noted that before budget decisions are made for FY24, there is a need for consideration to better fund current programs that are underfunded, such as the bike share program in East County.

# A. Introduction - Zoning Text Amendment (ZTA) 22-11, Technical Corrections

Ms. Ndou, Legislative Attorney, participated in the discussion.

Mr. Friedson noted that this ZTA is required to make technical corrections to the zoning code in light of the increased number of Councilmembers.

# B. Introduction - Zoning Text Amendment (ZTA) 22-12, Overlay Zones - Clarksburg East & West Environmental Overlay - Exemptions

Ms. Ndou participated in the discussion and provided a summary of the purpose of the Bill.
