(2) **Introduction of Bills:**

A. <u>Bill 1-23</u>, Property Tax Credit - Elderly Individuals and Retired Military Services Members - Amendments

Introduced draft #1 of **Bill 1-23**, sponsored by Mr. Katz and co-sponsored by Councilmembers Luedtke, Balcombe, Friedson, Fani-González, and Albornoz. A public hearing is scheduled for February 7, 2023, at 1:30 p.m.

Councilmembers Jawando, Glass, Sayles, Mink, and Stewart requested to be added as co-sponsors of the subject Bill.

B. Expedited Bill 2-23, Board of Investment Trustees - Membership - Amendments

Introduced draft #1 of **Expedited Bill 2-23**, sponsored by the Council President at the request of the County Executive. A public hearing is scheduled for February 7, 2023, at 1:30 p.m.

(3) Call of Bills for Final Reading:

A. Expedited Bill 32-22, Department of Health and Human Services - Structure and Positions

Senior Legislative Attorney Wellons and Chief Administrative Officer Stoddard participated in the discussion.

Ms. Wellons reviewed the purpose of **Expedited Bill 32-22**, as contained in the staff report.

Supported without objection Mr. Friedson's motion to amend the Expedited Bill by inserting after line 11 the following language: <u>The Chief of Public Health Services also serves as the Deputy Health Officer.</u> Ms. Wellons noted that Executive Regulation 22-22 would be updated to reflect this additional language.

Supported without objection Mr. Friedson's motion to amend the Expedited Bill by adding language to reflect that the County Health Officer must be a licensed physician.

Enacted draft #1 of **Expedited Bill 32-22**, as amended and shown at the end of these minutes.

Mr. Friedson made the motion and the Expedited Bill was enacted by a roll call vote:

(4) **ACTION** - Resolution to approve Executive Regulation 18-22, Performance-Based Pay

Ms. Wellons, Ms. Kassiri, Deputy Chief Administrative Officer, and Mr. Martin, Executive Director, Merit System Protection Board (MSPB), participated in the discussion.

Ms. Wellons reviewed the purpose of the Executive Regulation which would allow the Executive Director of the Montgomery County Employee Retirement Plans (MCERP) to receive enhanced performance-based pay.

Ms. Stewart, Chair of the Government Operations and Fiscal Policy (GO) Committee, noted the difficulty in recruiting qualified applicants for the position of MCERP Executive Director due to the current pay scale, and expressed support for moving forward with the Executive Regulation.

Ms. Balcombe expressed concern that the creation of a bonus structure for one position sets a bad precedent and encouraged staff to consider restructuring the position to bring its pay scale up to market rate.

Mr. Jawando requested and received confirmation that Executive Branch staff would review the MCERP Executive Director position holistically to develop options for possible future consideration by the Council.

Mr. Friedson suggested a broader look at the merit system performance measures is needed as well as a review of how bonuses are handled within County government to ensure they are distributed equitably.

Mr. Albornoz suggested that salary reviews of appointed officials may be needed to ensure the County remains competitive in recruiting qualified candidates and that such reviews may need to be conducted by an outside contractor.

Adopted **Resolution 20-16**, approving Executive Regulation 18-22 as submitted by the County Executive. Ms. Stewart made the motion, which carried unanimously.

AN EXPEDITED ACT to:

- (1) add the Chief of Public Health Services as a non-merit position in the Department of Health and Human Services;
- (2) eliminate the Chief Operating Officer as a non-merit position in the Department of Health and Human Services; [[and]]
- (3) delete the requirement that the County Health Officer also serve as the Chief of the Direct Service Division for Public Health Services in the Department of Health and Human Services; and
- (4) generally amend the law regarding the structure of public health positions in the County.

By amending

Montgomery County Code Chapter 2, Administration [[Section]] <u>Sections 2-42 and</u> 2-42A

The County Council for Montgomery County, Maryland approves the following Act:

Sec. 1. [[Section]] <u>Sections 2-42 and 2-42A [[is]] are amended as follows:</u>

2-42. Health officer.

- The County Health Officer:
- (1) has the functions assigned by State law; and
- 5 <u>(2)</u> must be a licensed physician.

2-42A. Functions, powers, and duties.

7 * * *

(b) Non-merit positions. The Department has 5 senior level management positions that are non-merit positions. These positions consist of a chief [operating officer] of Public Health Services; a chief of Services to End and Prevent Homelessness; a chief of Aging and Disability Services; a chief of Behavioral Health and Crisis Services; and a chief of Children, Youth, and Family Services. [In addition, the Health Officer referred to in Section 2-42 serves as the chief of the Direct Service Division for Public Health Services.] The chief of Public Health Services also serves as the Deputy Health Officer.

Sec. 2. Expedited effective date. The Council declares that this legislation is necessary for the immediate protection of the public interest. This Act takes effect on the date on which it becomes law.
