Good evening members of the County Council. I appreciate your time and am honored to speak with you.

My name is Carlos Marroquin and I am a Montgomery College alum.

I am also a former Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) teacher, a current education professor at Montgomery College, and a Silver Spring resident.

Montgomery College has played such an important role in my life. I was raised a lot of my life in Montgomery County, more specifically Silver Spring. I attended Montgomery County Public Schools as a student and graduated from Montgomery Blair High School. During my time as a student in MCPS, I struggled a little bit to find success. Throughout my whole public-school experience, I wanted to find a teacher that I could relate to—a teacher who looked like me and had a similar upbringing. Unfortunately, while I had many amazing teachers, I never found the teacher I was looking for. This inspired me to want to become a teacher so I could motivate and work with students who were like me.

I wasn't sure how I would become a teacher, but I knew I needed a college degree. As the first in my family to go to college, I did not have a lot of guidance on how to accomplish my dream. I knew I needed an affordable option. The one piece of advice I was given was to apply to Montgomery College.

So, I woke up early one morning and went to the MC admissions office, and applied to be a student at MC. I did not know it then, but that would be one of the best decisions I ever made in my life.
