For about a year and a half I had to seek help with friends and different organization. I was in a very precarious situation.

Fortunately, the government approved the Temporary Protection Status (TPS) for Venezuelan and I was able to obtain the legal documents to work in this county.

However, not everybody is so lucky. There are many immigrants that remain undocumented for years. Many young people that graduate from College here in the States, have a hard time finding jobs because of their legal status.

It concerns me to see how many of our children are able to go to college but cannot find a job because of their legal status.

I am testifying about this issue in behalf of my daughter and all the students that experience the same situation. I want them to have the same future as the citizens that grew up in this county.

It would be very beneficial if the County has a program to help all those students that have graduated from County colleges.
