Capital Improvement Program Testimony to Montgomery County Council By Junhua Liu, Sumeet Sharma, Vivian Xu, MCCPTA Wootton Cluster Coordinators February 5, 2025

Good evening, Councilmembers,

My name is **Joe**, and I stand before you as a **Wootton Cluster Coordinator** and a **deeply concerned community member.** Tonight, we demand **immediate action** to fund and accelerate long-overdue capital improvement projects for **Thomas S. Wootton High School, Cold Spring Elementary School, and DuFief Elementary School.**

For far too long, the Wootton cluster has been overlooked while other schools received much-needed renovations. We have waited, we have followed the process, and yet our schools continue to deteriorate while MCPS delays our projects further. This pattern of neglect must stop.

Thomas S. Wootton High School – A Community Betrayed

Let me be clear: MCPS has failed the Wootton community.

Wootton high school was first added in the CIP schedule in **2009** with completion set for **2018**. Fast forward **15** years, and our students are still sitting in **the same crumbling building**—now with **no scheduled renovation** date at all.

Wootton is one of only two high schools in the county that has never undergone a major capital improvement. And now, instead of securing its long-overdue renovation, it has been completely removed from the CIP schedule with a "TBD" status. This is unacceptable and a blatant disregard for our students, teachers, and community.

The conditions inside Wootton High School are disgraceful:

- A non-functioning HVAC system and unsafe air ventilation, creating an unhealthy learning environment.
- Leaking roofs and pipes causing classroom disruptions and facility damage.
- Antiquated electrical wiring and inadequate safety equipment in science classrooms.
- Broken and unsanitary bathrooms posing serious health risks to students and staff.
- Narrow hallways that prevent students from getting to class on time.
- A dangerously designed front driveway, which has led to multiple safety incidents—including a student suffering a concussion after being hit by a car last year.

While we appreciate the funding for ADA improvements, these minor updates do not replace the desperate need for a full renovation or rebuild. A prime example: the school has only two elevators, one of which is

frequently broken. Imagine the daily **struggles** of students with disabilities just trying to navigate the building. **This is not equity.**

Beyond the **physical** conditions, Wootton's environment has led to **mental health concerns.** In the past year alone, Wootton has received **multiple bomb threats**. **Our students should not have to endure this.**

We **demand** that Wootton High School be reinstated into the CIP schedule **with a dedicated funding commitment** to move this project forward **immediately.**

To understand the severity of the conditions, we **formally invite all council members to visit Wootton High School** and experience firsthand **what our students and teachers go through every day.**

DuFief Elementary School – A Promise Broken

The situation at DuFief Elementary is equally frustrating. A major expansion project was previously approved and scheduled to address overcrowding and critical repairs—but then, it was unexpectedly removed from the CIP list a few years ago.

Since then, necessary **maintenance projects have been denied**, leaving students and staff to deal with **temporary band-aid fixes** while waiting for a promised project that never came.

While we acknowledge the feasibility study recommendation, we insist that this process be accelerated and fully funded with clear action steps based on previous planning work.

Cold Spring Elementary School – A Flawed Design That Must Be Addressed

We appreciate the **major capital project recommendation** for Cold Spring ES, but we emphasize that the feasibility study must include **a broad scope** to address its unique challenges, including:

- The open classroom concept, which negatively impacts learning by creating excessive noise and distractions.
- **Inadequate safety measures** during severe weather or emergencies.

Cold Spring must remain on the CIP list with a firm commitment to addressing these serious issues.

Robert Frost Middle School - Long Overdue for a Feasibility Study

Built in **1971**, Robert Frost Middle School has **never undergone a major renovation**. We request that it be **added to the list for a future feasibility study** to assess long-term infrastructure needs.

Conclusion – No More Delays, No More Excuses

For too long, Wootton cluster schools have been pushed aside while other projects move forward. Years of delays and broken promises have left our schools in a state of disrepair. Enough is enough.

Smart capital investments now will save the county money in the long run by preventing further deterioration and costly emergency repairs. Addressing these issues is not just about fixing buildings—it's about ensuring safe, healthy, and equitable learning environments for our children.

Montgomery County claims to uphold equity and inclusion—but actions speak louder than words. The Wootton community is diverse, with 12 % Black students, 12% Hispanic students, 29% white students, 40% Asian students. The ongoing neglect of our schools raises serious concerns about equitable treatment. We demand the same investment and attention given to other clusters.

We **demand** your commitment to **fully funding our projects** through completion and **expediting** their timelines. **Our students cannot and should not have to wait any longer.**
