celebrating a Muslim holiday in Jerusalem. Mistral, based in Bethesda Maryland, markets the Israeli-made spray to U.S. Police. The MIDC hosted Defense Industry Summit where the Mistral CEO was a noted speaker.

The Justification for MIDC is Leading Elected Officials to Overlook the Moral Imperative
