I am a 30-year resident of Germantown, Maryland, and I spend a great deal of time at my local parks including Black Hill Regional Park. As Montgomery County grows with new housing developments going up each year – including massive growth right outside Black Hill Regional Park – I can't imagine the county cutting funding at a time when more people are visiting parks and putting more demands on the resources.

With the possibility that the federal government will start closing local federal lands or reducing visitor services there due to budget and staffing cuts, it's even more crucial that we support our parks at home in Maryland.

Please give Montgomery County parks a 7.2% budget increase so they can maintain the quality of service and keep pace with inflation.
