Councilman Friedson,

I am a resident of District 1. I received your letter indicating you would not support property tax increases to fund the public schools. I was sorry to hear that.

Your letter acknowledges that education is a priority. Yet you don't want to raise taxes to support that priority. In fact, our county is known for its excellent schools: their high standards, record of achievement and the broad spectrum of services for children with learning challenges. A commitment to public school education is hollow if we are unwilling to sacrifice for it.

Yes, times are hard for many. And an "anti-tax" stance may be a popular talking point. But the facts are these: the tax increase can only be used for school funding and the entire school community; and we currently pay less per pupil in real dollars than we did before the 2008 recession.

I urge you to Support the County Executive's proposed 3.5 cent property tax rate increase required to fully fund Montgomery County Public Schools.
