

<u>July 8, 2025 – Testimony before the Montgomery County Council</u>

Good afternoon, my name is Diane Cameron, and I'm testifying on behalf of Transit Alternatives to Midcounty Highway Extended – TAME Coalition.

- 1) We ask you to remove the proposed M-83 highway five-mile northern section from the Master Plan of Highways and Transitways as recommended by the Planning Board.
- 2) Removing M83 from the master plan is saving our forest parks and enabling transit alternatives to thrive in the upcounty.

In contrast, keeping M83 in the master plan is protecting a fossil fuel project, enabling it to be built at any time, damaging our communities.

- > It would be a mistake to believe "M83 is dead, so we can keep it in the master plan" many forests and streams were wrecked by highway projects widely seen as dead until they were built.
- 3) We are for transit and transportation choice.
- > Traffic congestion is a real problem, and action to alleviate it is needed. M83 would make congestion worse, not better. That's why we urgently need to invest in transit in the upcounty.
- > The Germantown, Lake Forest, and Shady Grove transit centers are hotspots in the Ride On Bus system. **Thank you for making Ride On Buses Fare-Free for All.**
- > We support *Ride On Reimagined*, and its goal of making transit the first choice for mobility. More-frequent bus service is key. We also support MARC train service expansion; and are happy to report that MARC train ridership has surged in 2025.
- > Often, we hear exciting plans for upcounty transit; then, we learn these projects are "stretch goals" pushed years into the future.
- > Keeping M83 in the master plan takes attention away from transit programs, and starves them of funding.



- 4) Today you're hearing from County residents and civic groups.
 - >There's another group you'll be hearing from: the highway lobby construction firms who profit from highway contracts and off-site "mitigations."
 - > While the highway lobby is counting on lucrative contracts, residents have a much larger stake in the Council's decision on M83: our public investment in transit, and our need for public forests and greenspaces for our health and well-being, that M83 threatens to damage and destroy.
- 5) By removing M83 from the master plan, you'll be removing an obstacle to the transit investments we need to make *now*.

We ask you to remove the proposed M83 highway five-mile northern section from the Master Plan of Highways and Transitways.
