The County Council for Montgomery County, Maryland approves the following Act:

Sec. 1. Section 2-60 is amended as follows:

2-60. Criminal Justice Coordinating Commission.

(a) *Established.* There is a Criminal Justice Coordinating Commission.

(b) *Composition; officers; terms of members; meetings; staff.*

(1) The Commission has 32 members.

(3) The following individuals are ex-officio members of the Commission:

(A) Chair of the County Council's Public Safety Committee, or
another member of the Public Safety Committee;

* * *

Sec. 2. Expedited Effective Date.

The Council declares that this legislation is necessary for the immediate protection of the public interest. This Act takes effect on the date on which it becomes law.
