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**AN ACT to:**

- (1) require the Executive to [[create a Neighborhood Action Team]] submit quarterly reports to the Council regarding quality of life issues;
- (2) [[specify the duties and membership of the Neighborhood Action Team]] require the Executive to hold semiannual meetings with County residents to discuss quality of life issues; and
- (3) generally amend County laws related to housing and building maintenance standards.

*The County Council for Montgomery County, Maryland approves the following Act:*

1           **Sec. 1. Section ~~[[26-19]] 26-18A~~ is added as follows:**

2       ~~[[26-19]] 26-18A. [[Neighborhood Action Team]] Outreach on Quality of Life~~  
3       Issues.

4           ~~[[a)]~~ Creation. The Executive must create a Neighborhood Action Team to  
5           address visual blight and other quality of life issues in the County.

6           ~~(b)~~ Membership.

7               (1) The Neighborhood Action Team must include representatives  
8               from:

9                       (A) the Department of Transportation;

10                      (B) the Department of Housing and Community Affairs;

11                      (C) the Department of Permitting Services;

12                      (D) the Department of Environmental Protection;

13                      (E) the Police Department; and

14                      (F) any other representative the Regional Services Center  
15                      Director or the Executive finds necessary.


16               (2) By September 1 of each year, the Executive must submit the  
17               names and position titles of the members of the Neighborhood  
18               Action Team to the Council.

19           ~~(c)~~ Duties. The Neighborhood Action Team must convene at the request of  
20           any Regional Services Center Director or other individual designated by  
21           the Executive. After convening, the Neighborhood Action Team must  
22           create a plan with recommended actions to address visual blight and  
23           other quality of life issues in any affected community.  
24           Recommendations may include increasing enforcement of violations of  
25           County laws related to housing maintenance standards, parking, and  
26           solid waste disposal.

27           (d) Report. By December 1, 2017 and each December 1 thereafter, the  
 28           Executive must submit a report to the Council that includes activities,  
 29           accomplishments, plans, and objectives of the Neighborhood Action  
 30           Team.]]

31           The Executive must submit quarterly reports to the Council that includes  
 32           activities, plans, and objectives of Executive branch departments to address instances  
 33           in which an aggregation of problems has led to diminished quality of life for affected  
 34           residents in an affected community. Contents of the annual report can include  
 35           recommendations to increase enforcement of violations of County laws related to  
 36           housing maintenance standards, parking, and solid waste disposal. The Executive, or  
 37           the Executive's designee, must hold semiannual meetings with County residents to  
 38           discuss these problems.




