SUBJECT: Resolution to adopt Expedited Bill 16-17, Swimming Pools – Lifeguards – Amendments as a Board of Health Regulation

Background

- 1. County Code §2-65, as amended, provides that the County Council is, and may act as, the County Board of Health, and in that capacity may adopt any regulation which a local Board of Health is authorized to adopt under state law.
- 2. Maryland Code Health-General Article §3-202 authorizes the County Board of Health to adopt rules and regulations regarding any nuisance or cause of disease in the County.
- 3. On [Date], the Council held a public hearing on this regulation. As required by law, each municipality in the County and the public were properly notified of this hearing.
- 4. On October 31, 2017, the County Council enacted Expedited Bill 16-17, Swimming Pools Lifeguards Amendments. Expedited Bill 16-17 requires certain public pools at certain facilities to have a lifeguard on duty when the pool is open for use during certain hours; requires public pools that do not have a lifeguard on duty to meet certain criteria, including posting certain warning signs; and requires public pools that do not have a lifeguard on duty to have an employee on site with a valid infant/child/adult cardiopulmonary resuscitation certificate.
- 5. The County Council, sitting as the Board of Health, finds after reviewing the evidence in the record that requiring lifeguards at public pools during certain hours as required by this Regulation is necessary to protect the health of County residents.
