By amending the following sections of the Montgomery County Zoning Ordinance, Chapter 59 of the Montgomery County Code:

Division 3.4. "Civic and Institutional Uses"

Section 3.4.2. "Charitable, Philanthropic Institution"

Charitable, Philanthropic Institution 3 * 4 5 В. **Use Standards** Where a Charitable, Philanthropic Institution is allowed as a limited 6 1. 7 use, it must satisfy the following standards: The Charitable, Philanthropic Institution must be primarily for 8 a. the provision of support and hospitality services for persons 9 who are present as a result of treatment or care being provided 10 to a member of their household by a federal treatment facility or 11 a Hospital. 12 Services may be provided daily, during any hours, to persons b. 13 who are not permanent residents of the premises but are present 14 as a result of treatment or care being provided to a member of 15 16 their household by a federal treatment facility or a Hospital. The support and hospitality services are provided without 17 c. 18 payment. Food may be prepared on the premises and may be distributed 19 d. for off-site consumption but must be provided without payment. 20 The Charitable, Philanthropic Institution must use an existing 21 [d]e. detached house and must retain the appearance of a detached 22 23 house. [e]f. The maximum number of guests that may reside on the 24 property at one time is 8, excluding: 25 i. resident staff; or 26
