### Old Georgetown Road Project, Contract No. CI5675E14--Night Work

Dear Customer:

Crews working for WSSC Water will be in your neighborhood soon to replace our aging pipes and manholes as part of our comprehensive sewer rehabilitation program. **Construction to replace/install three manholes and replace approximately 252 Feet of WSSC Water sewer mains. The work is expected to begin on or about August 10, 2020, and be complete by October 2020, weather permitting. [As a requirement of the permit, work on this project will take place overnight.](#)**

Final restoration of sidewalks, roadways and landscaping will take place within 90 days of construction completion. Projects completed during the winter months will be restored the following spring. Please see the project map on the back to view the streets where work will be taking place. A WSSC Water inspector will supervise the work, which is being performed by SAK Construction.

#### **WHAT TO EXPECT**

- This project will require excavation to replace a sewer main and three manholes. Whenever possible, WSSC Water works to minimize disruption to roadways and the environment. However, minimally invasive sewer rehabilitation methods include:
  - **Pipe Bursting:** This method involves constructing pits to access the section of pipe to be repaired. The contractor pulls a device through the line, bursting the old pipe and inserting a new plastic pipe in its place. When working within a roadway, the pavement will be cut prior to excavation of the pit.

#### **IMPACTS**

- Anticipated work hours: **Sunday beginning at 9:00 p.m. through Friday at 5:00 a.m.** As a requirement of the permit for this project, work will take place **OVERNIGHT**. Work may occasionally extend beyond these hours to complete specific tasks.
- Additional Noise: Generators, air compressors, road saws and large maintenance vehicles are needed to complete this work.
- WSSC Water works to minimize impacts to your water service, however, there will be occasions when your water service is disrupted. WSSC Water will provide 48-hour advanced notice prior to any planned water service interruptions.
- There may be temporary changes to traffic patterns and/or parking restrictions. Any vehicles that have not been removed from the area (as denoted by "No Parking" signs) by the time the parking restrictions take effect will be towed to a nearby street at no cost to the owner.
- Directly impacted residents will receive 48-hour advanced notice prior to any water service interruptions or parking restrictions. During parking restriction hours, you will still have access to your home.
