The Montgomery County Department of Environmental Protection, in collaboration with the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission, is planning to restore approximately 4,800 feet of degraded stream channel along upper portions of Hollywood Branch, a tributary of the Paint Branch, between the culvert downstream at Cannon Road and the culvert upstream at Midland Road.

This tributary was identified as a priority for restoration in the Lower Paint Branch Watershed Restoration Study (February 2006). Hollywood Branch has been degraded by years of uncontrolled storm flows which has impacted habitat for fish and other aquatic life. The County plans to stabilize eroded streambanks, improve floodplain access, restore stream habitat, create wetlands, and reforest stream buffer areas. The project will provide environmental benefits, improve adjacent property values and aesthetics where reasonably possible, and provide community education opportunities.



Spring/Summer 2013 , due to permitting process


