Batchellors Run & Woodlawn Stream Restoration Projects

The Montgomery County Department of Environmental Protection, in collaboration with the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, is planning to restore the Batchellors Run tributary for about 1,000 feet on either side of the Layhill Road crossing. The County will also be restoring approximately 2,000 feet of the Right Fork of Northwest Branch north of Ednor Road.

These tributaries were identified as priorities for restoration in the Northwest Branch Watershed Feasibility Study (July 2000). These streams have been degraded by years of uncontrolled storm flows which have impacted habitat for fish and other aquatic life. The County plans to stabilize eroded streambanks, restore stable habitat, create wetlands, and reforest stream buffer areas.


