# Pay-your-way Presentation/Waste Zero by Rachel Virgin, New England (approx 5:45)

- Pricing mechanism is key (e.g., bag fee)
- Recycling has leveled off; state cannot accommodate trash generated
- Unit-based pricing (UBP) is the fastest, fairest way to reduce trash (bag-based)
- Uniform carts work well; variable rates/sizes are costly

- Bag-based UBP reduced waste 40-50% in a pilot program in New Windsor, Maryland; it was not adopted for political reasons and misinformation (e.g. illegal dumping fears)
- Pay-your-way is a hybrid approach towards UBP that allows choice: households can elect UBP or flat rate
- Local stores carry bags for purchase; managed by WasteZero
- Step-wise approach to reduction

# Q&A from SWAC (6:26)

- Implementation costs discussed
- Manual vs automated collection (cart tippers, mechanized arm) discussed
- Likely increase in items donated vs thrown in a pay-to-throw system

# RRMD Update: 7 pm (Alan)

Electronics and battery collections for residents

- Schedule pick-up by calling 311
- All existing contracts are being renewed
- Mailer is being sent to residents about two weeks prior to start
- Battery recycling instructions will also be provided
- Sequential rollout, by December all residents will be able to schedule
- Pattern shows surge at beginning that tapers off and stays at consistent level
- All household batteries (alkaline and rechargeable, but not, for example, car batteries)

# Amy: Plastic Bag Ban (7:10)

- Councilmember Stewart's ban approved!
- 10 cent fee (exemptions for certain establishments and for those on SNAP or WIC)
- Businesses required to advertise, they keep 5 cents

- Budget update from Anthony Skinner
- Chaz will be working on SWAC priorities

Public Briefing Last Monday by Arcadis/DEP before County Council (7:20, summarized by Lauren)

- Council asked DEP to discuss how waste would be handled under "emergency extension" for transfer station and incinerator
- Arcadis attended and advised that transition would be require 7 years
- DEP seems to understand, community wants more information/justification
- No financial data presented and lot of cost issues
- Sugarloaf Citizens Association proposed food composting at Dickerson site once incinerator closed

- Jeff explained that there are various timelines, not all are 7 years; more information will be forthcoming (hopefully cost info in the next month)
- Willie will address outstanding questions (at next meeting)
