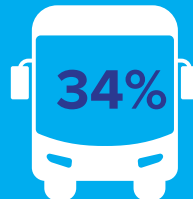


FAMILIAR WITH DEDICATED BUS LANES

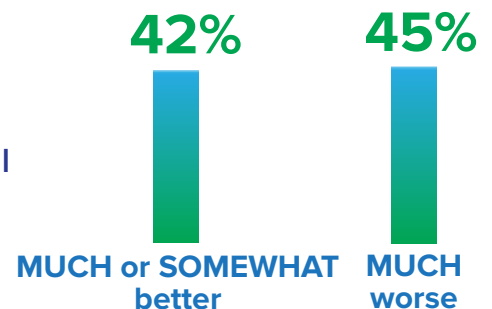

When asked about the impact dedicated bus lanes would have on overall travel in the area, respondents said:



SURVEY DEMOGRAPHICS

- 207 surveys completed
- 54% of respondents identified as White; 17% preferred not to answer
- 51% were men, 33% women, 16% non-binary, prefer to self-describe or prefer not to answer
- 80% of respondents reported living in zip code 20901 or 20902
- 34% between ages of 18-40; 37% 41-65 (71% 18-65)
- 15% reported speaking a language other than English at home

MCDOT

This is a 12-month pilot, followed by an evaluation. MCDOT will then determine whether the Dedicated Bus Lanes will remain on this section of University Boulevard beyond the planned pilot timeline. This effort is a part of MCDOT's Bus Priority Project initiatives in partnership with Ride On and WMATA to improve transit service in the community. Additional bus lanes are planned throughout Montgomery County.
