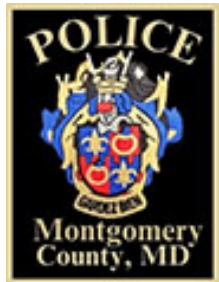

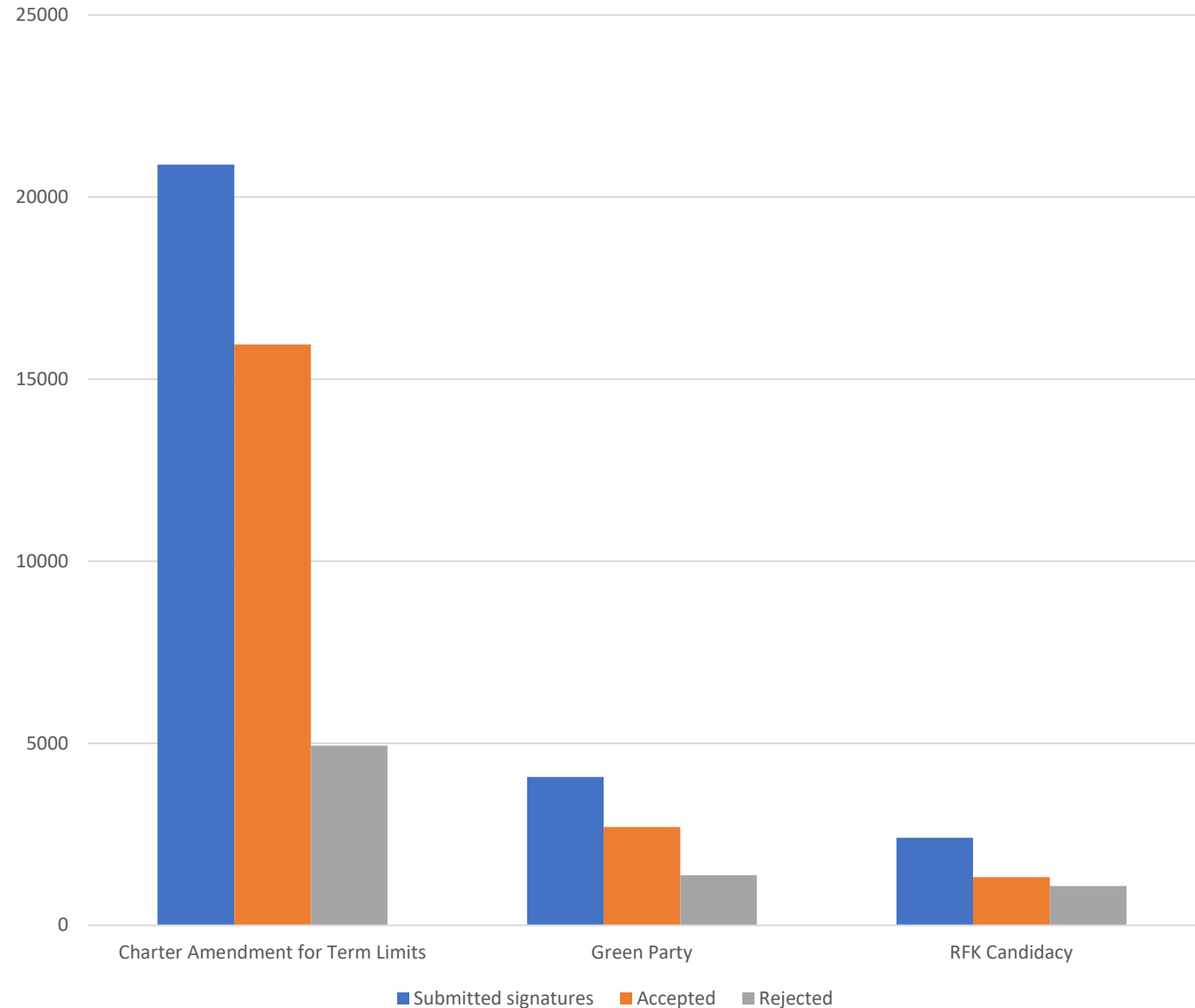

- The General Election ballot order consisted of 879,150 paper ballots

2024 PETITIONS

- 3 Petitions Submitted
- County Charter Amendment for County Executive Term Limits, and statewide Green Party and Robert F. Kennedy Jr. Candidacy
- 27,365 signatures submitted across the 3 petitions
- 19,980 signatures accepted
- All three petitions collected sufficient number of verified signatures

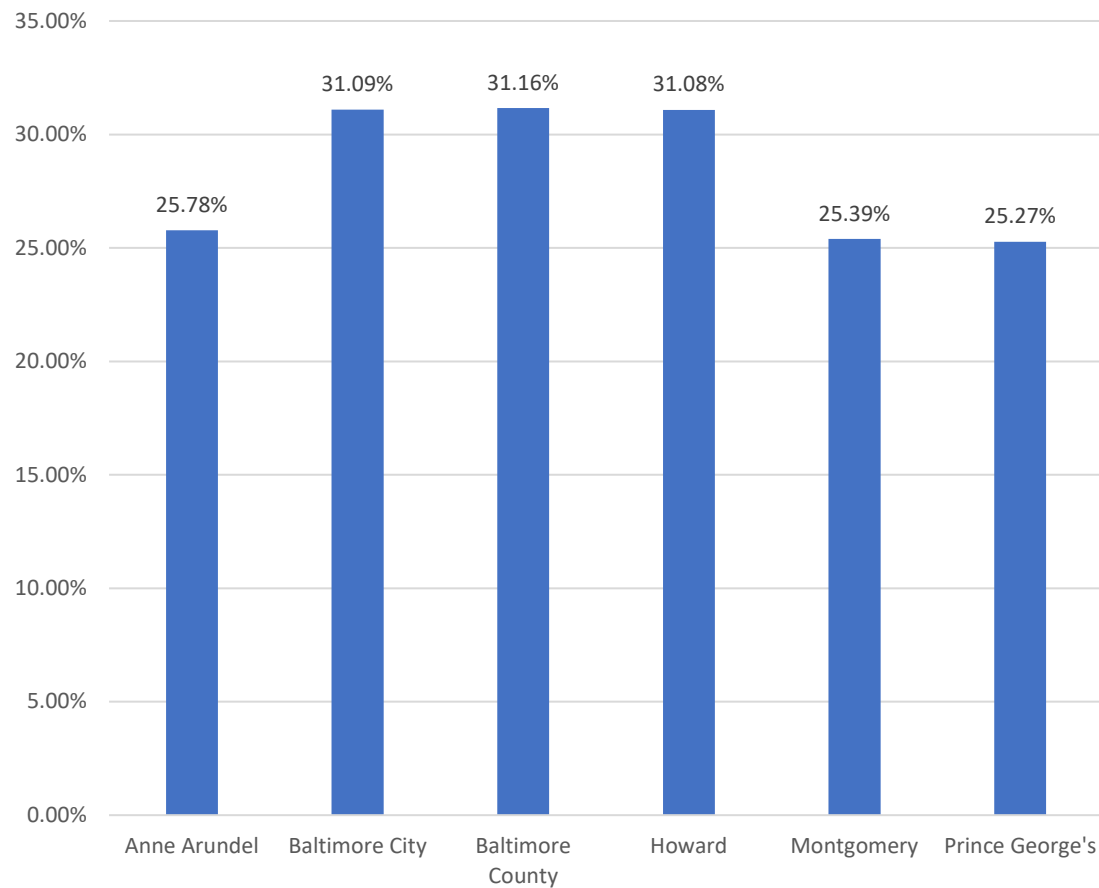

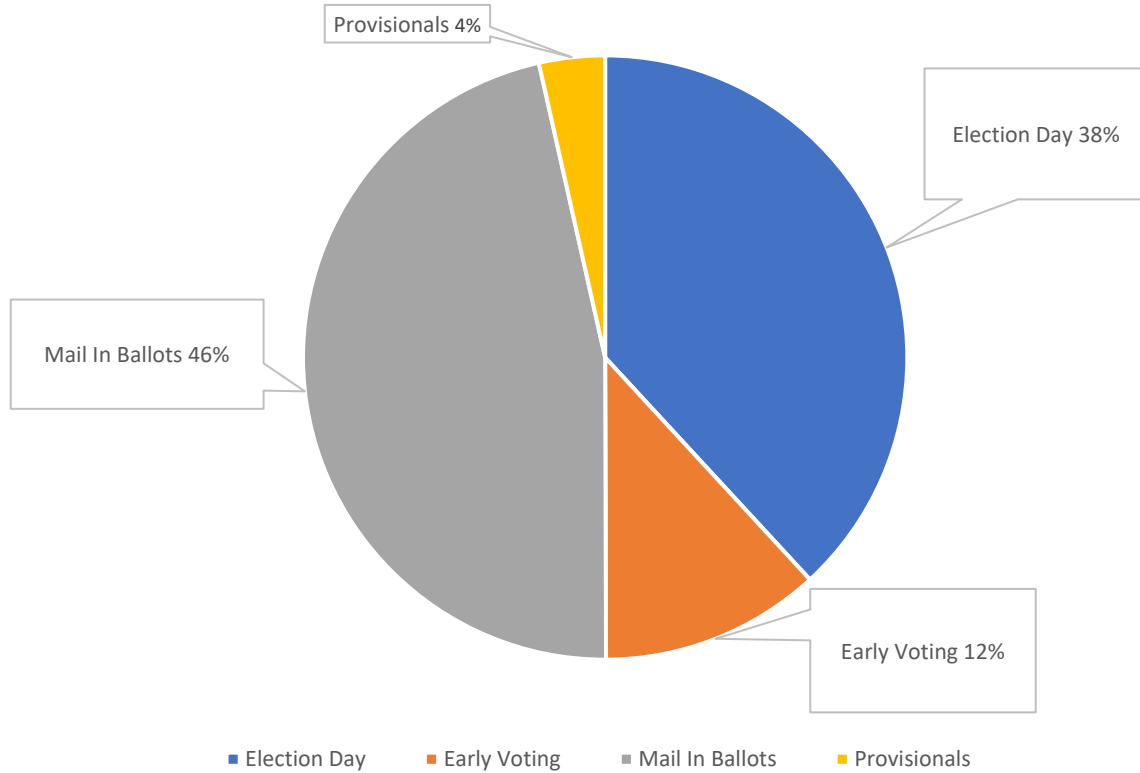

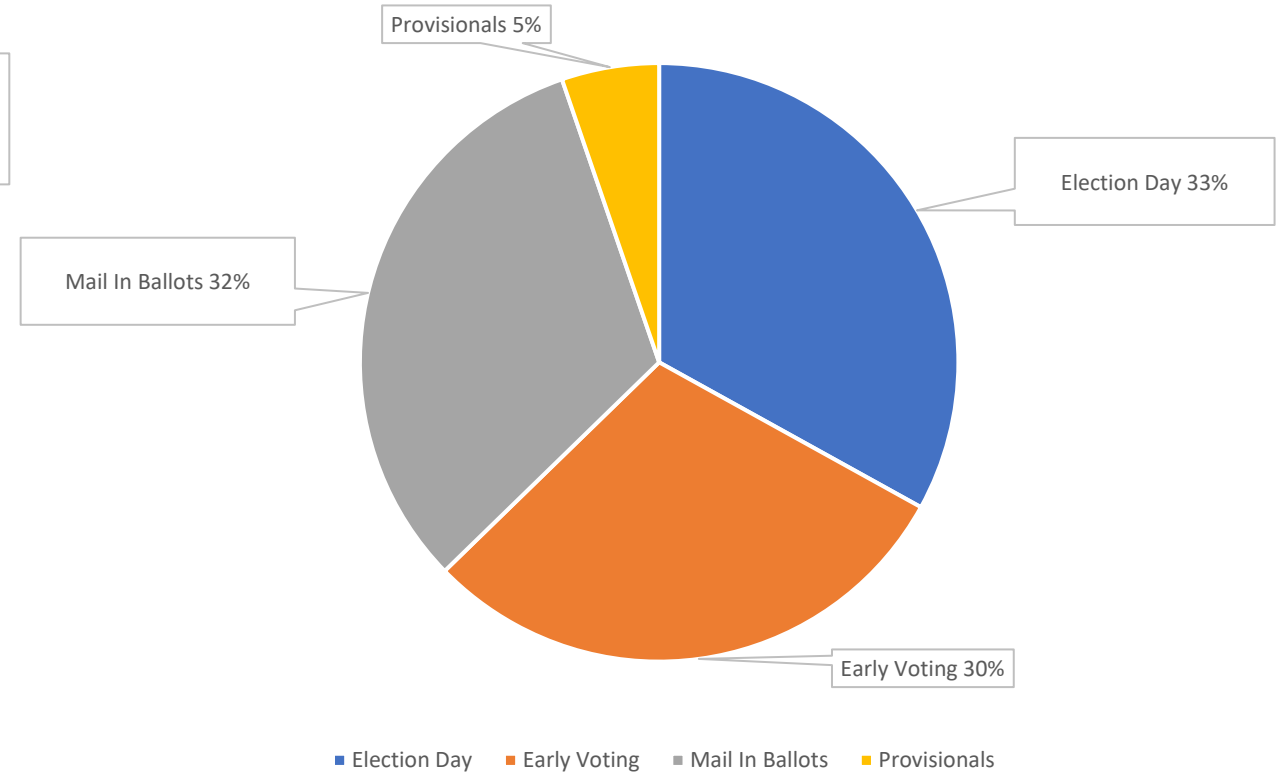


2024 Cycle Turnout – Method of Voting

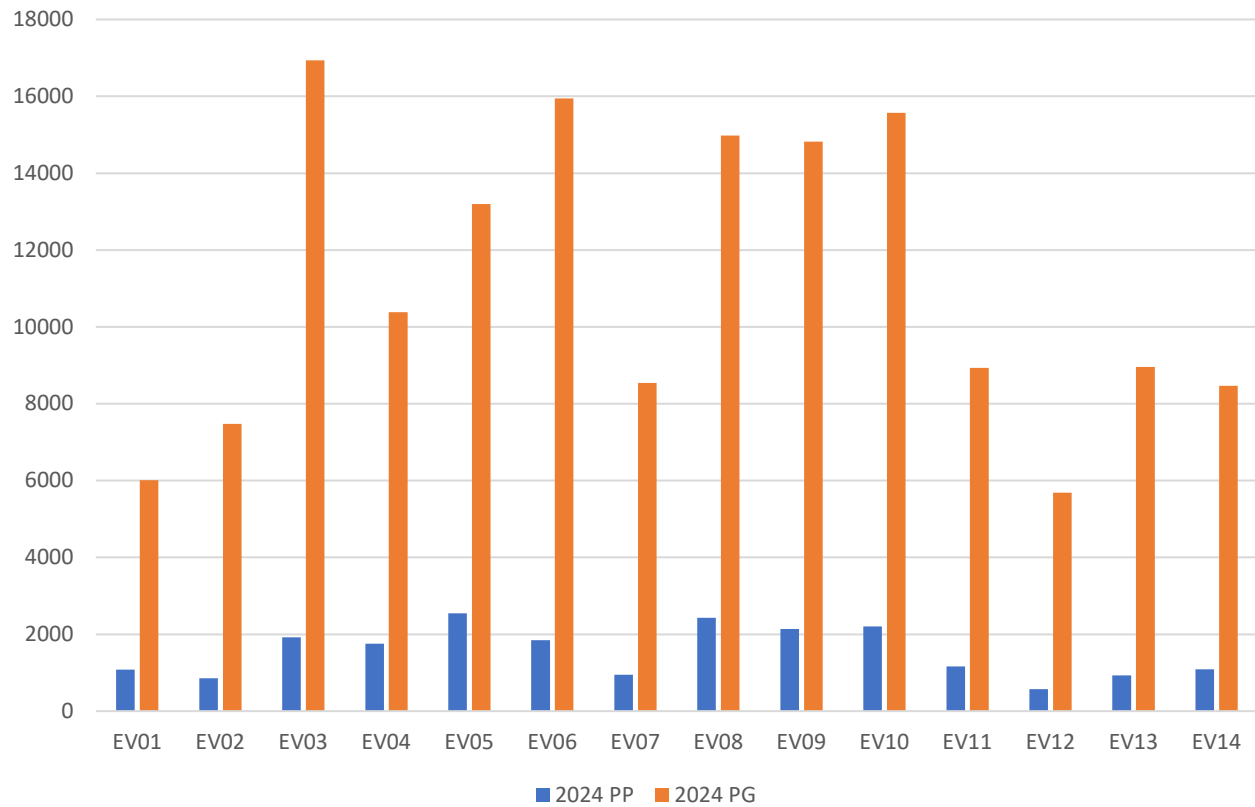

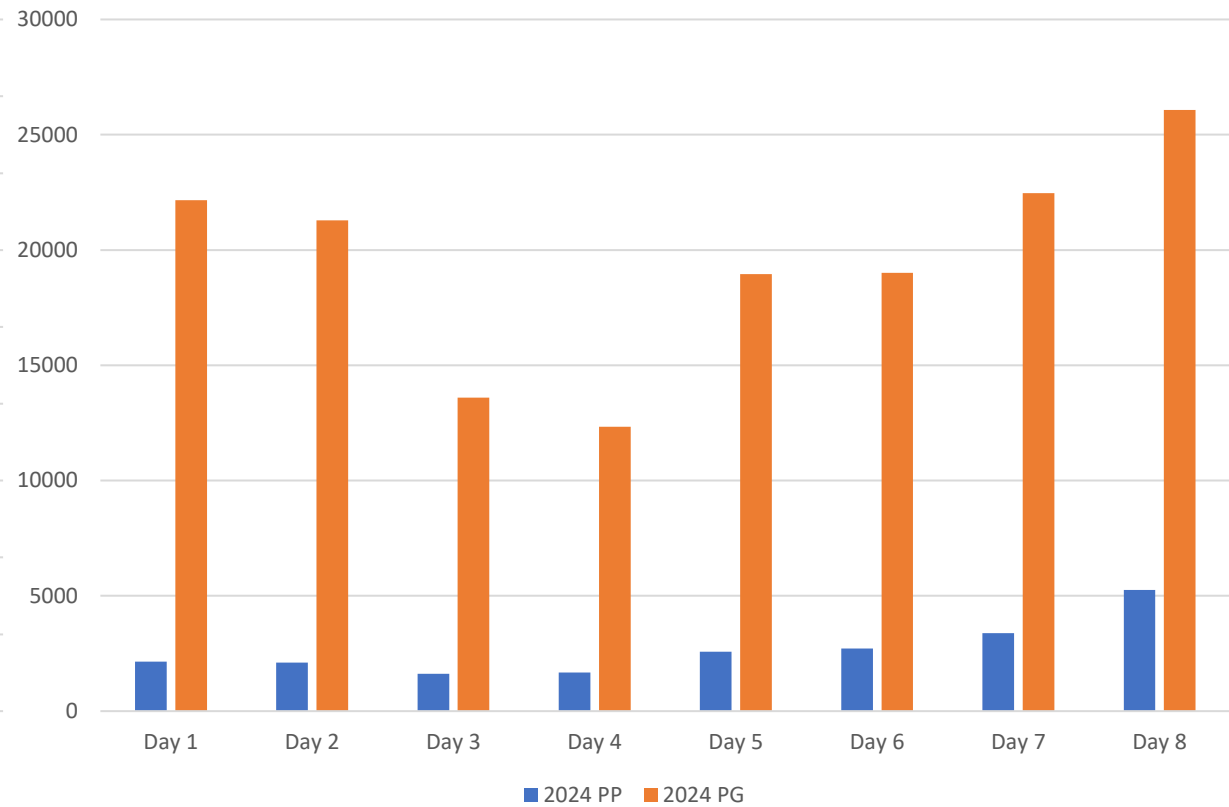

Total EV Turnout by Day - 2024 PP vs. PG

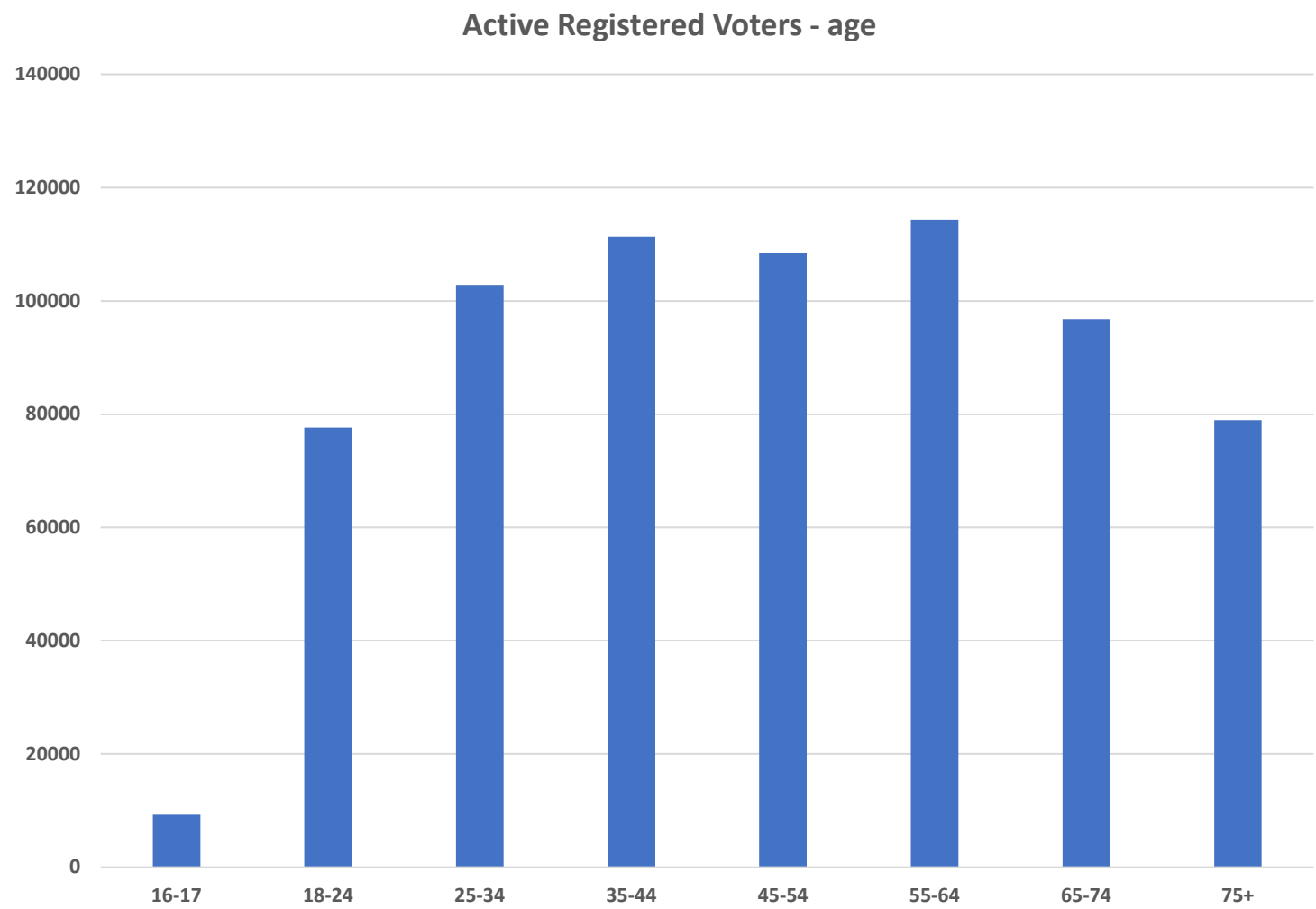

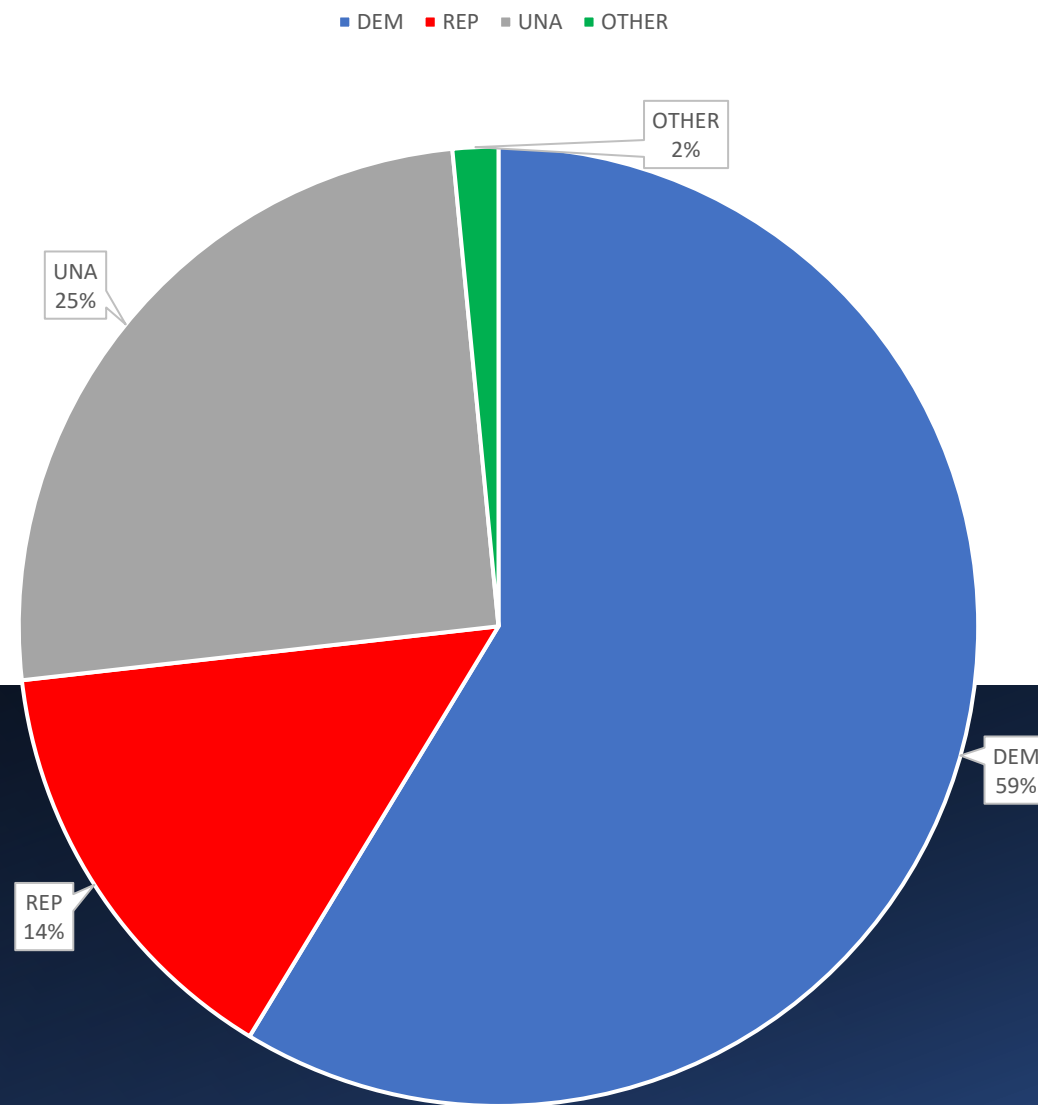

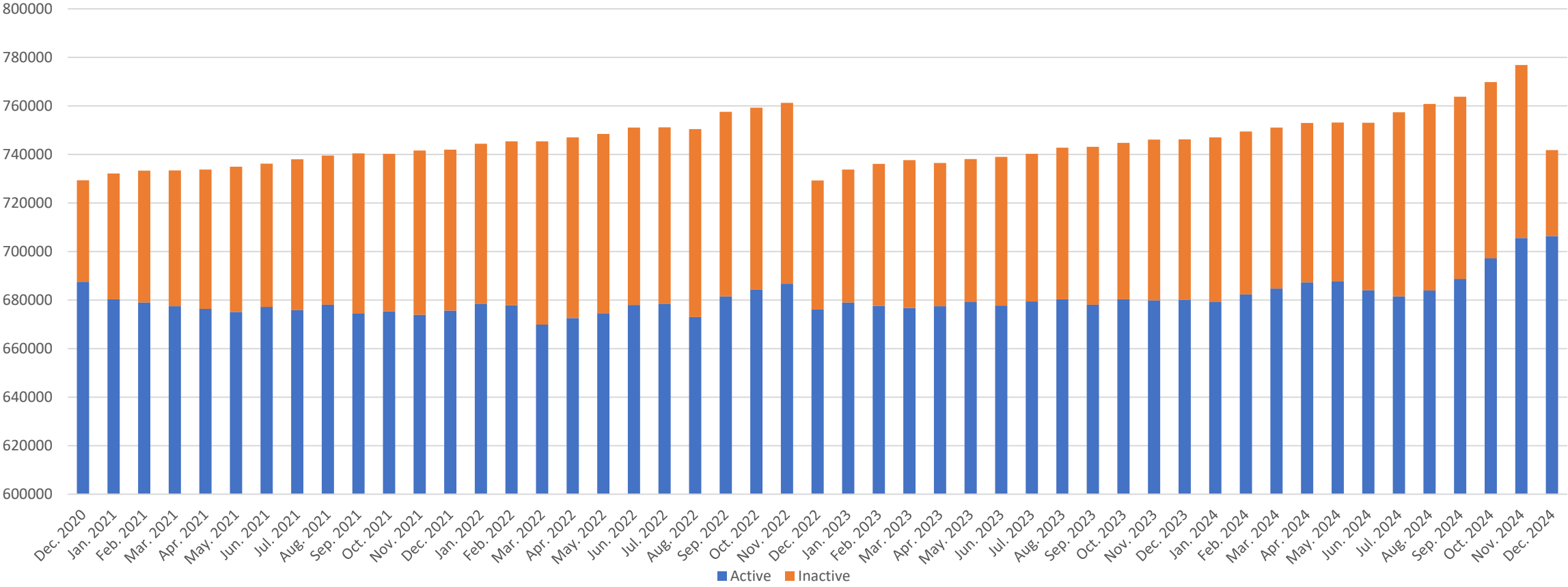


ACTIVE REGISTERED VOTERS – PARTY DISTRIBUTION

Party Affiliation Distribution - Active Registered Voters



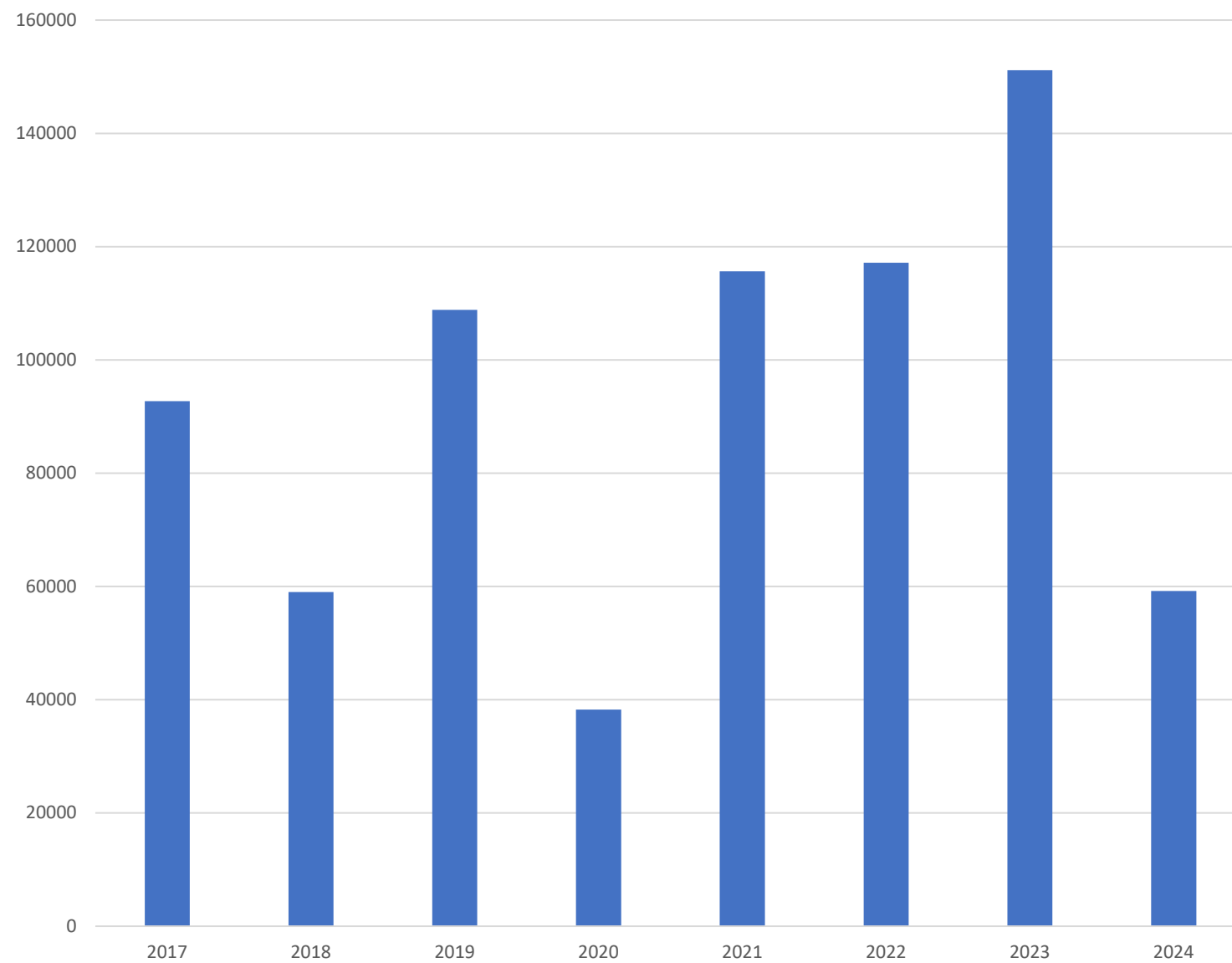

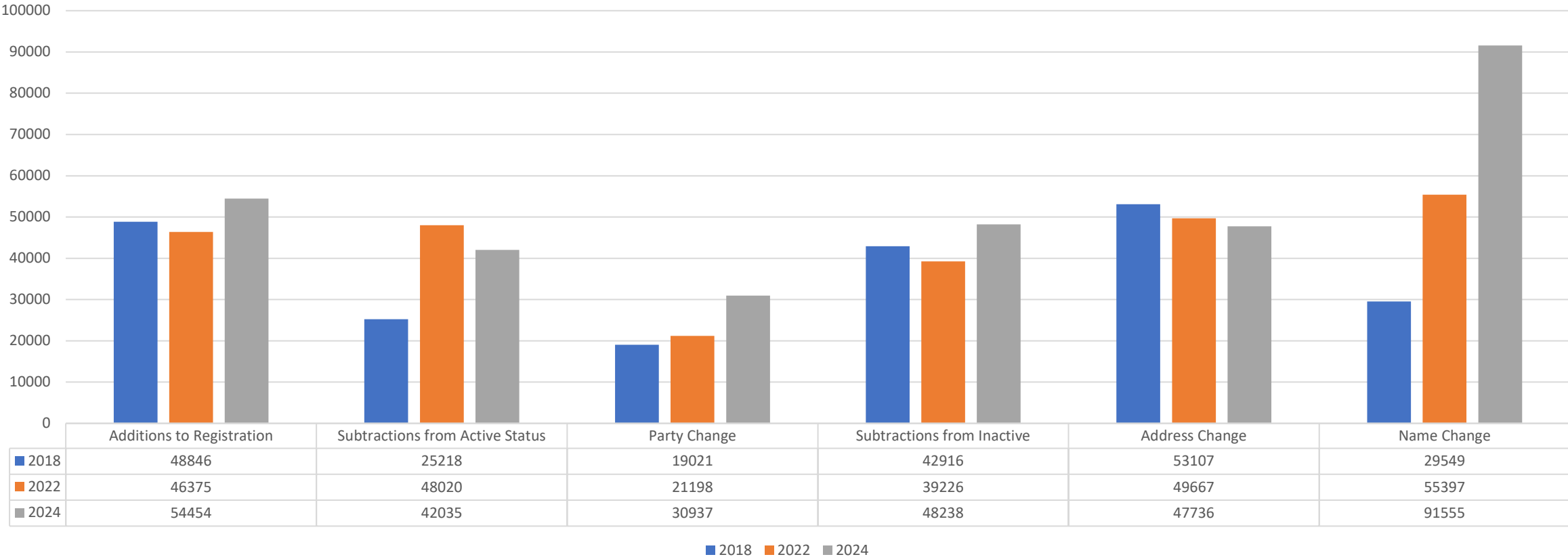

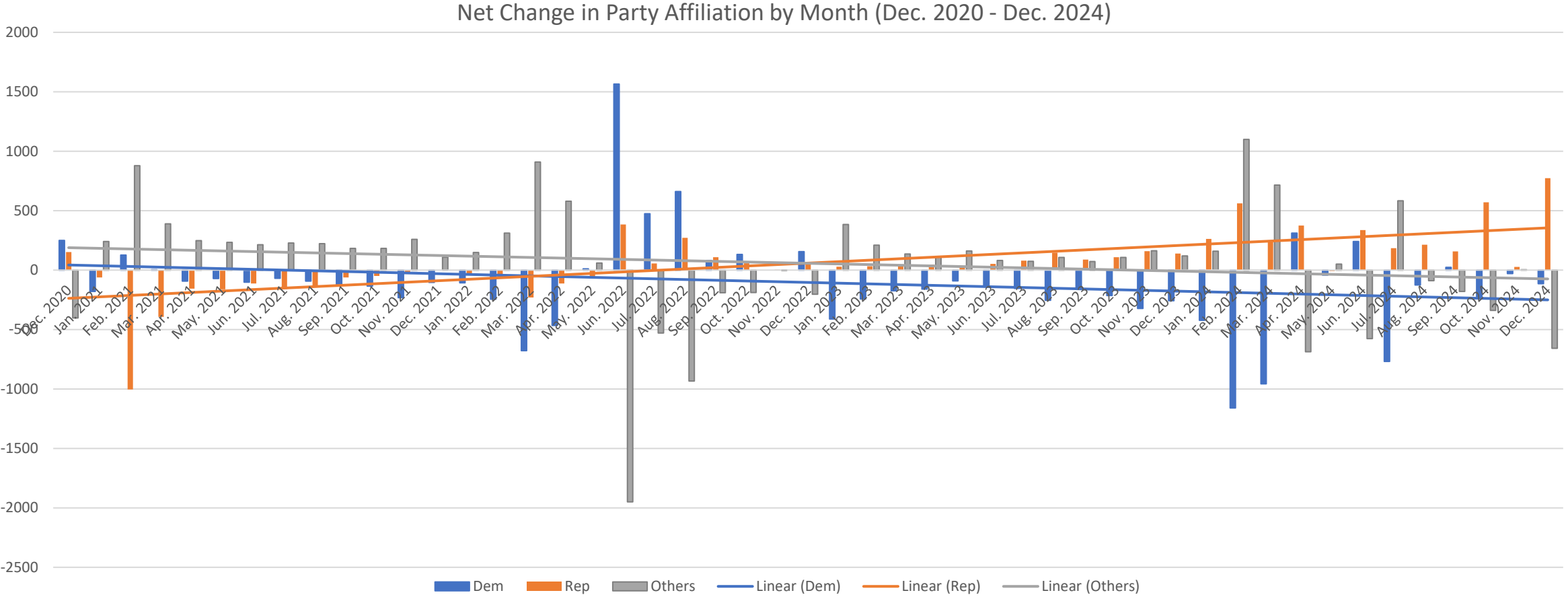


VOTER REGISTRATION PROCESSED RECORDS

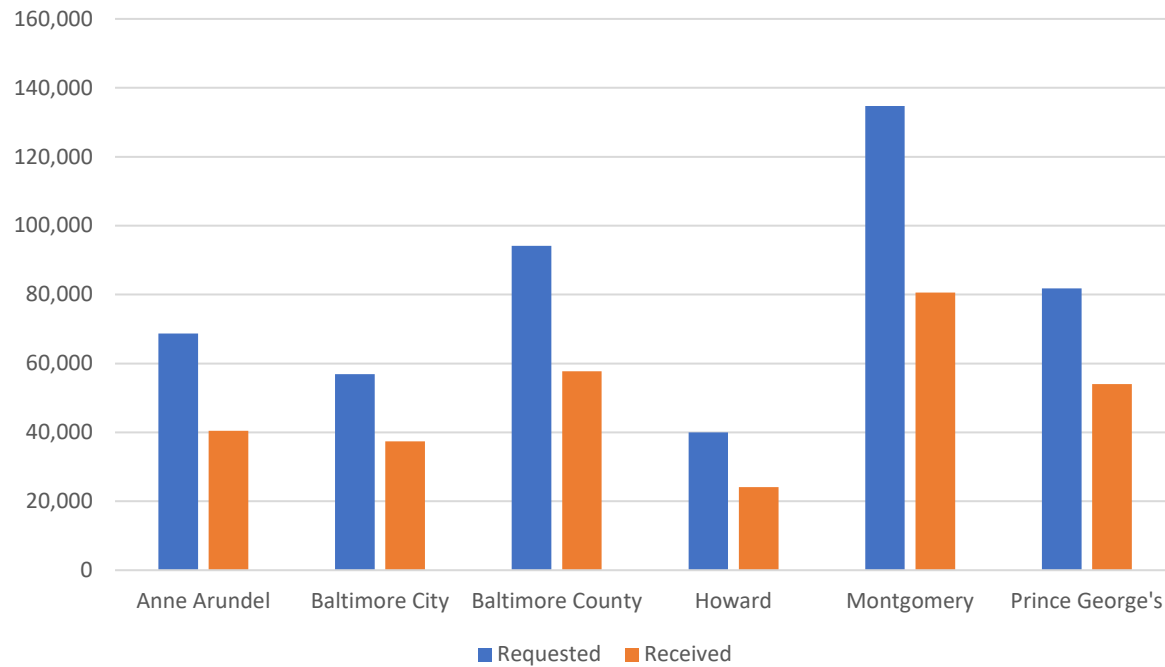

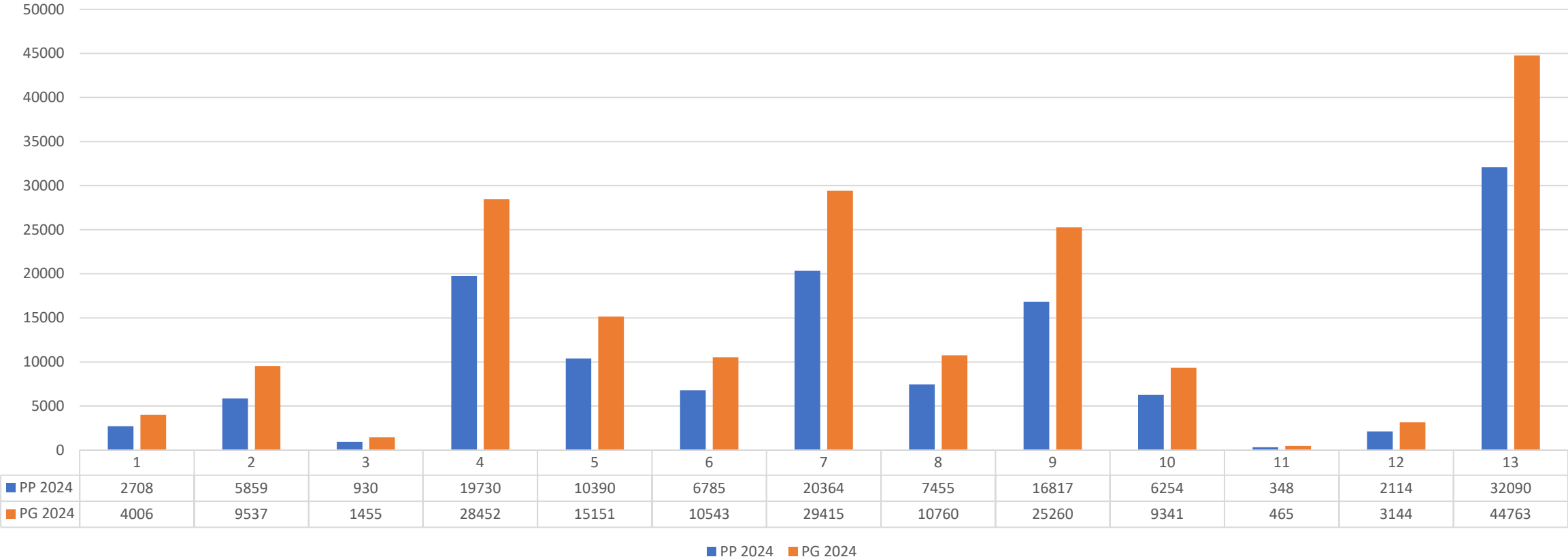

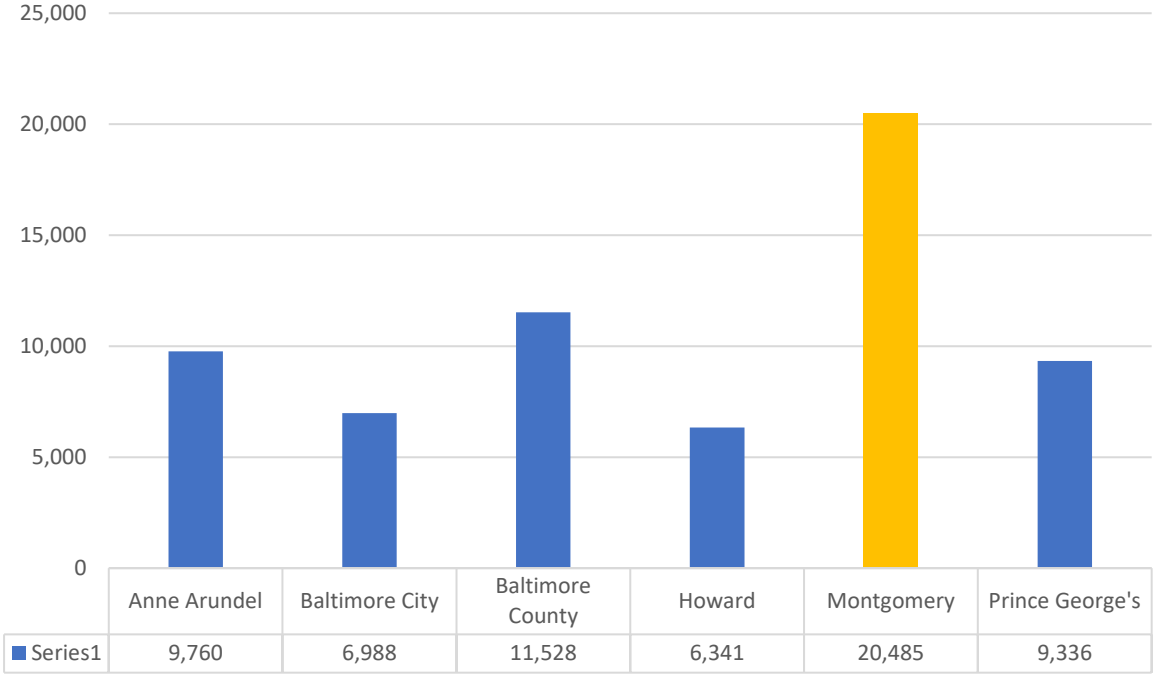


DISTRIBUTION OF MIB REQUESTS ACROSS ELECTION DISTRICTS – PP VS. PG

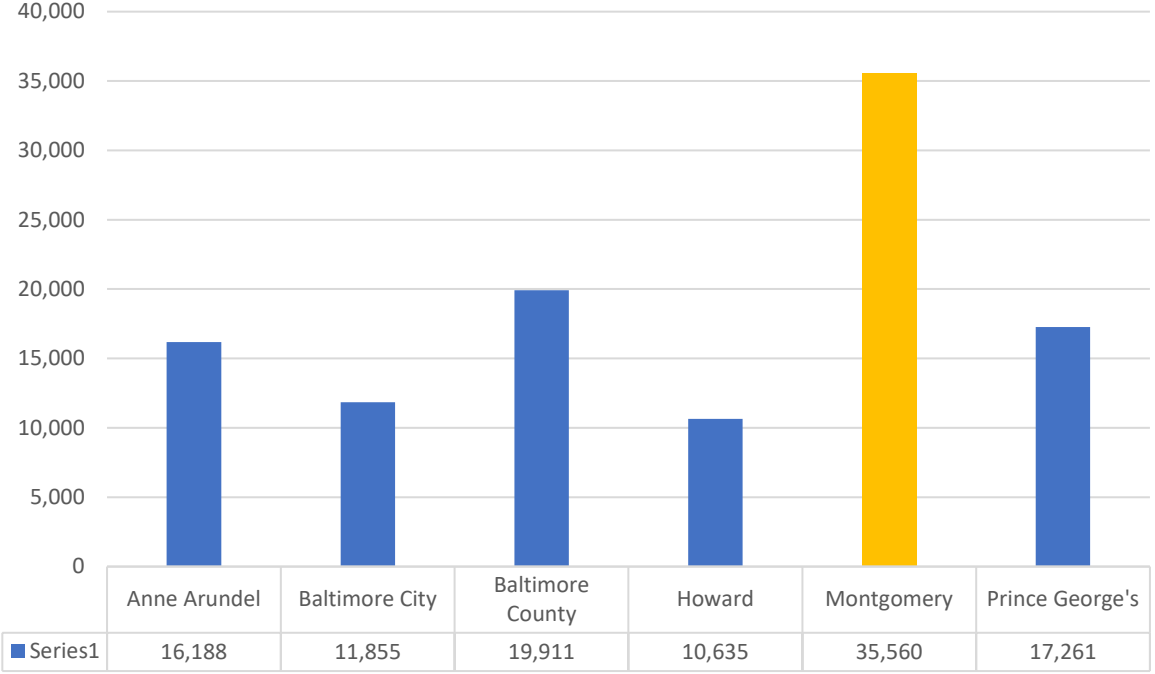
2024 PP vs. PG - Distribution of MIB Requests Across Election Districts

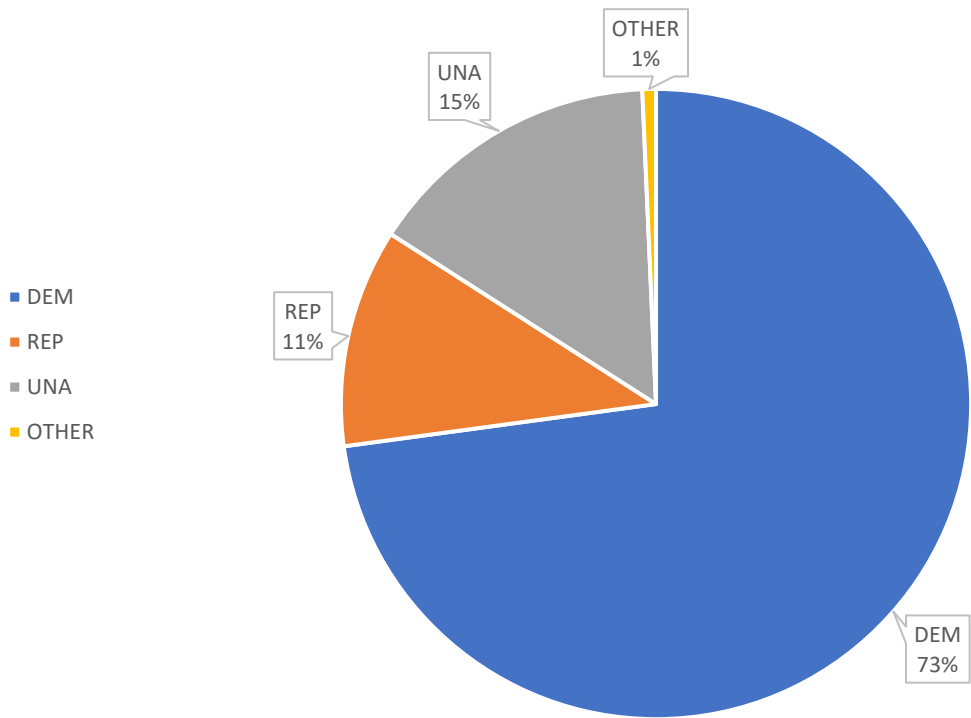

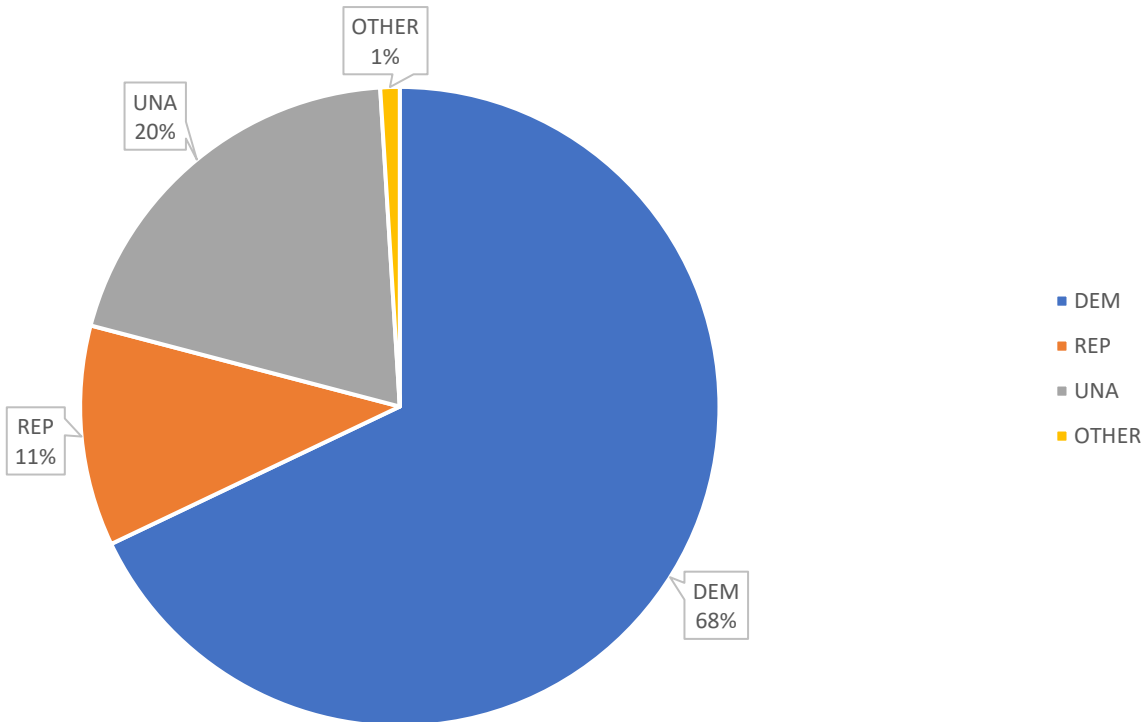

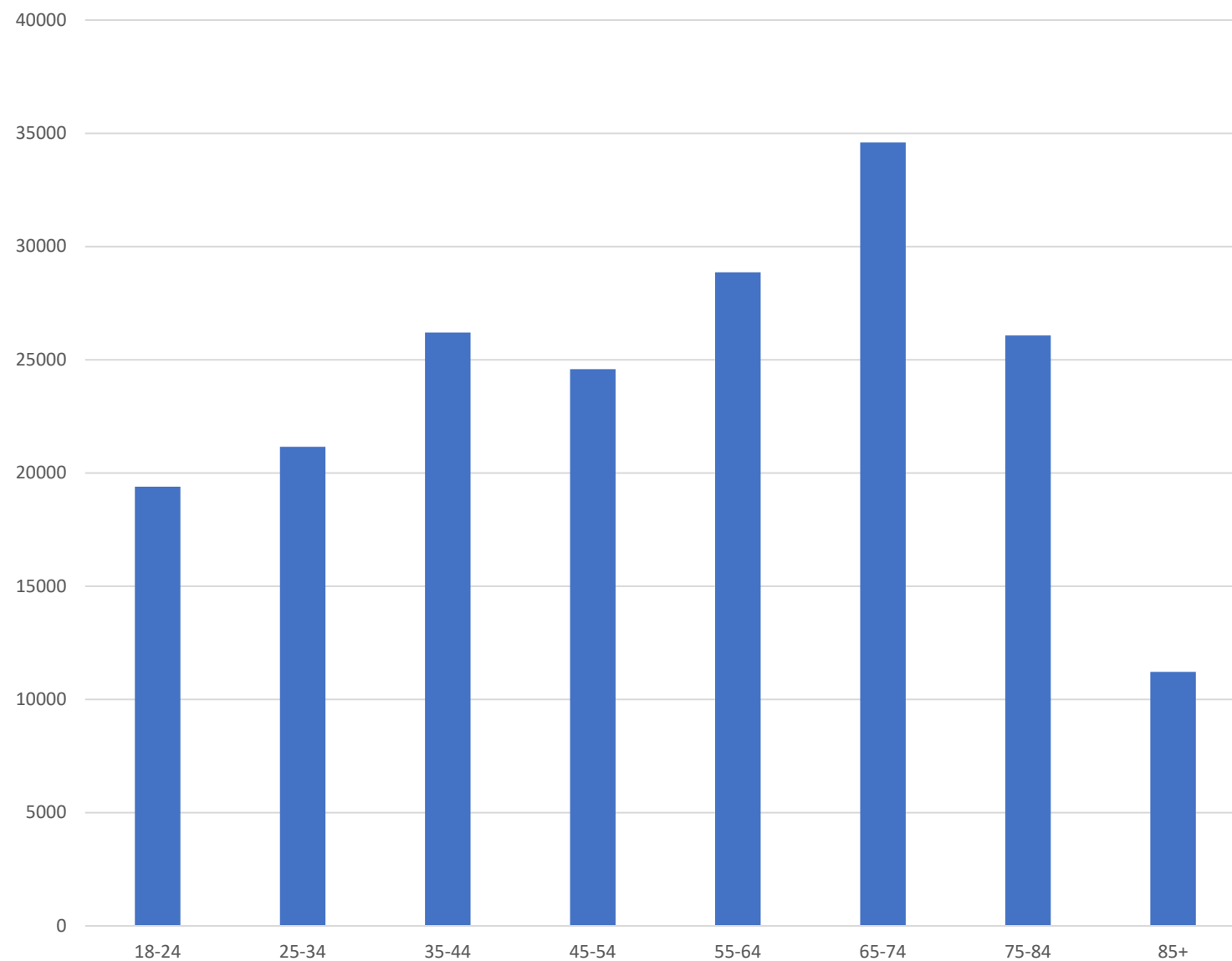

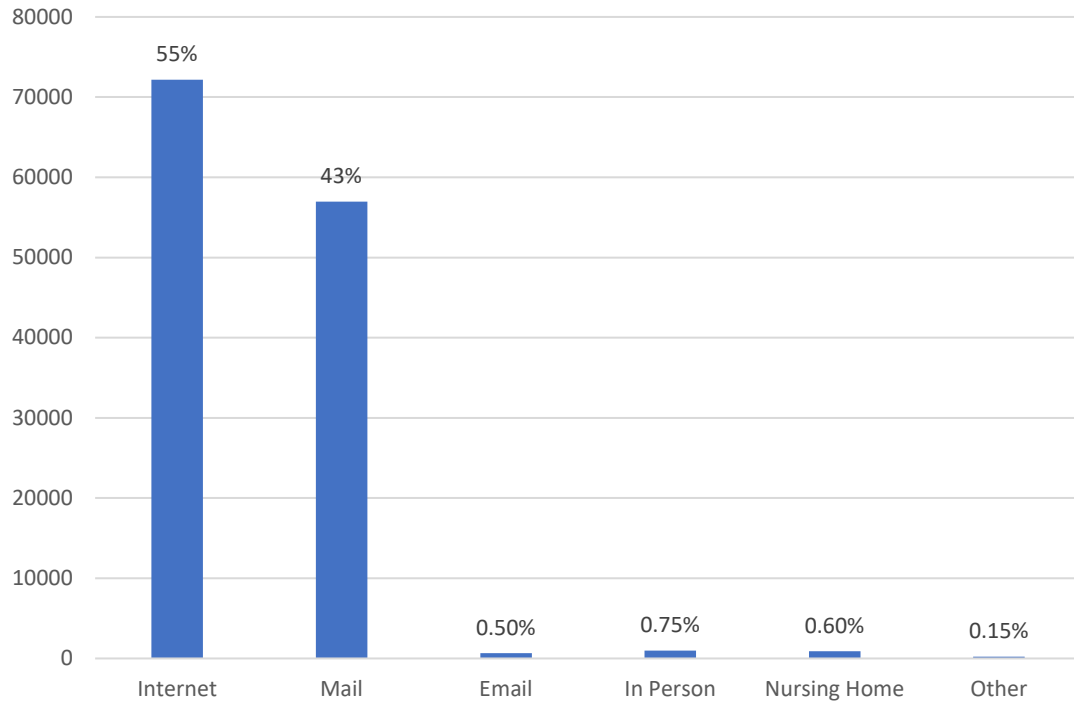

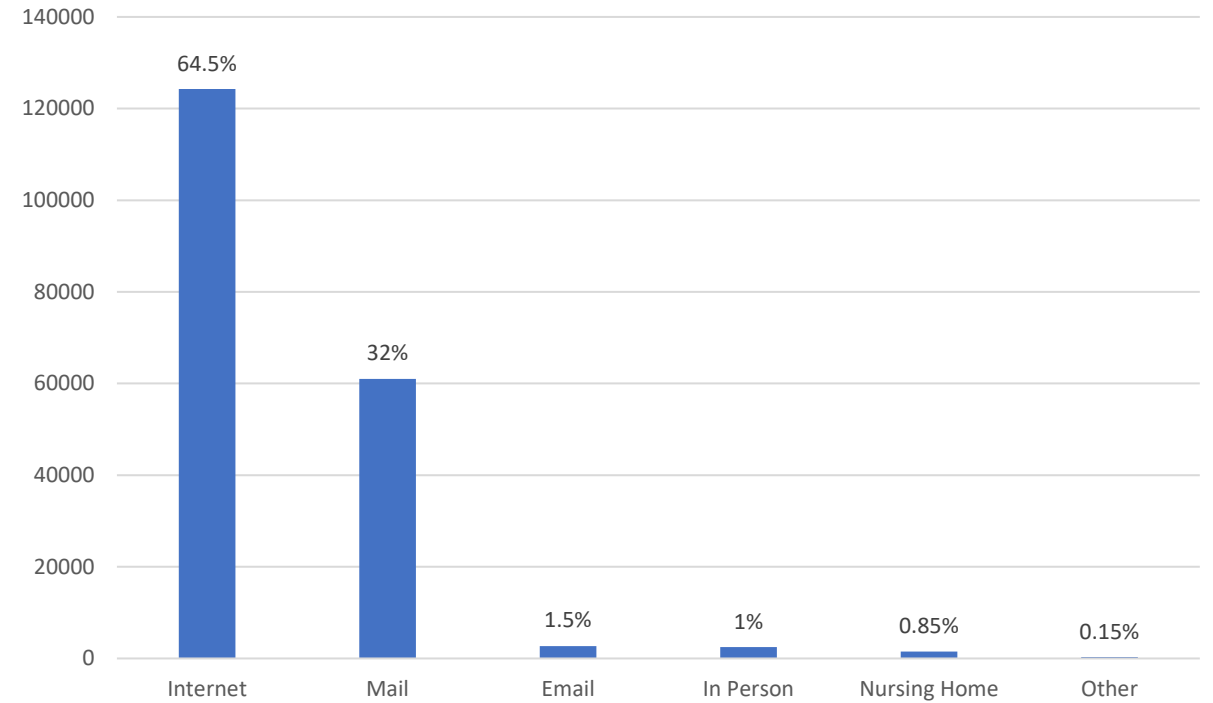
2024 PG - MIB Request Age Distribution

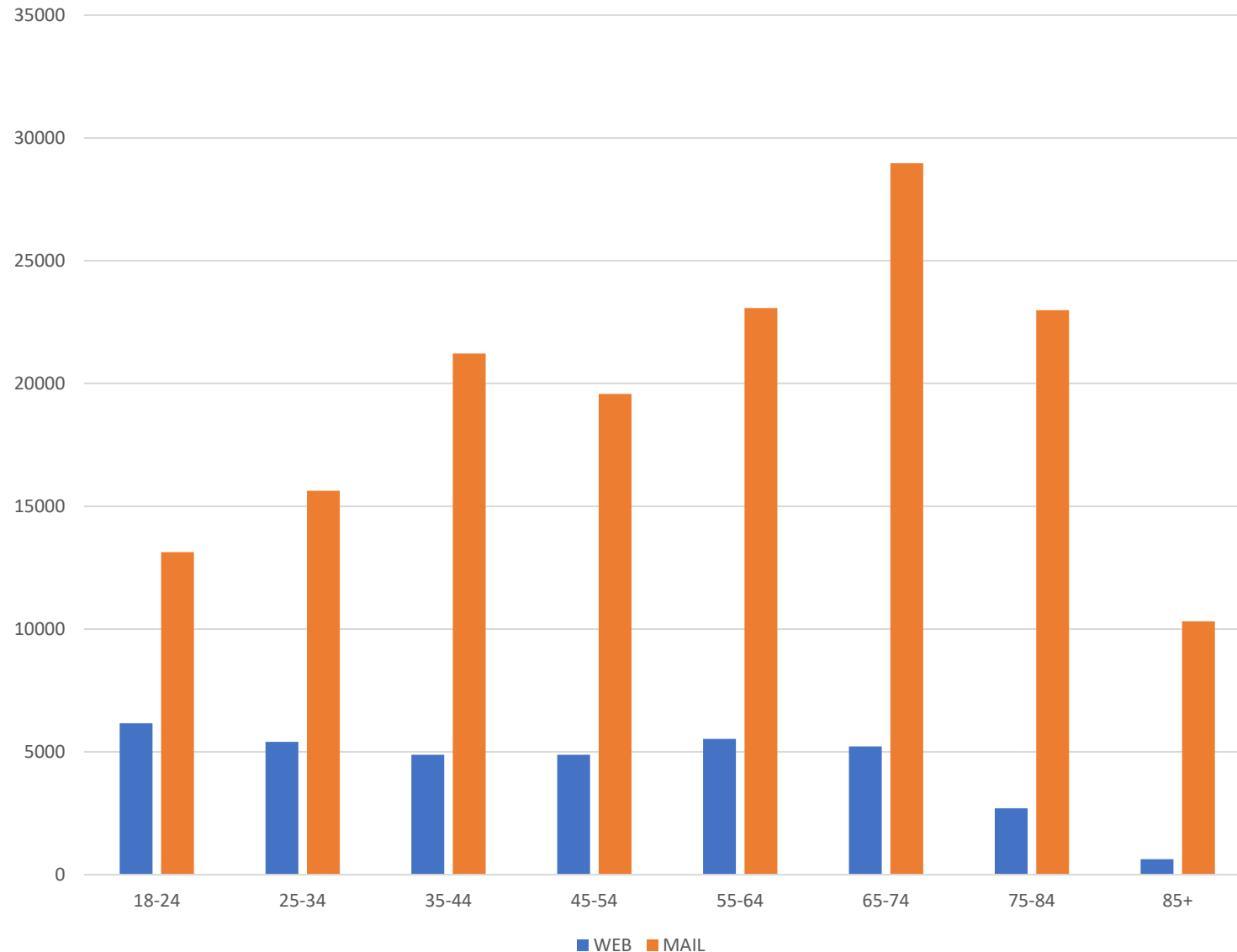

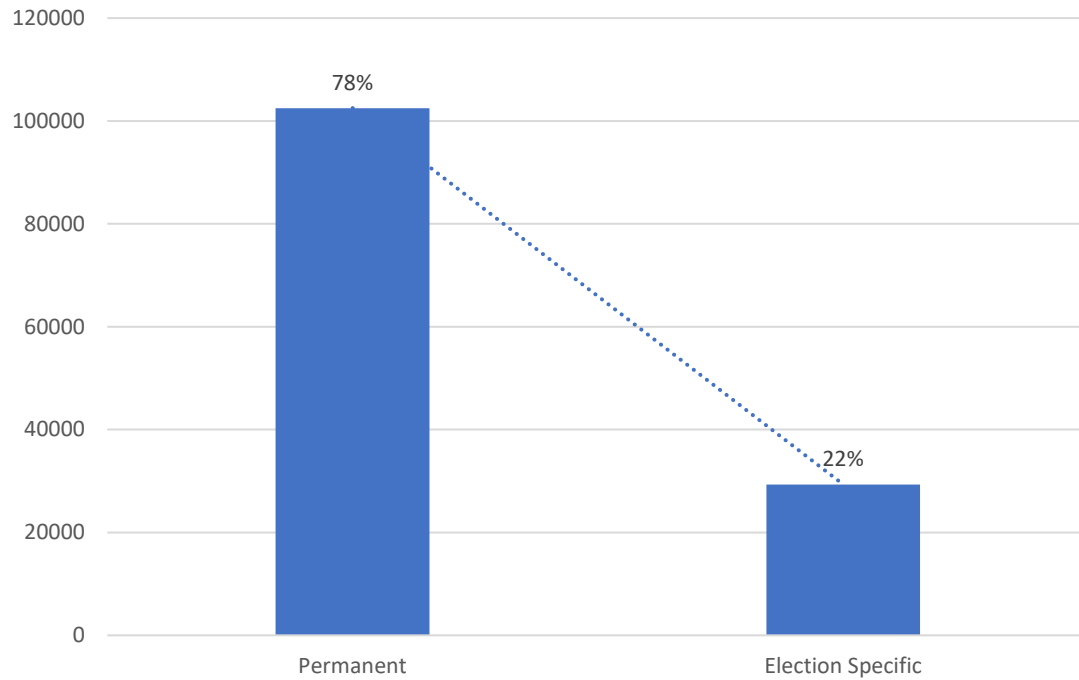

MAIL VS. WEB DELIVERY REQUESTS BY AGE

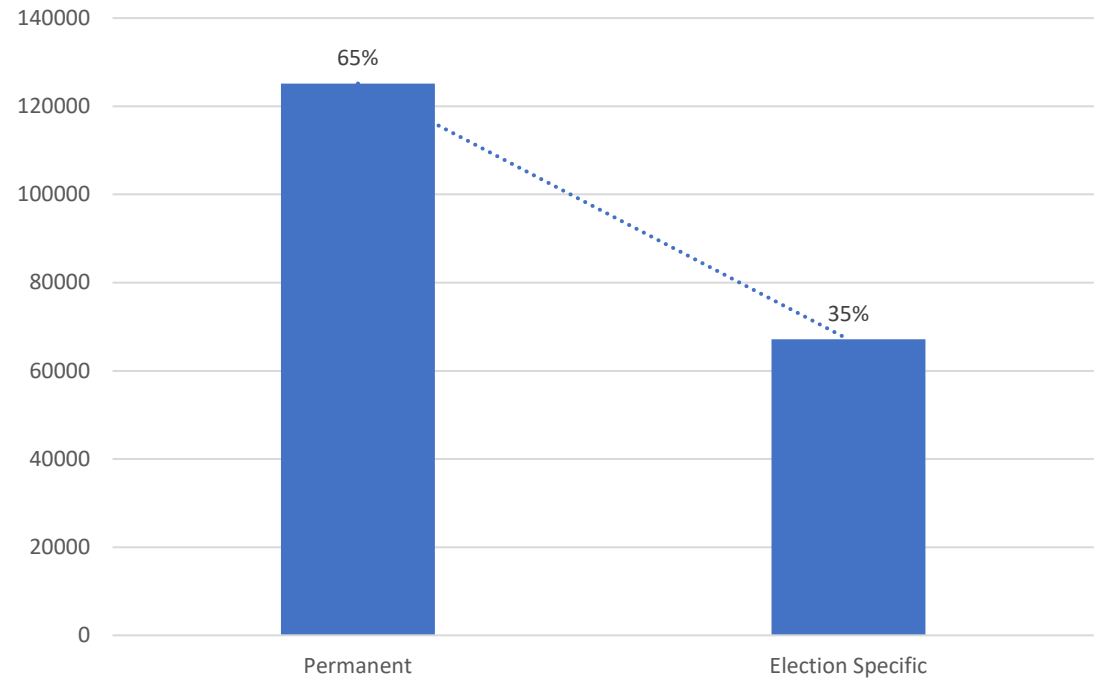
PG 2024 - MIB REQUEST AGE DISTRIBUTION

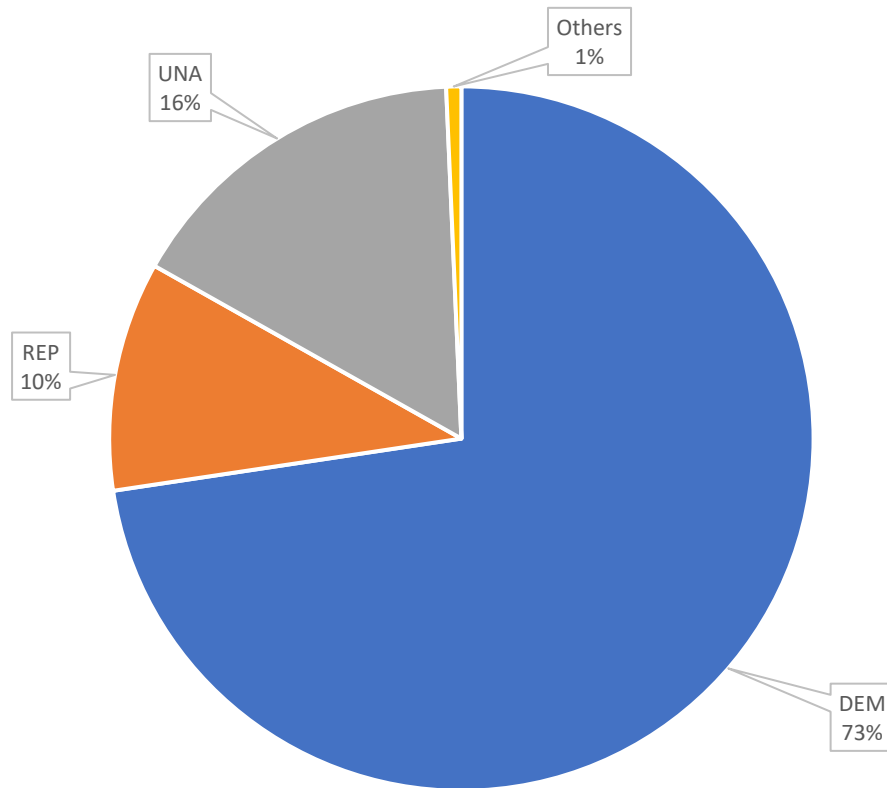

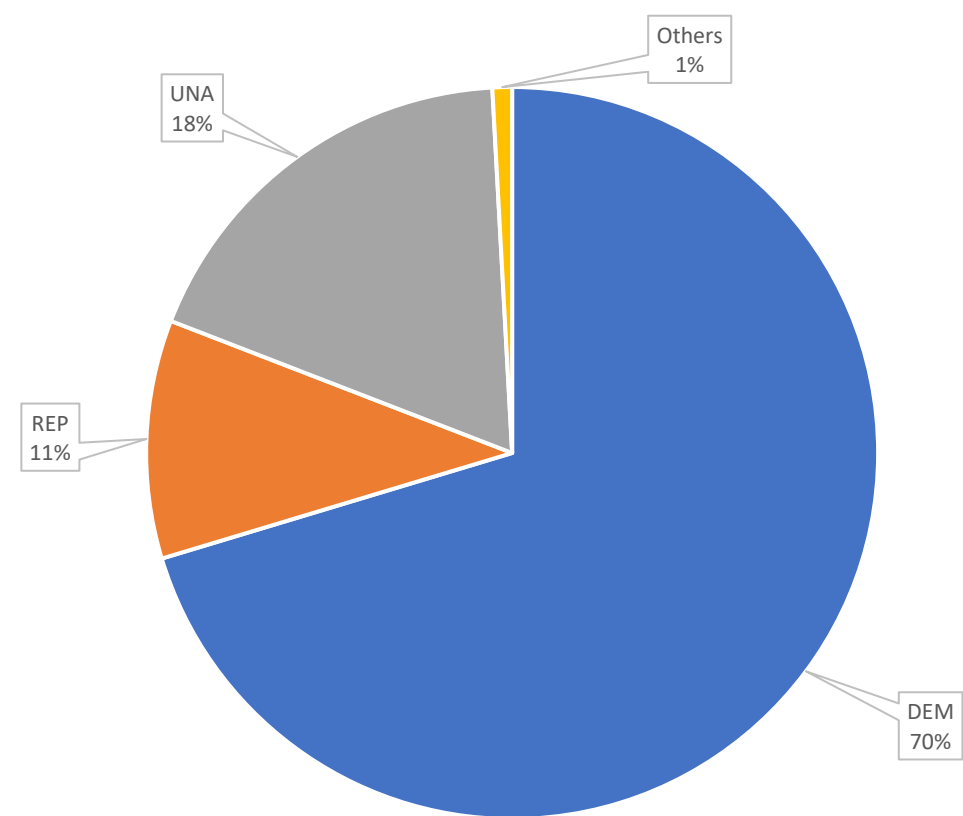
PERMANENT MAIL-IN BALLOT REQUESTS BY PARTY

2024 PP - Permanent Absentee Requests by Party



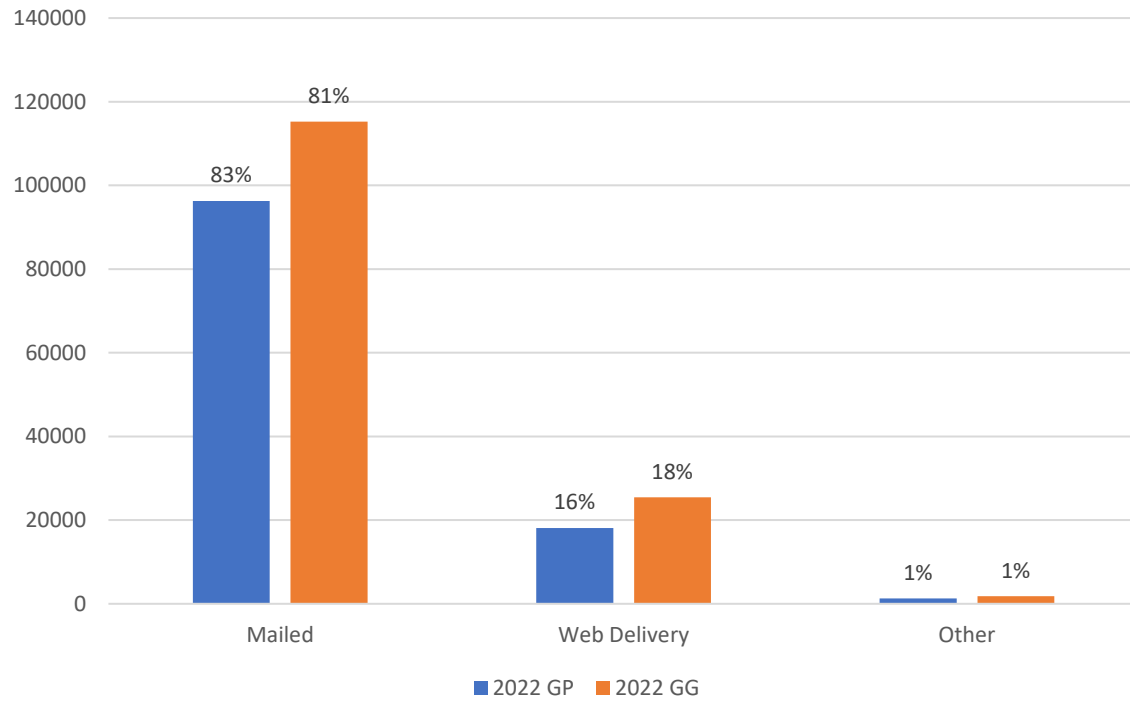

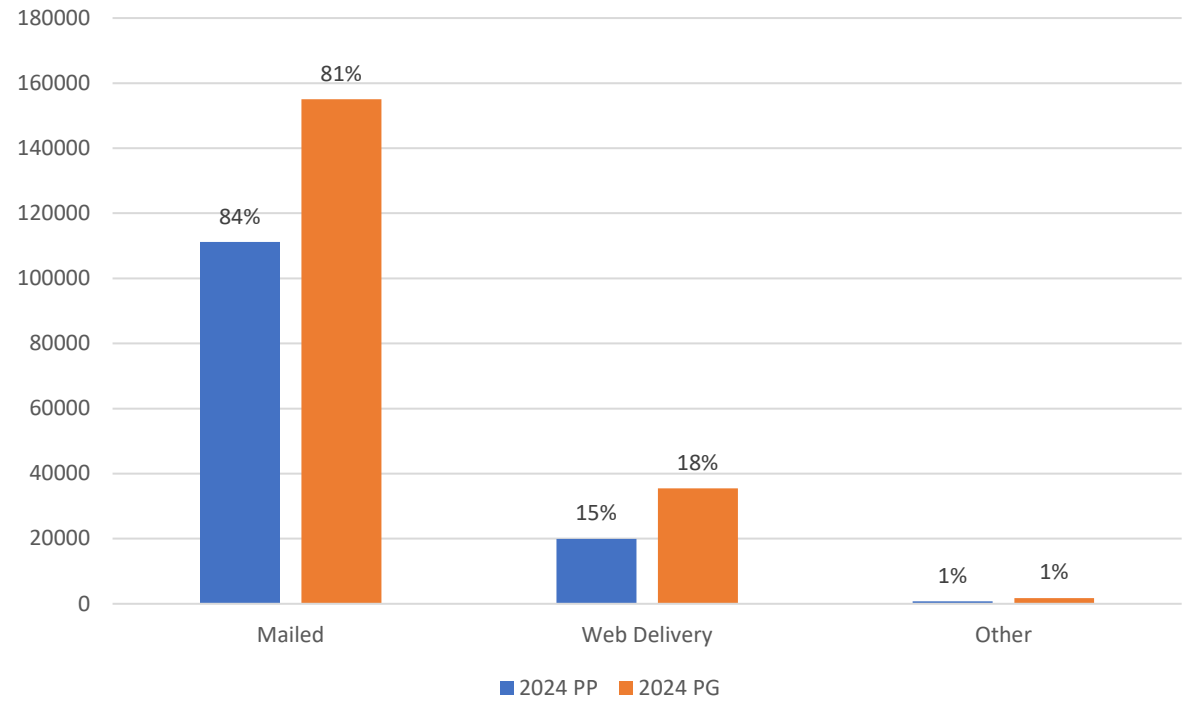

2022 GP vs. GG - Ballot Issue Method



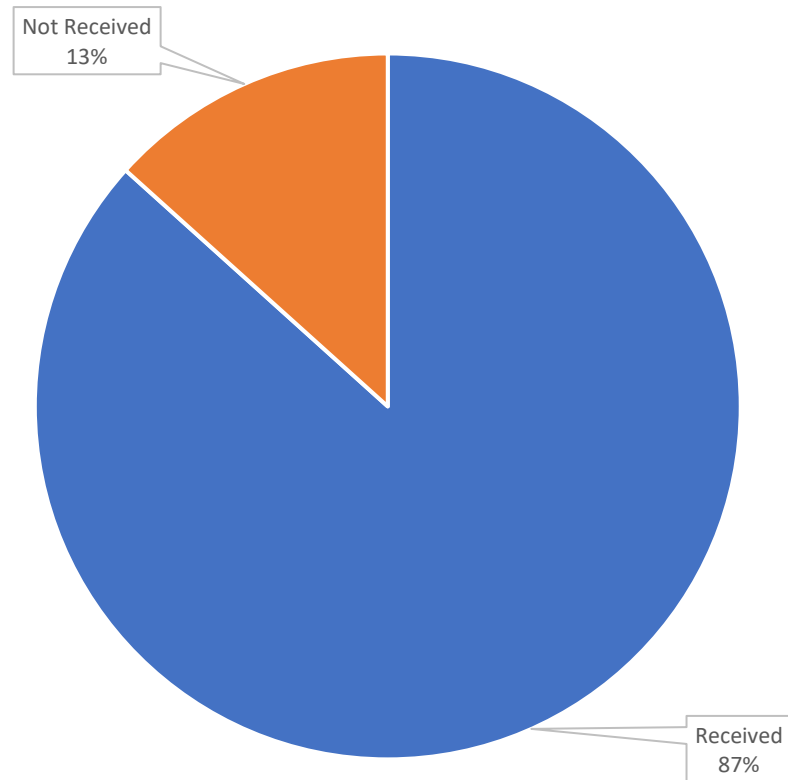

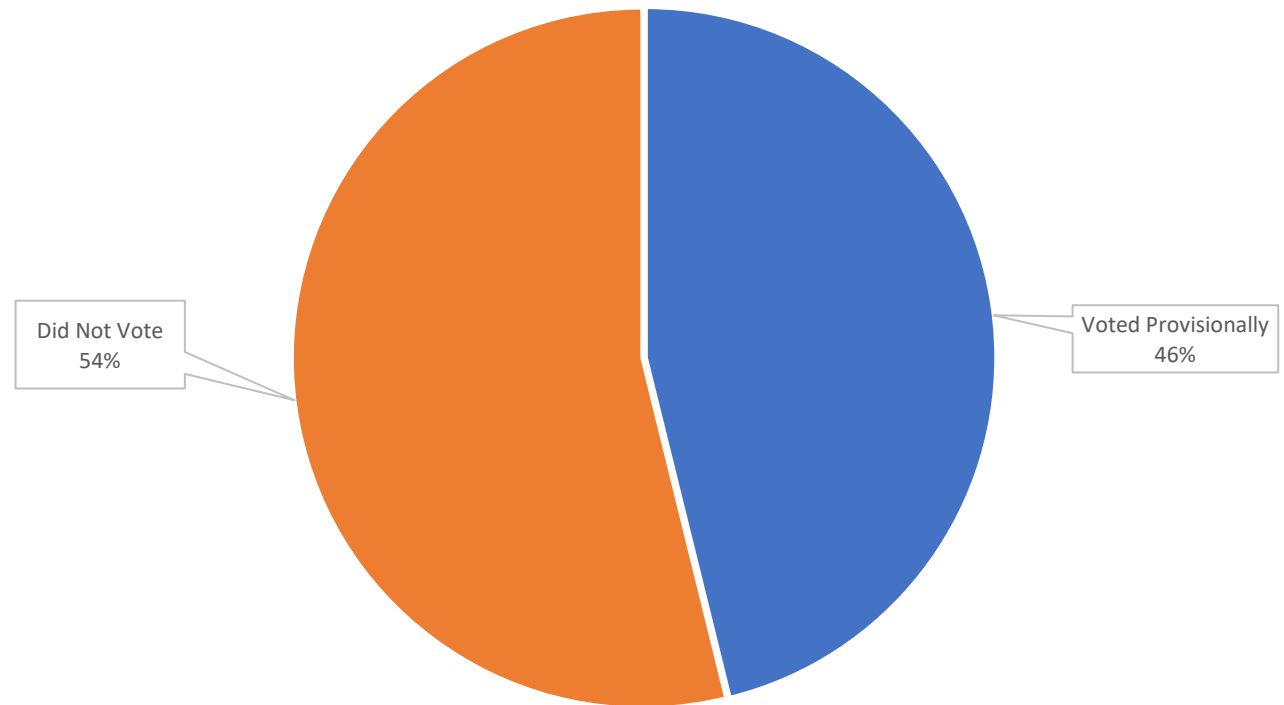

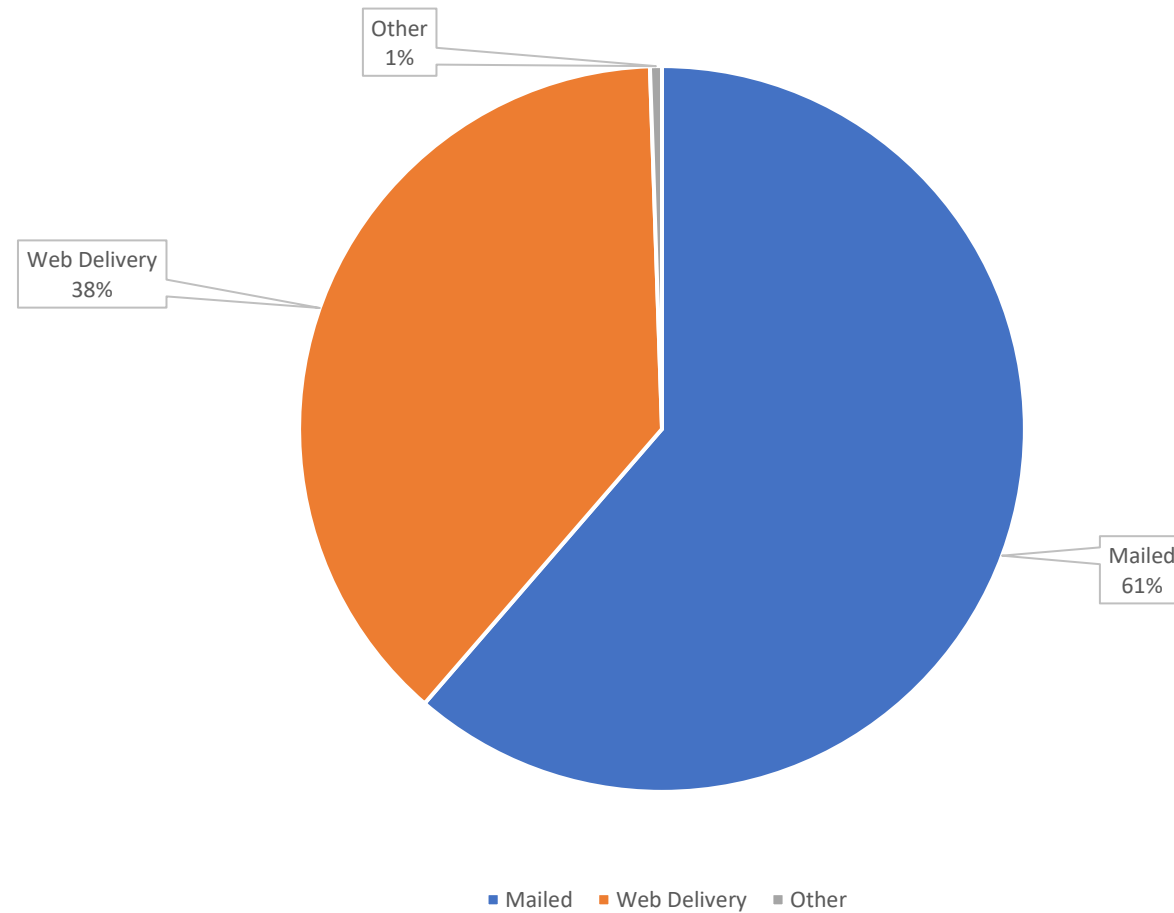
2024 PG - Received vs. Not Returned MIB



2024 PG - Not Returned MIB – Voted Provisionally vs Other Reasoning

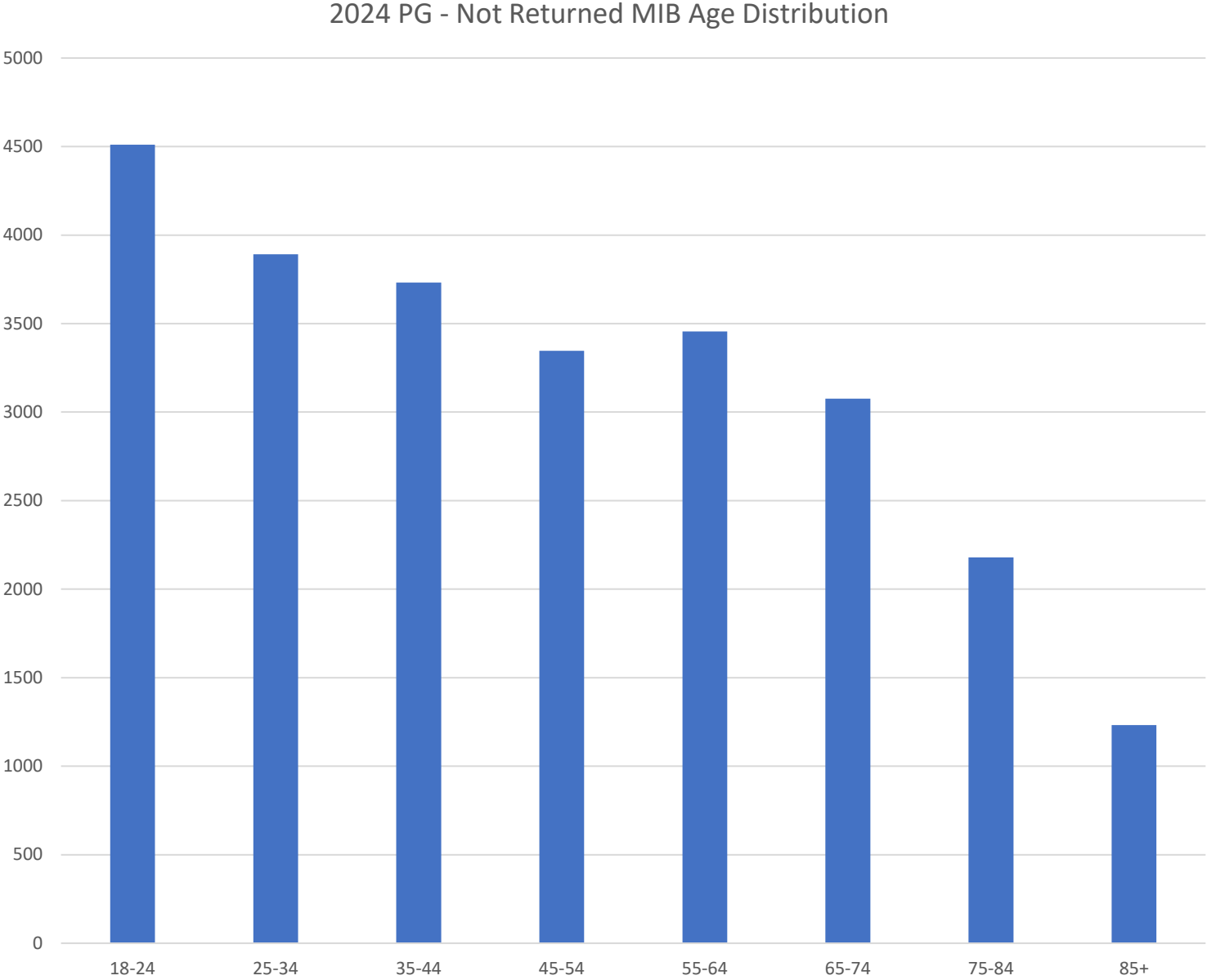


2024 PG - Not Returned Mail-In Ballots - Ballot Issue Method

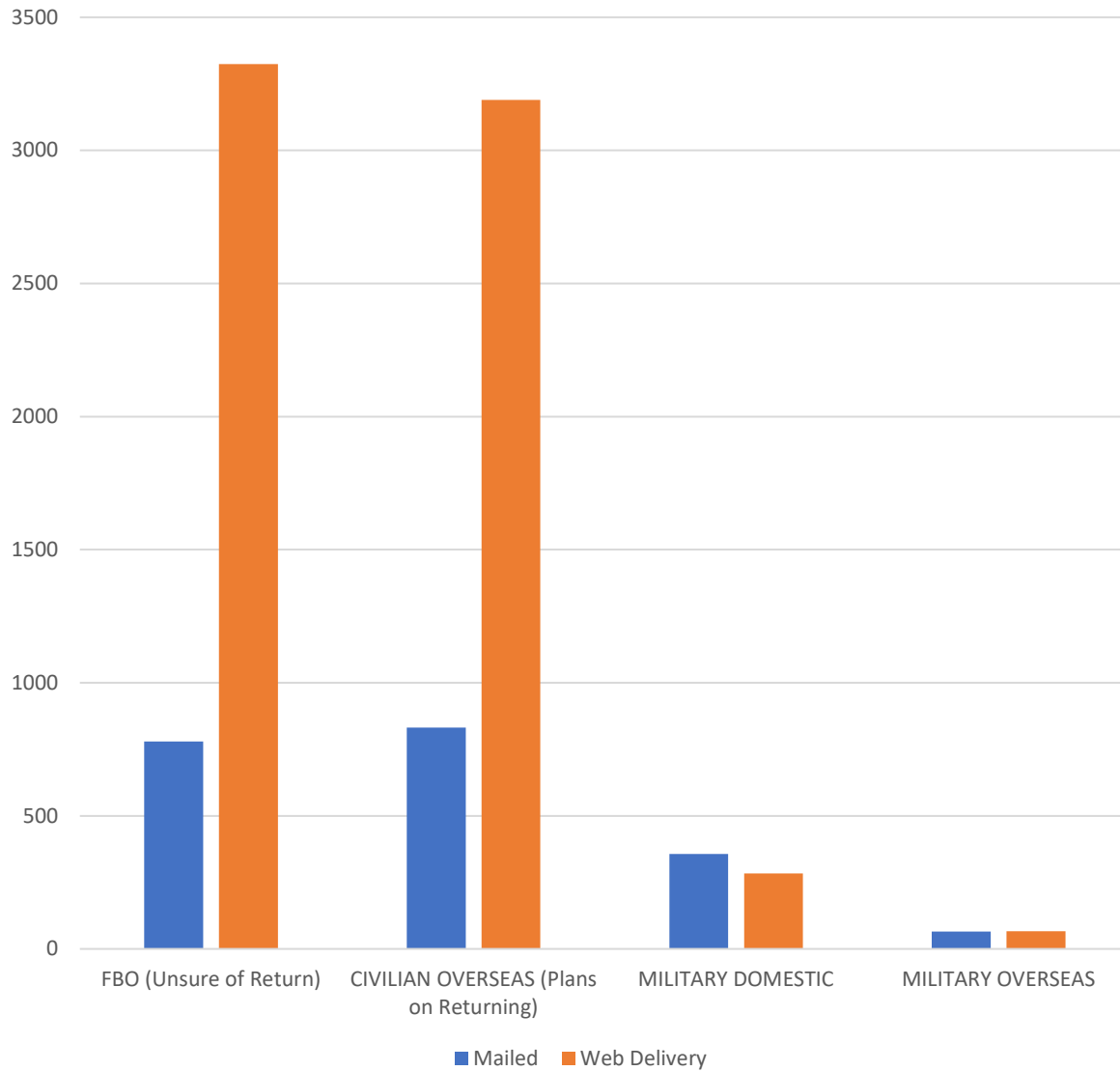

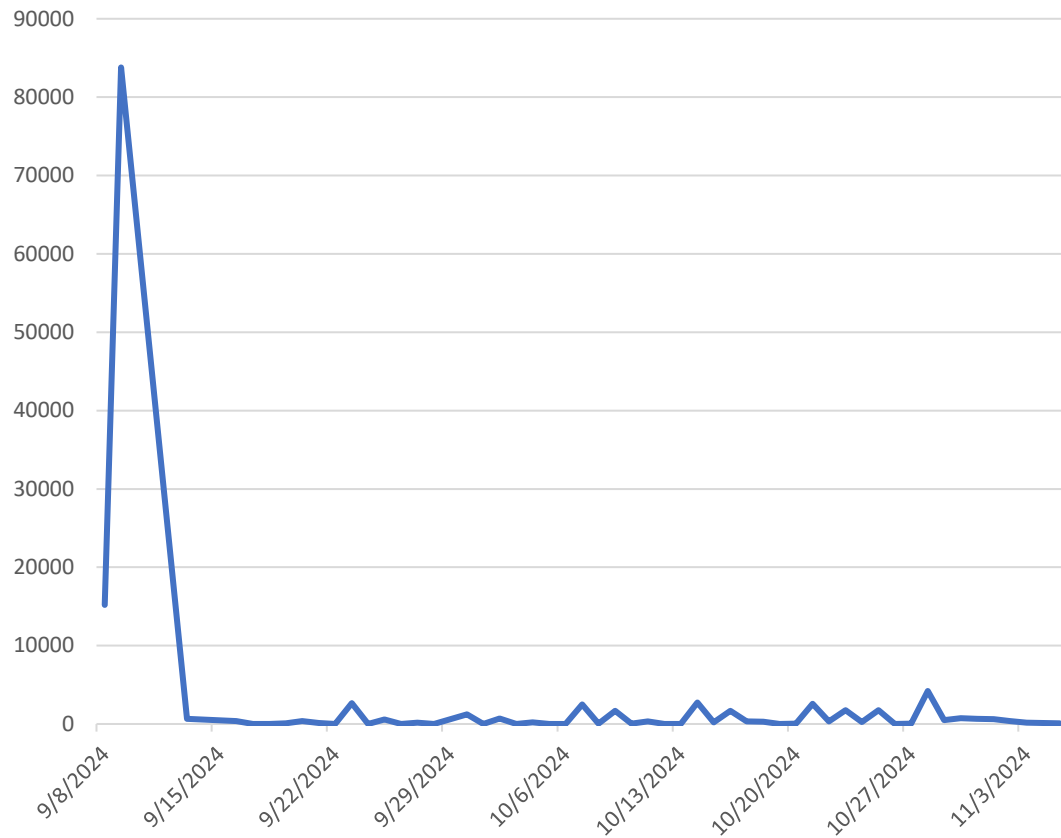

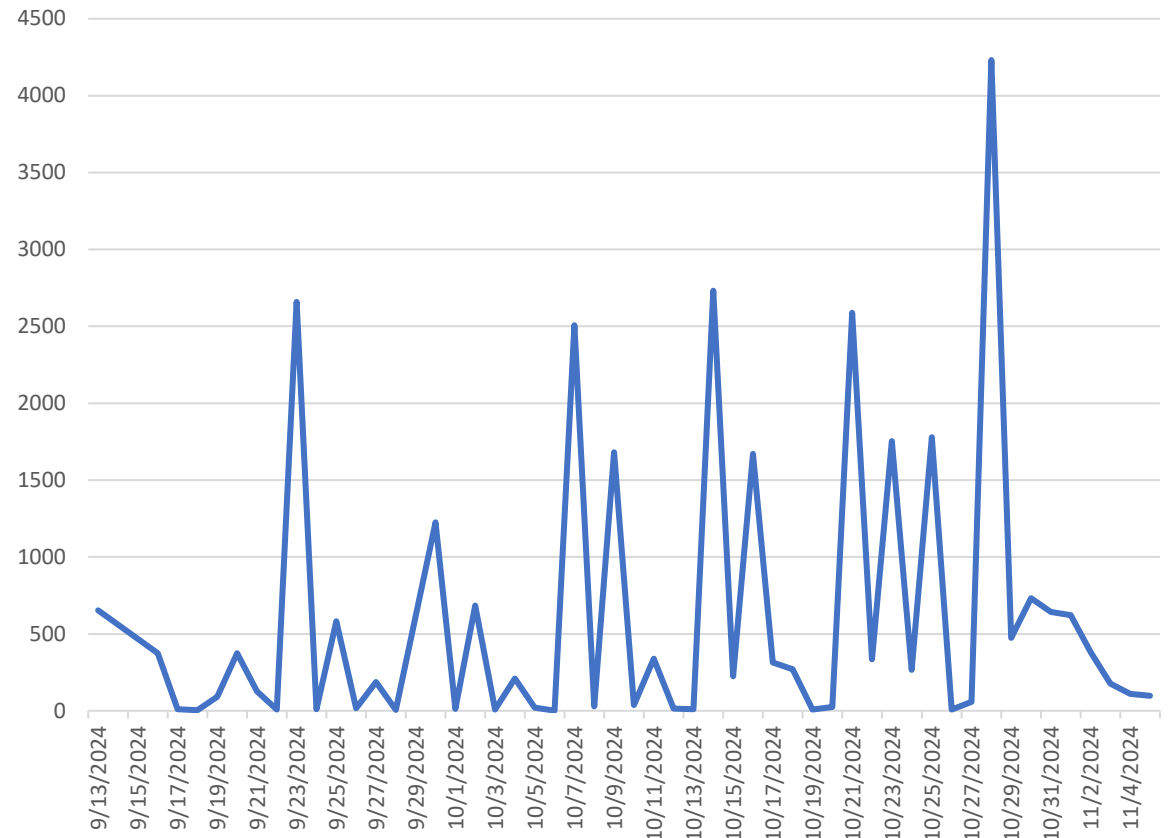

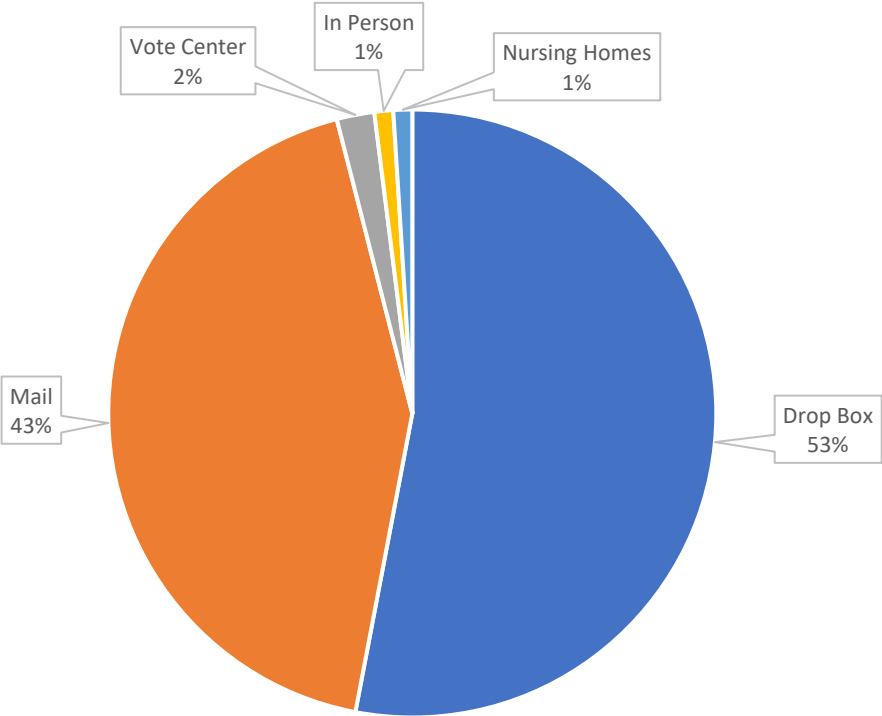

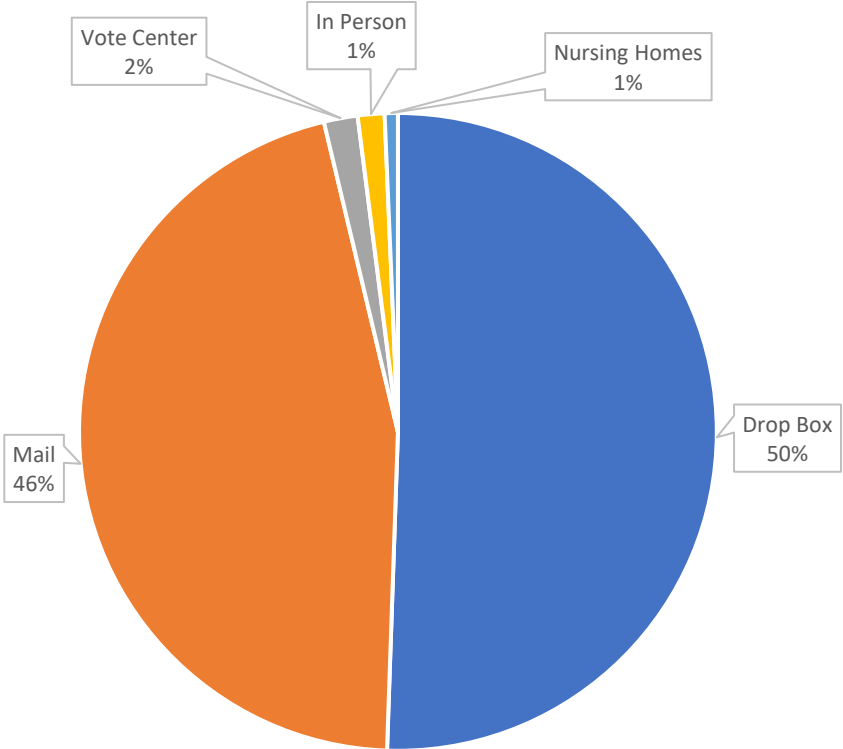


2022 GG - MIB Return Method

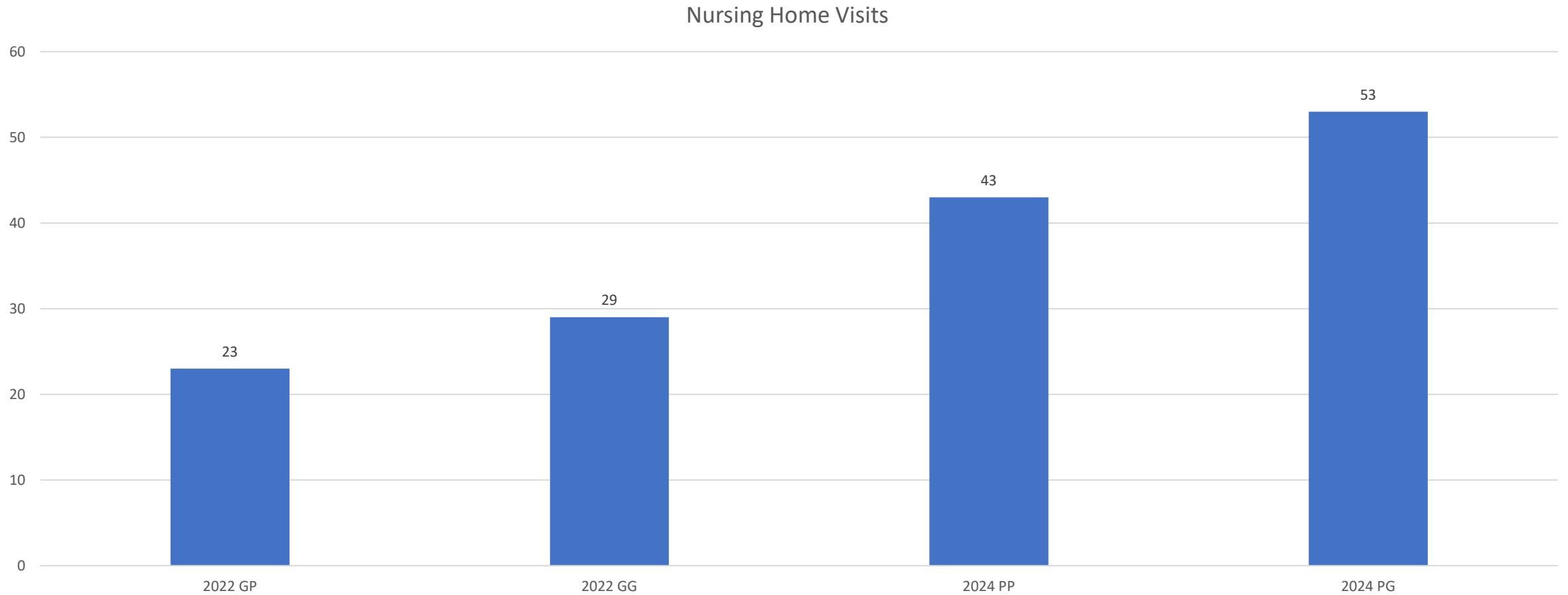

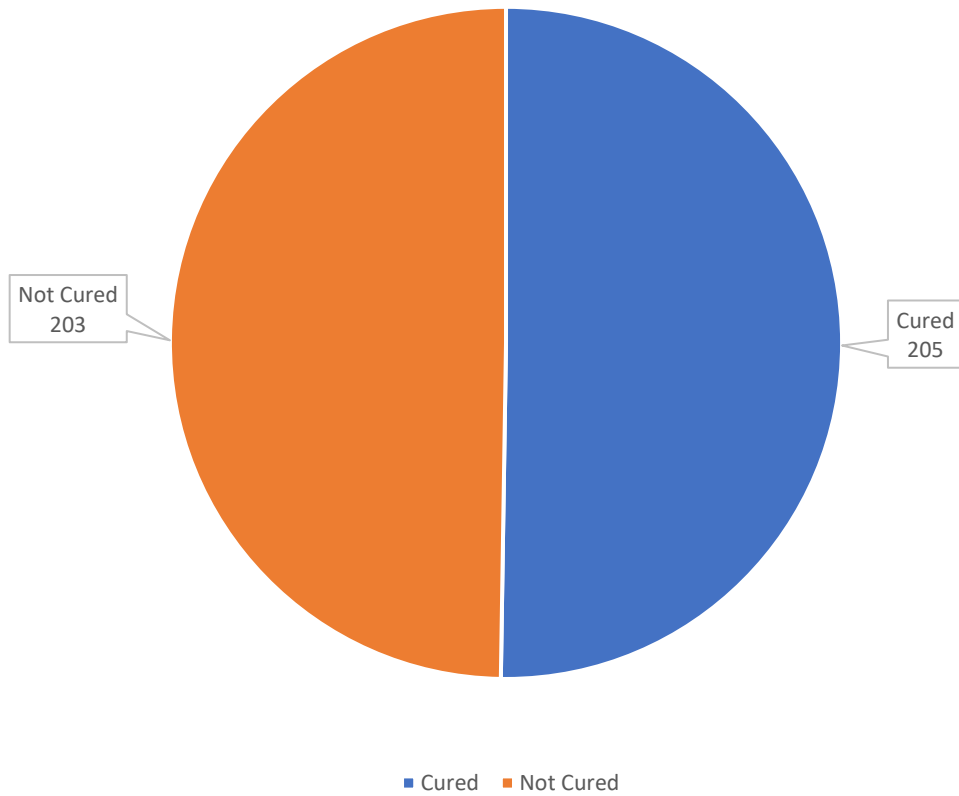

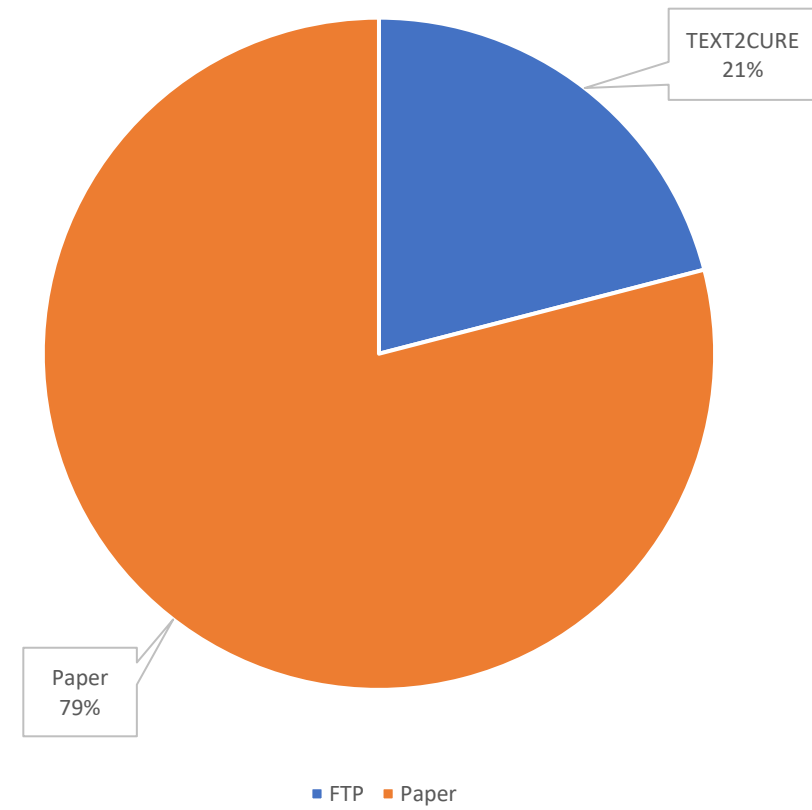
MONTHLY RATE OF BALLOTS RETURNED BY MAIL

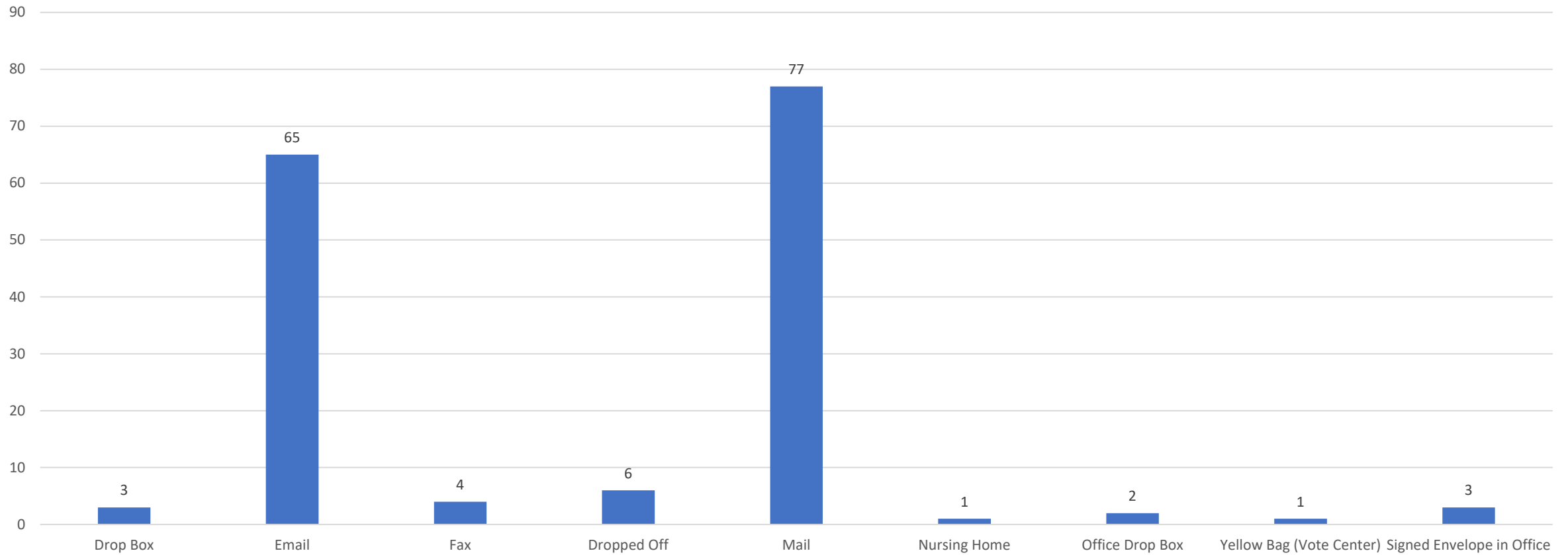

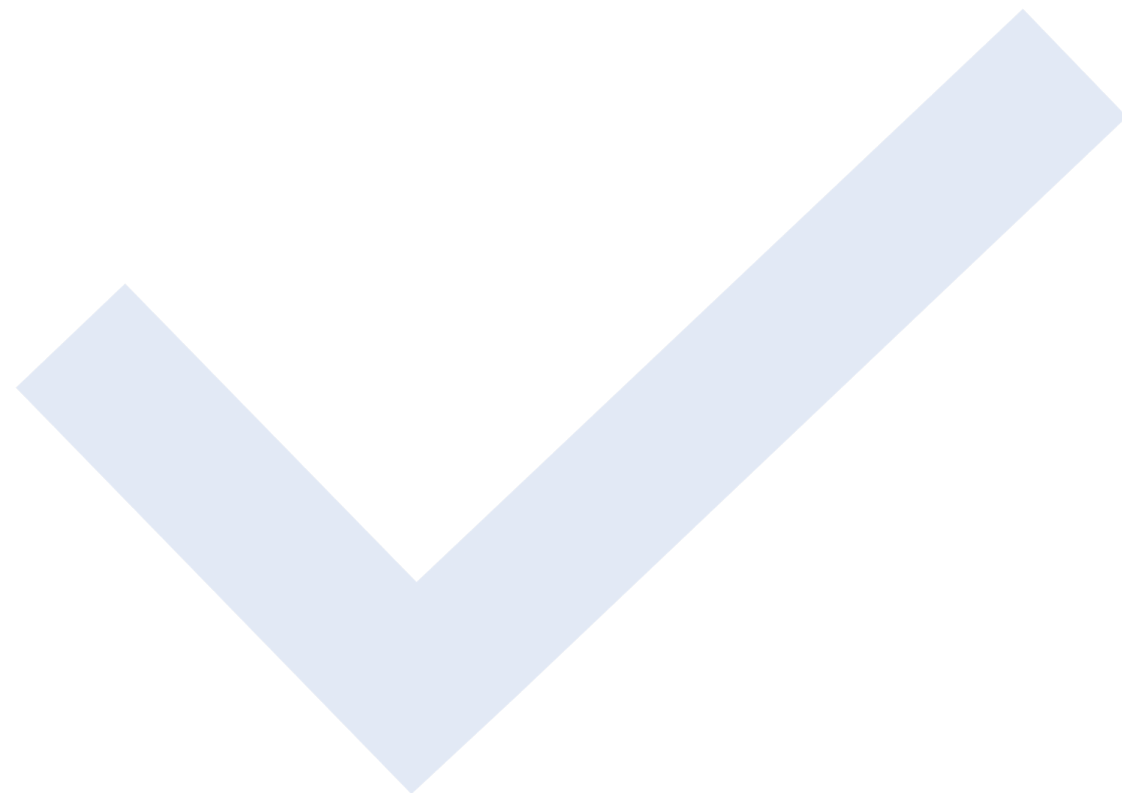

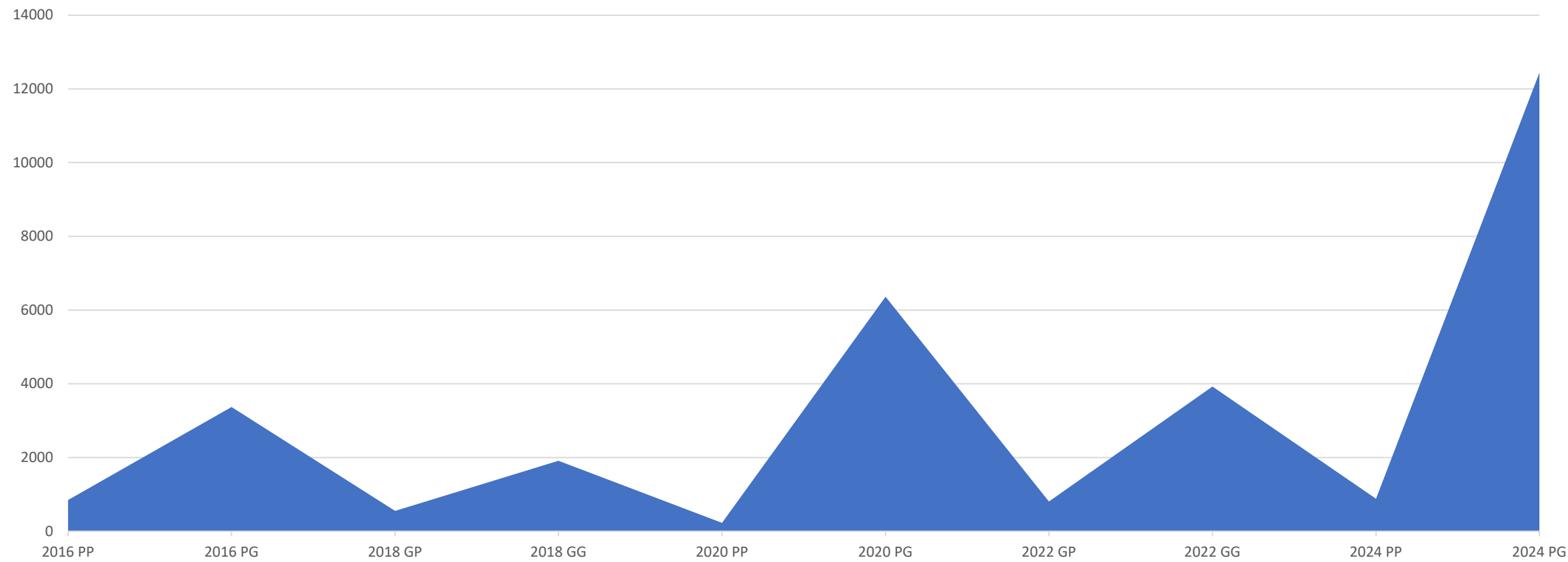

SDR AND ADDRESS CHANGES 2016 TO 2024

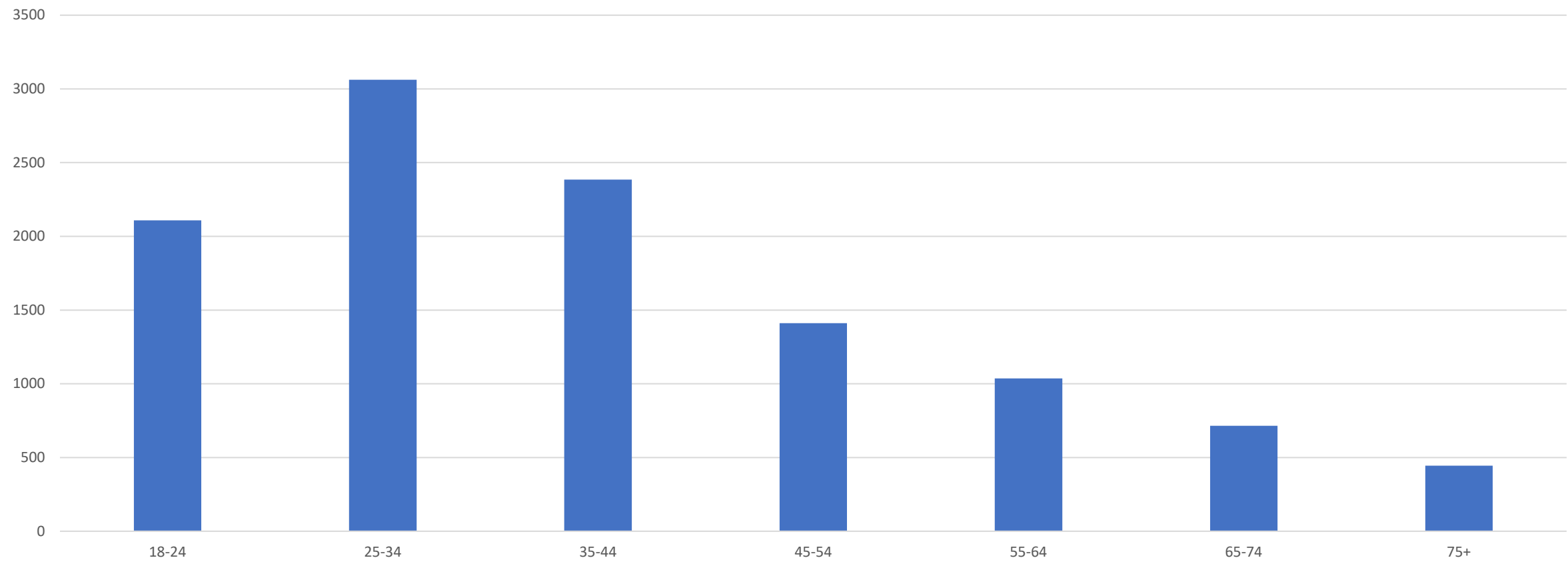

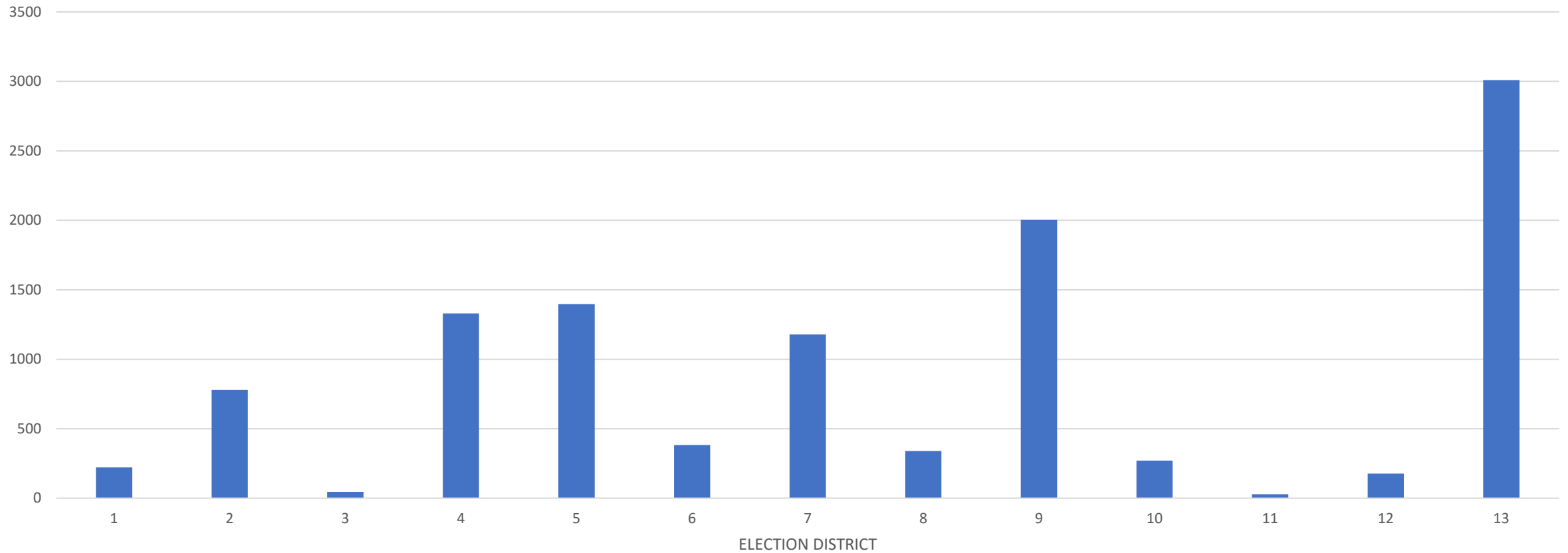


SAME DAY REGISTRATION AGE DISTRIBUTION

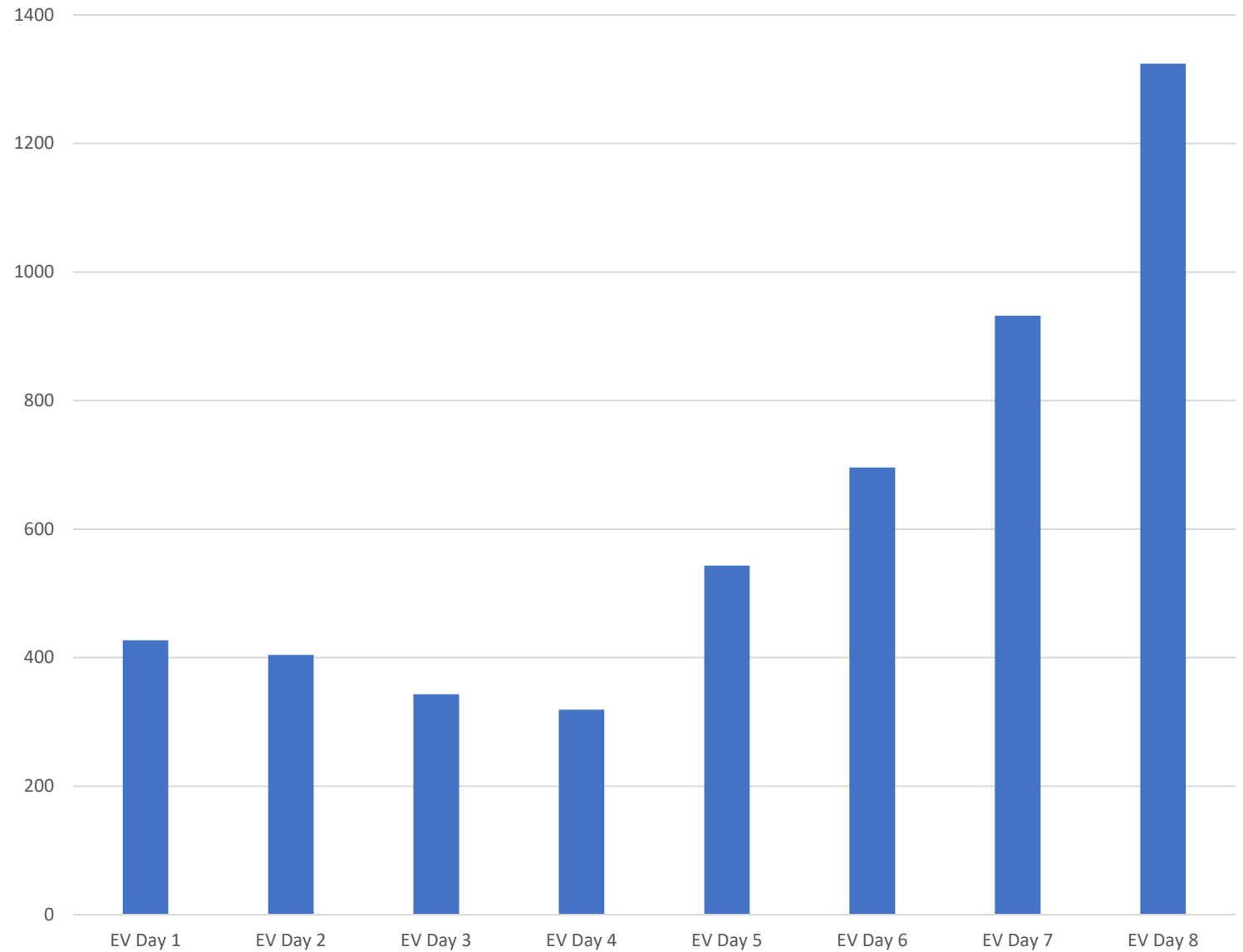

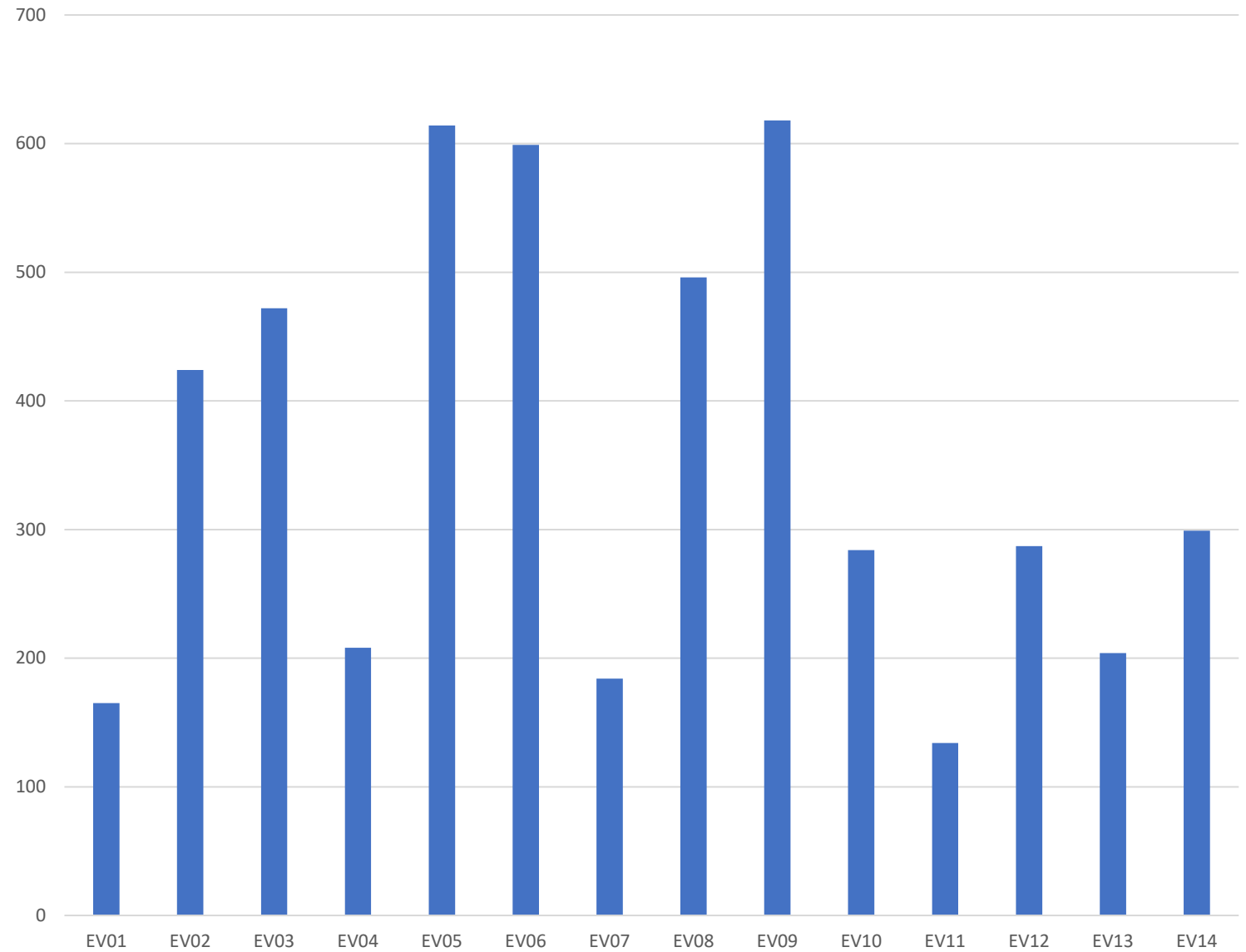

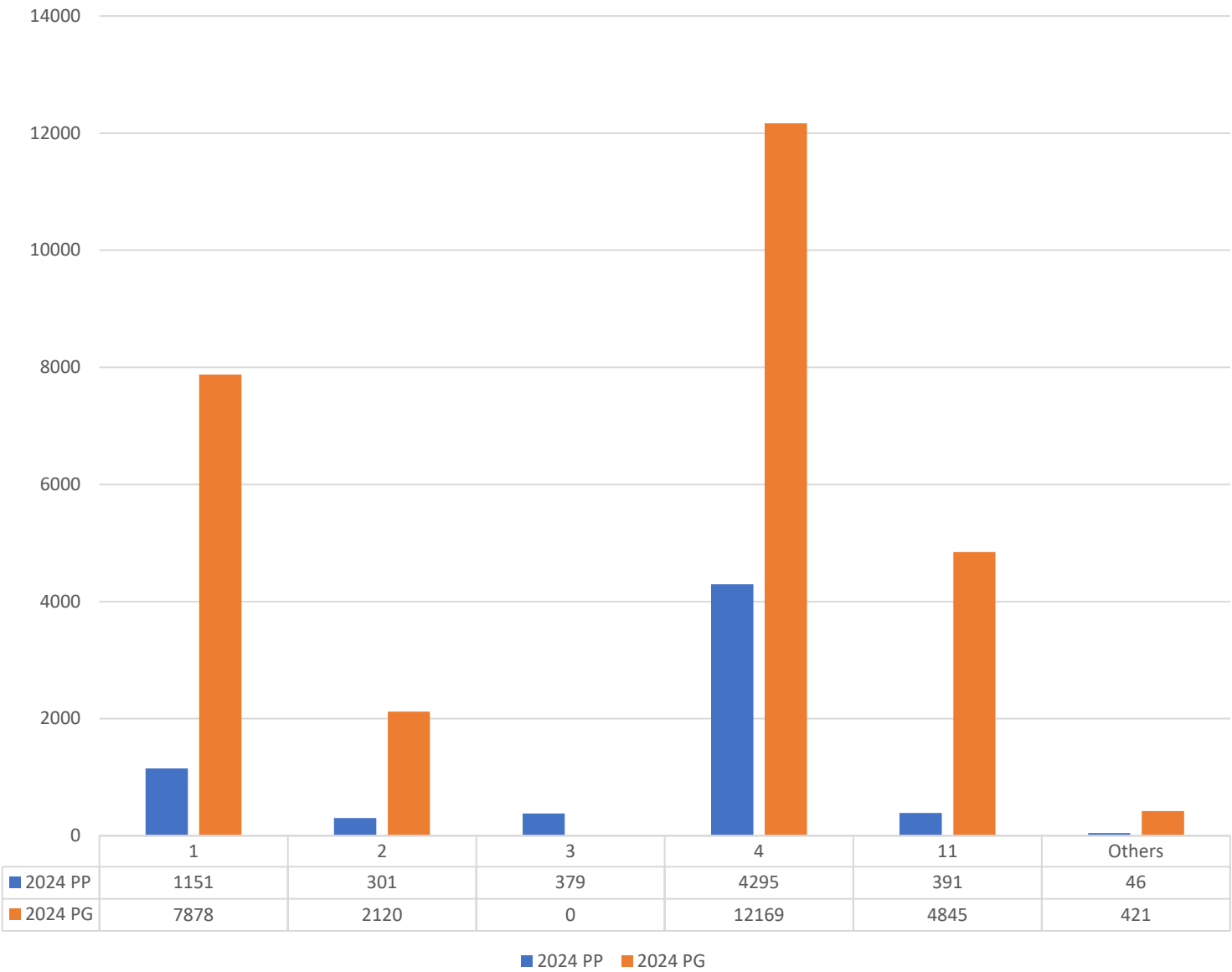

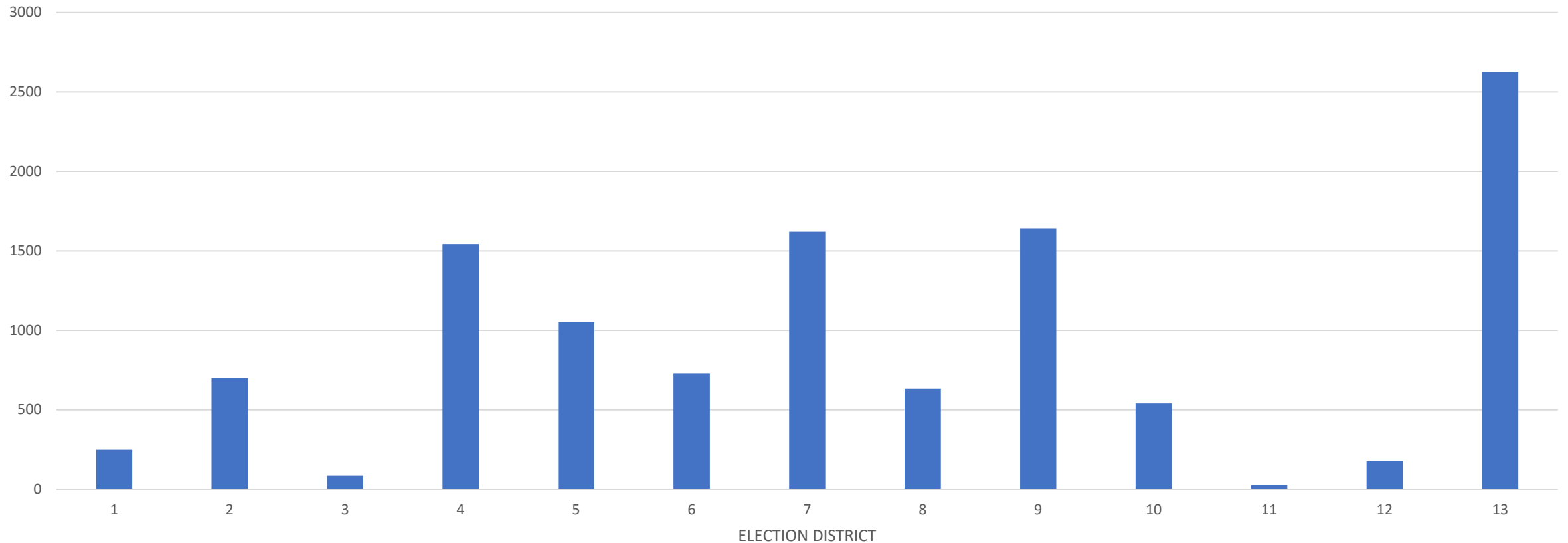

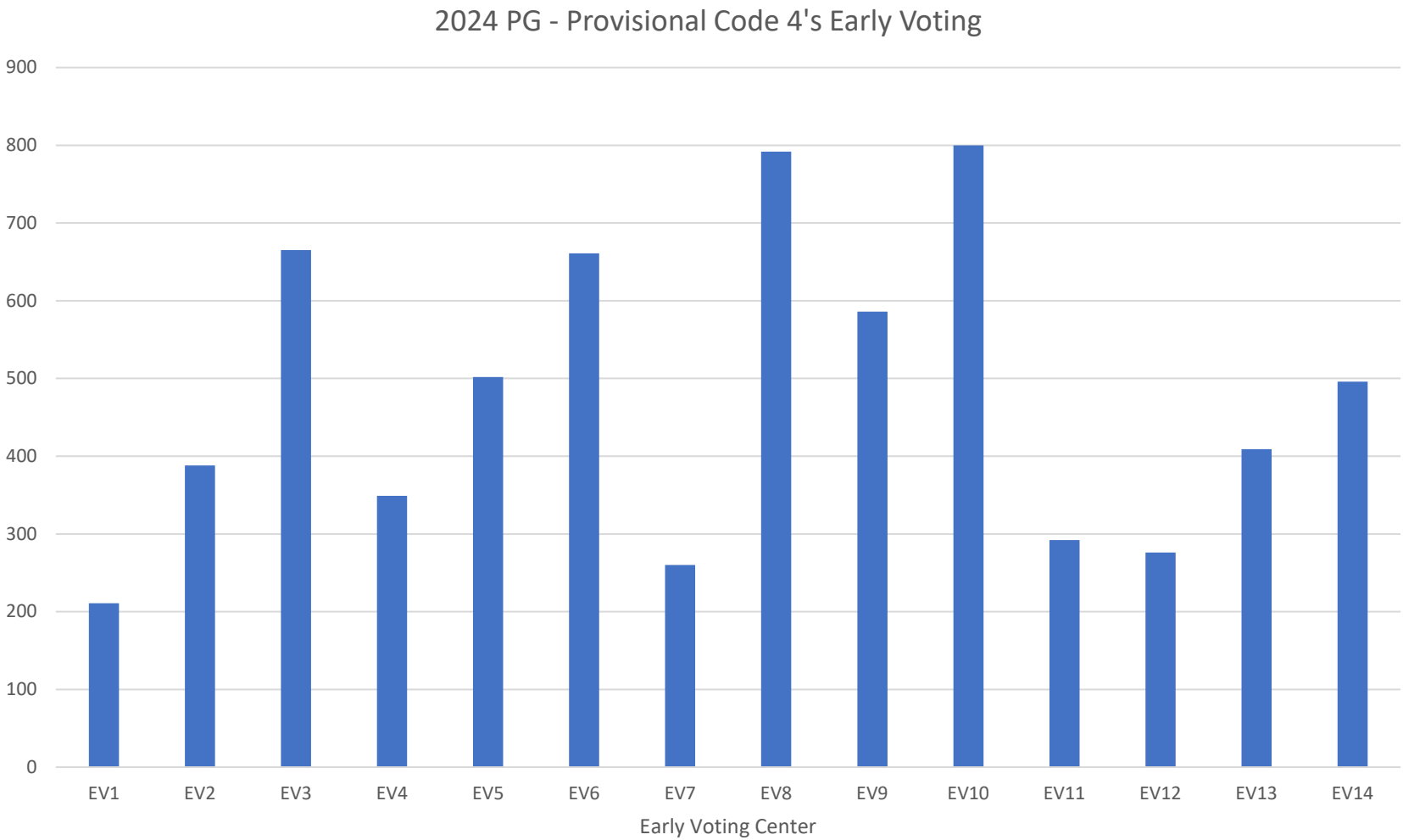

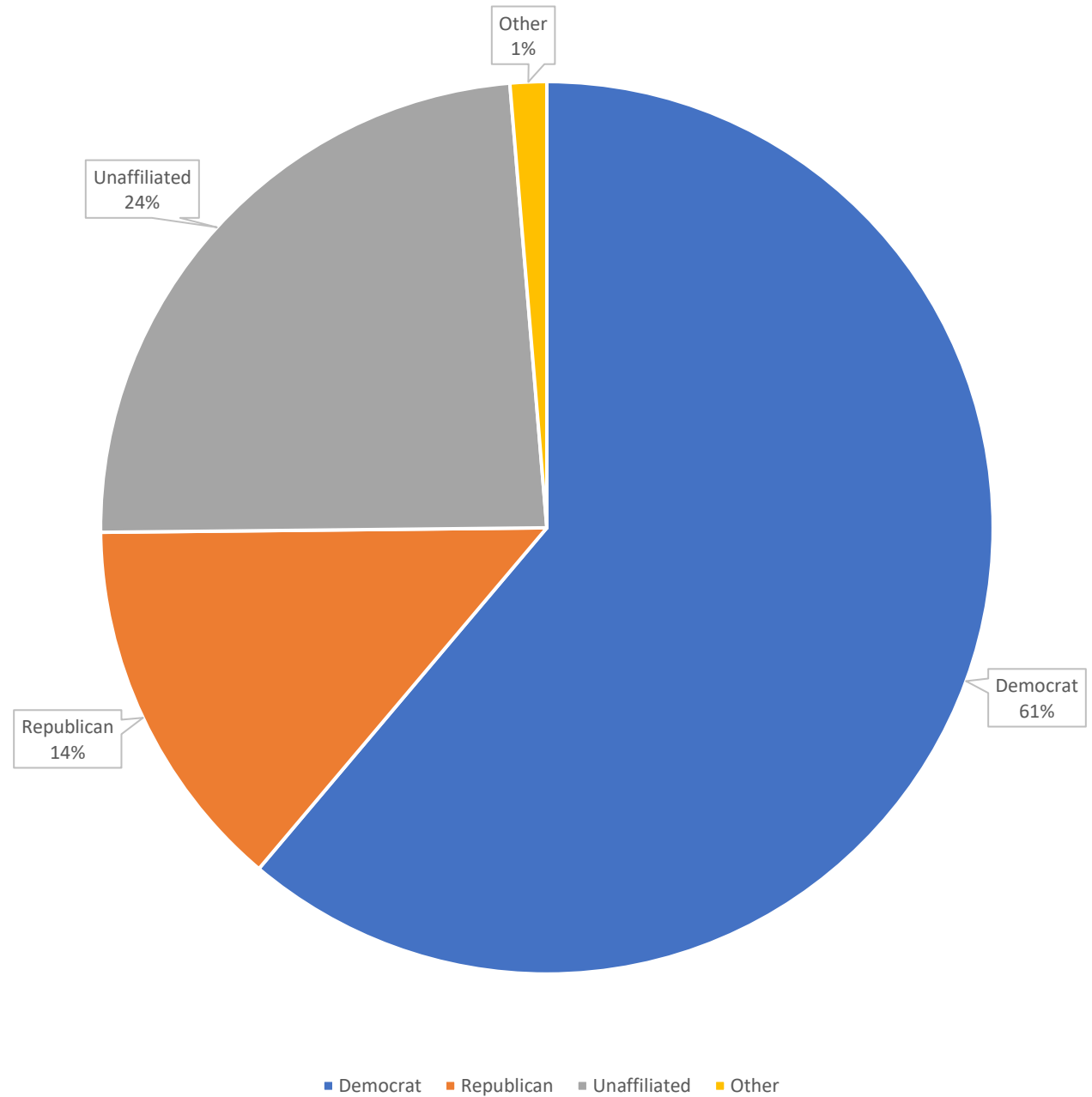

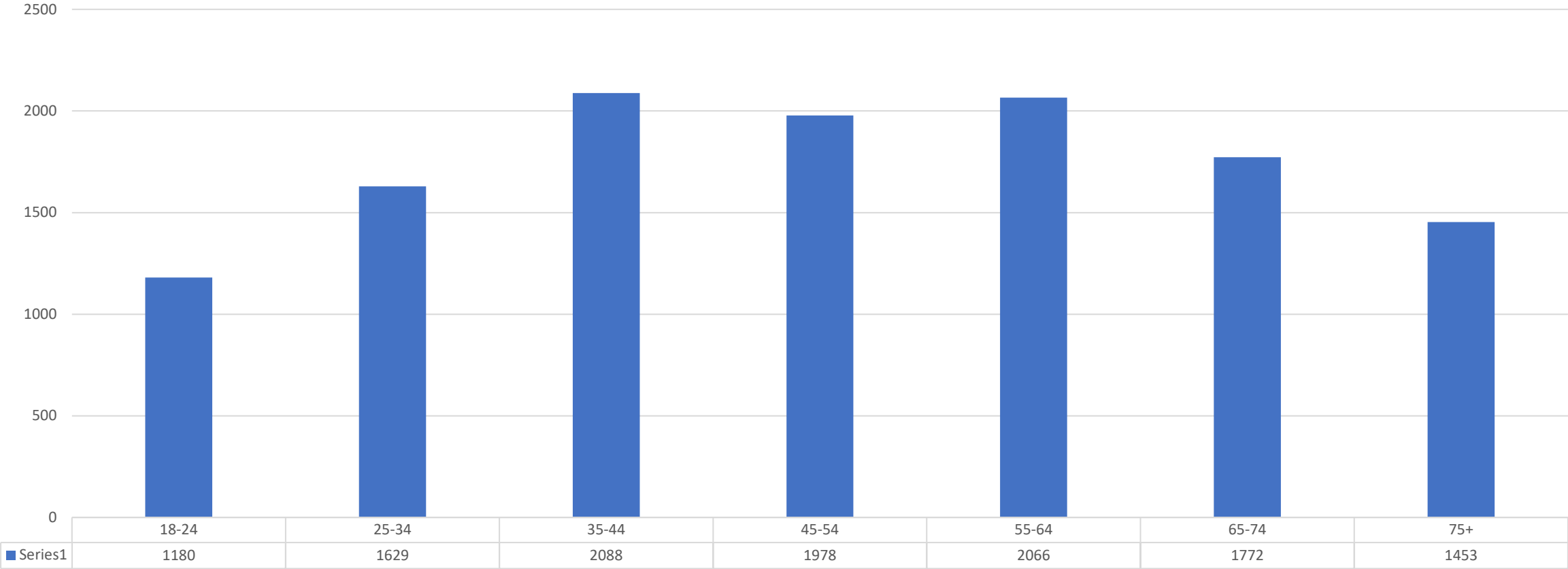

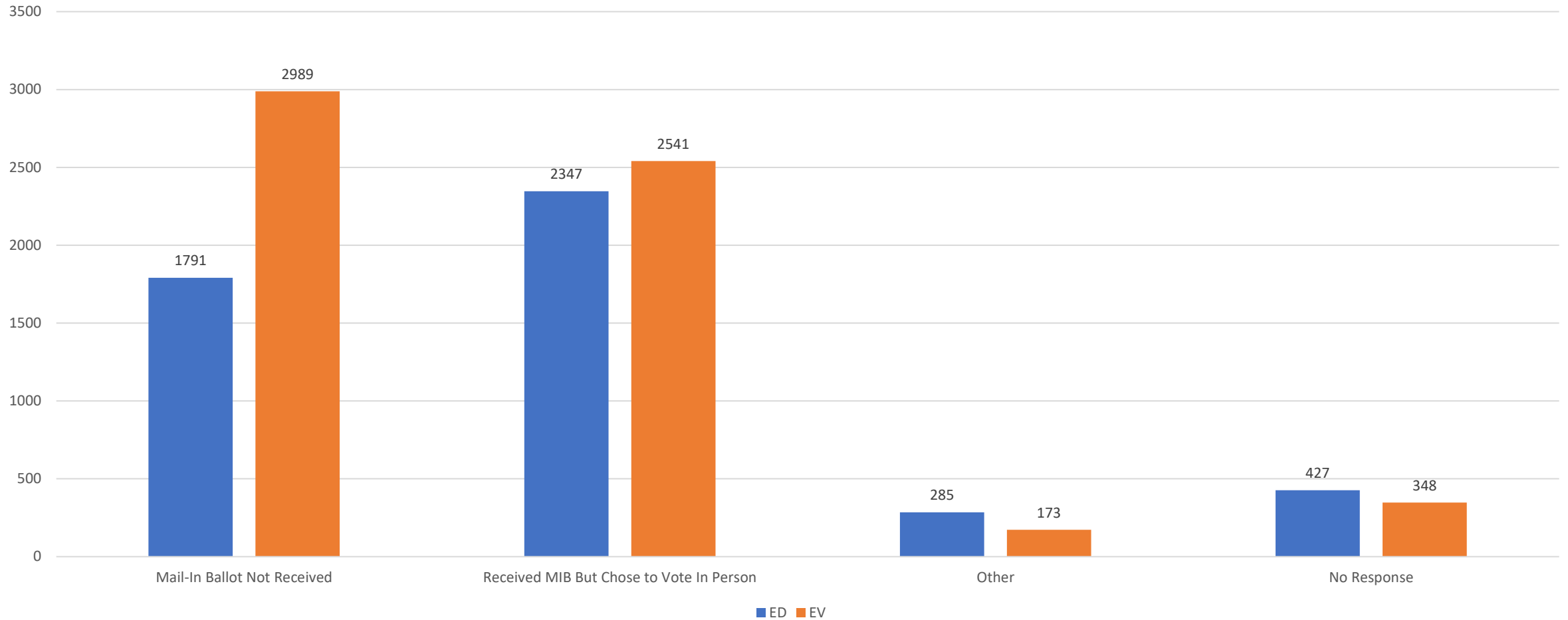

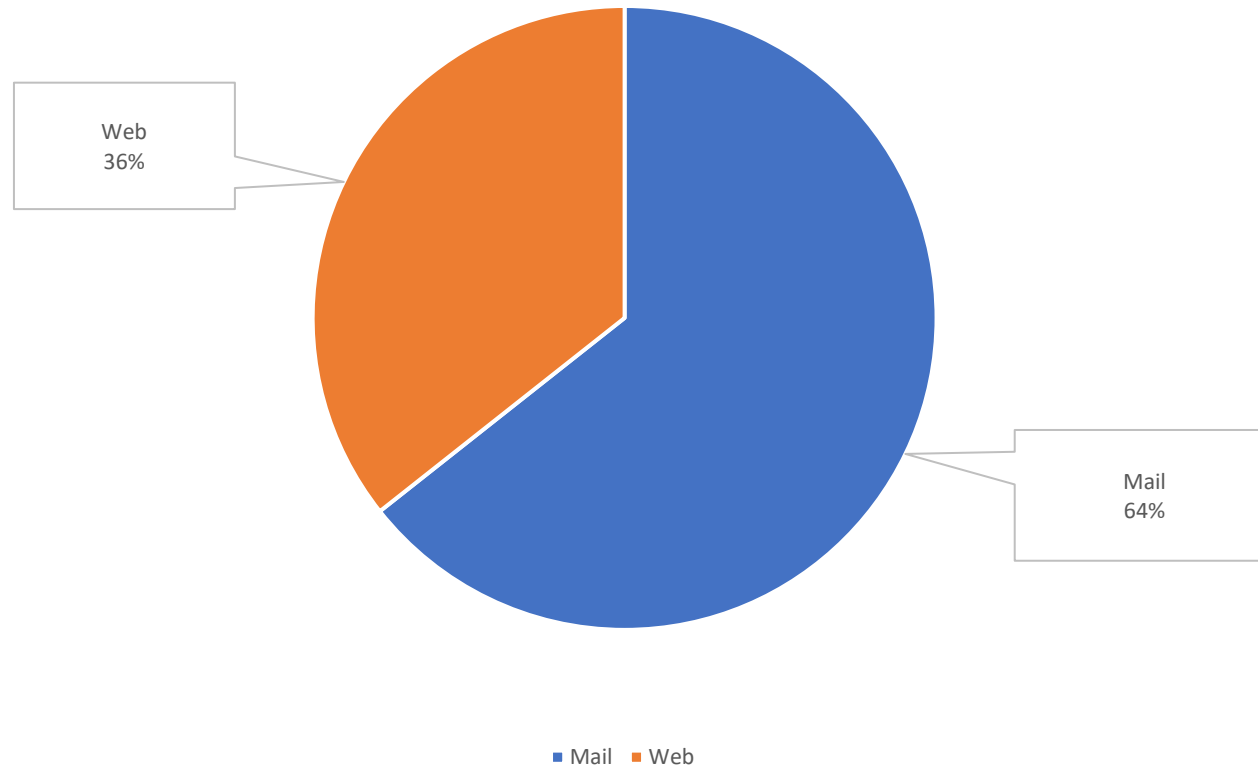

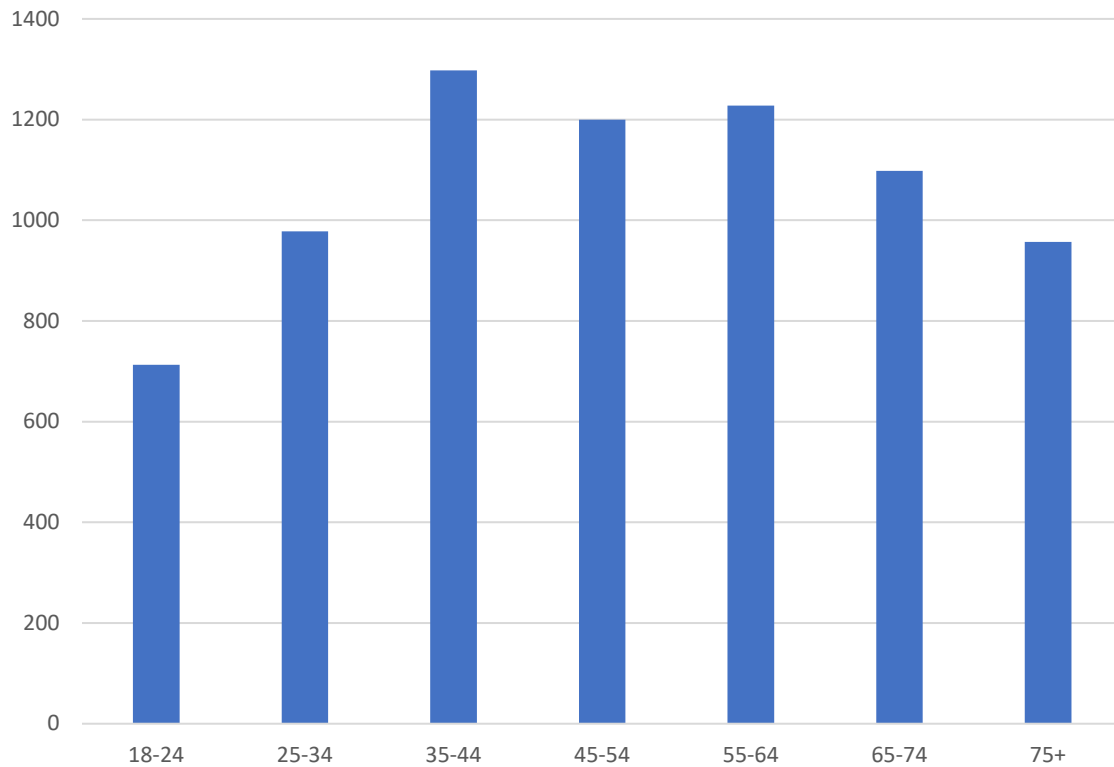

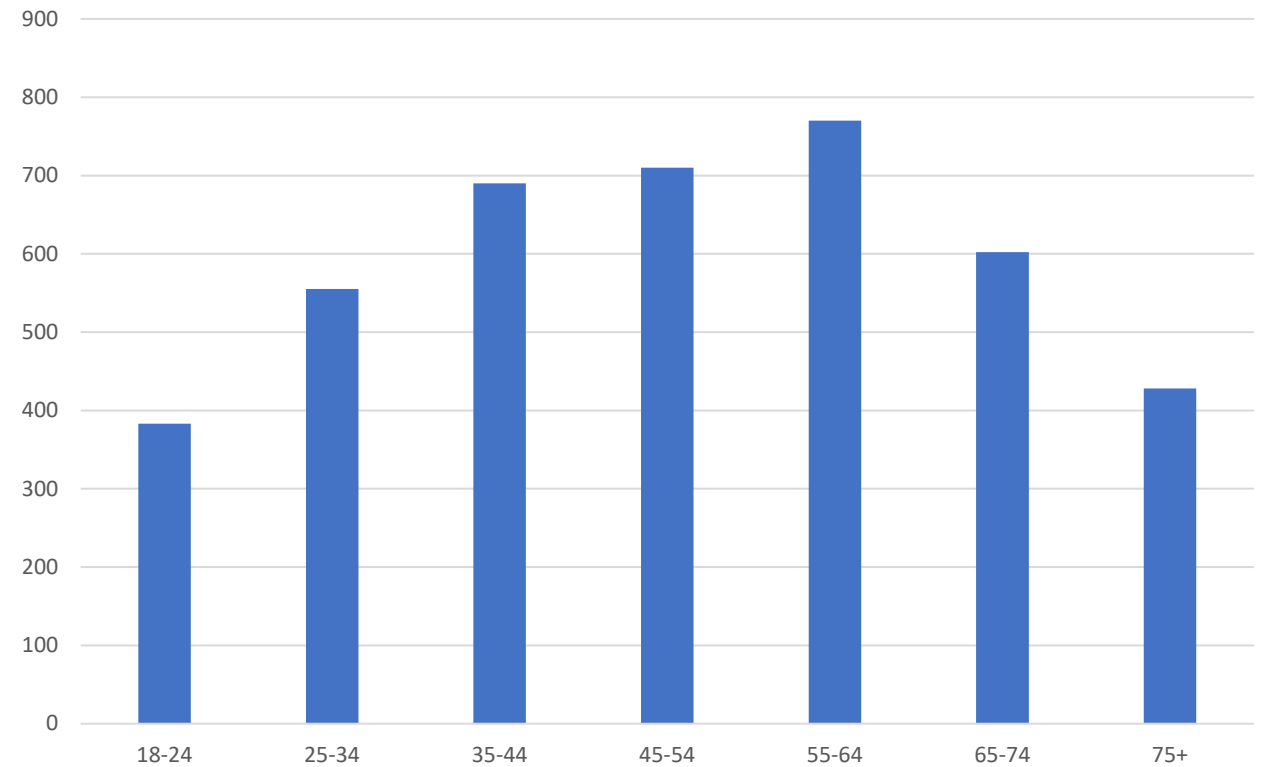

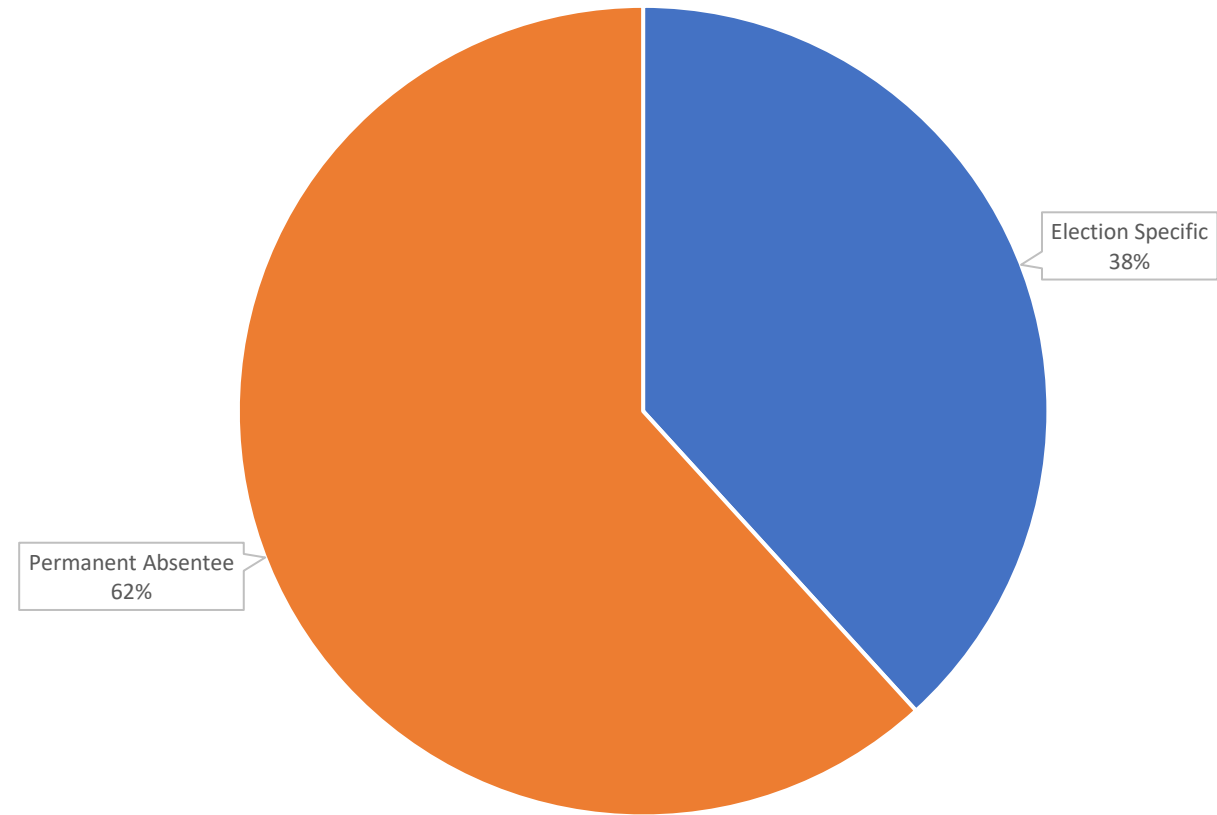

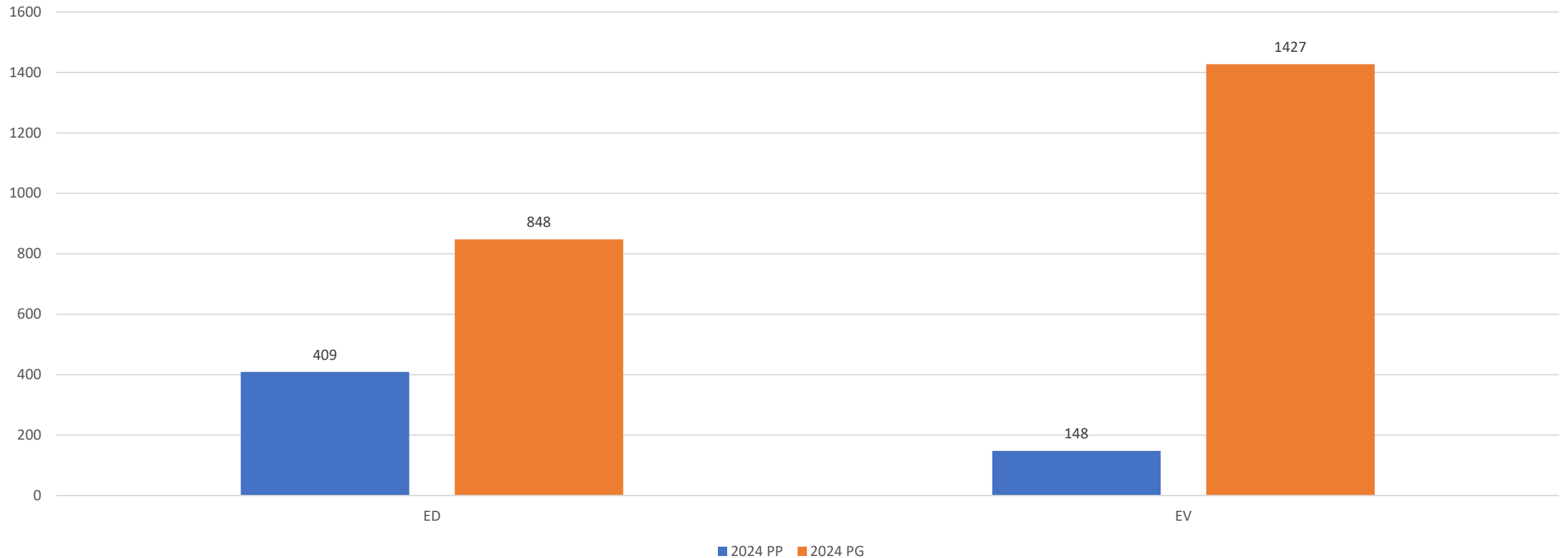

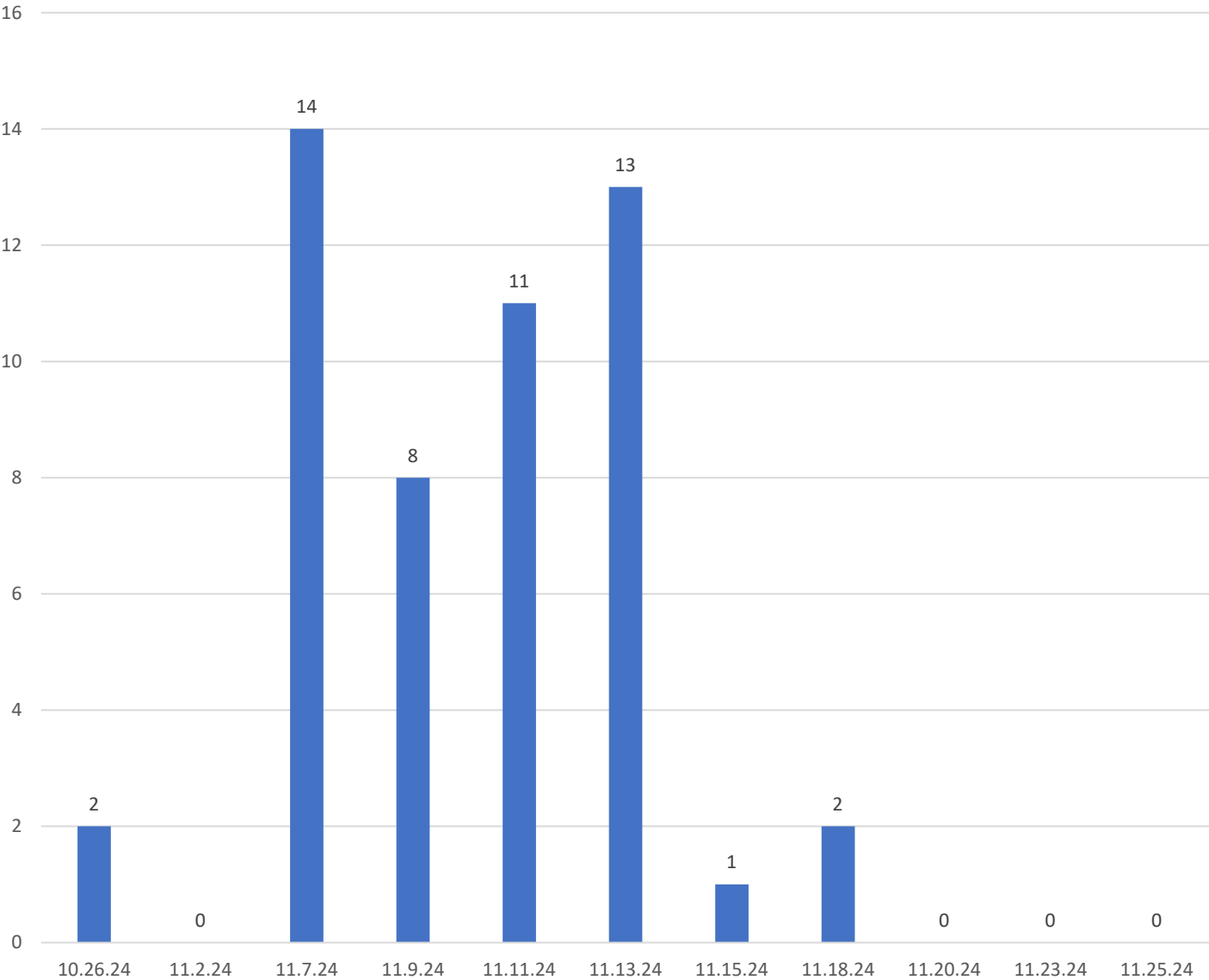

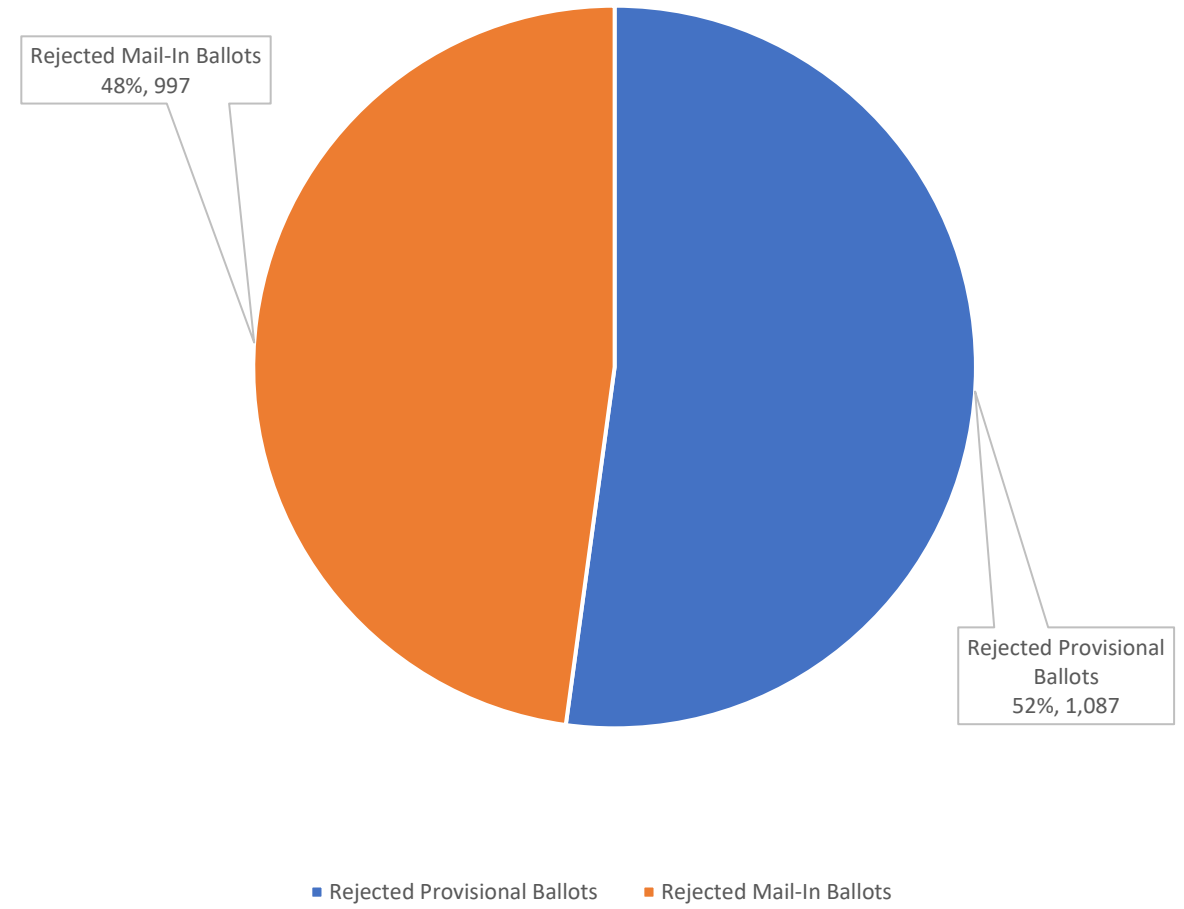

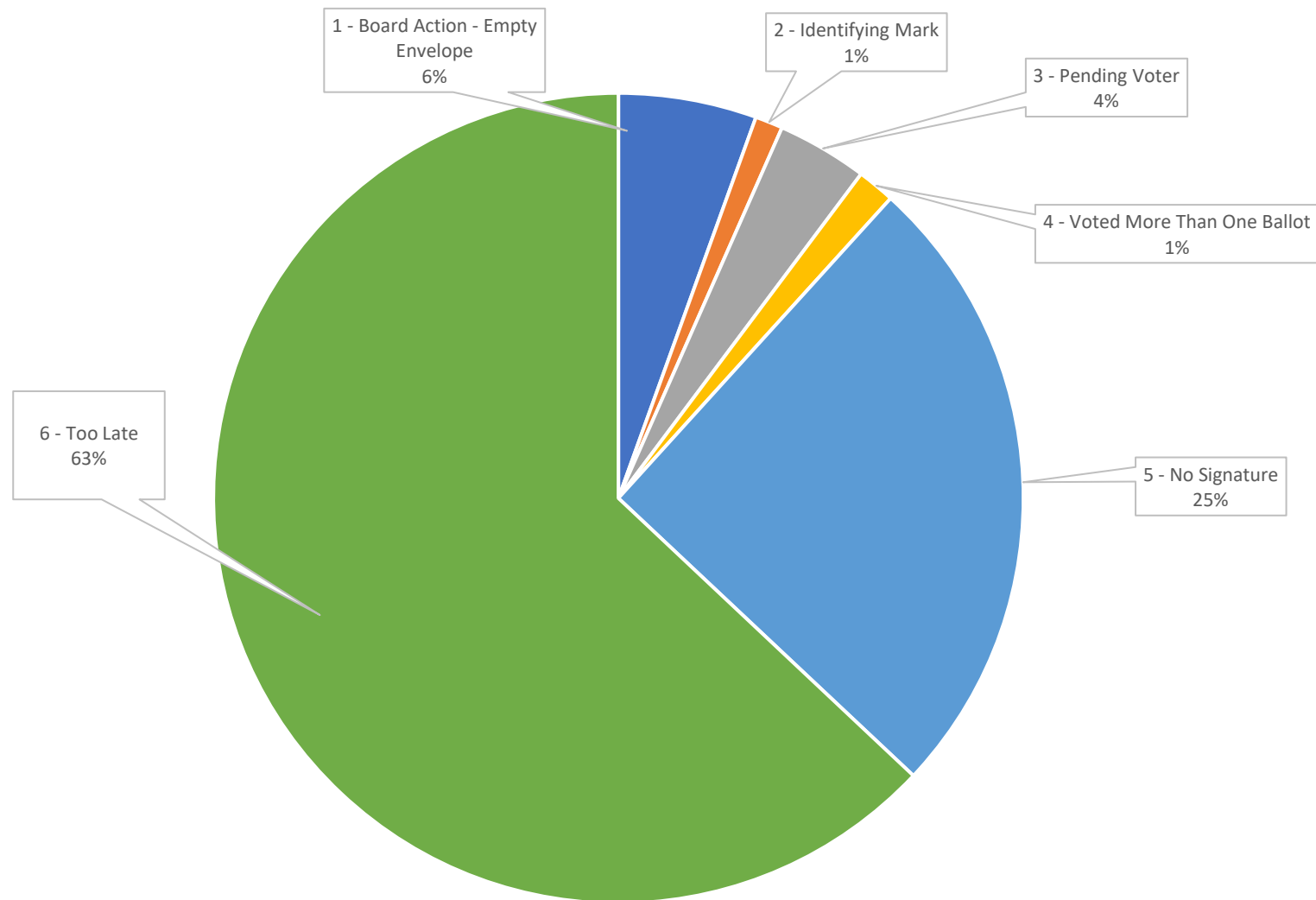

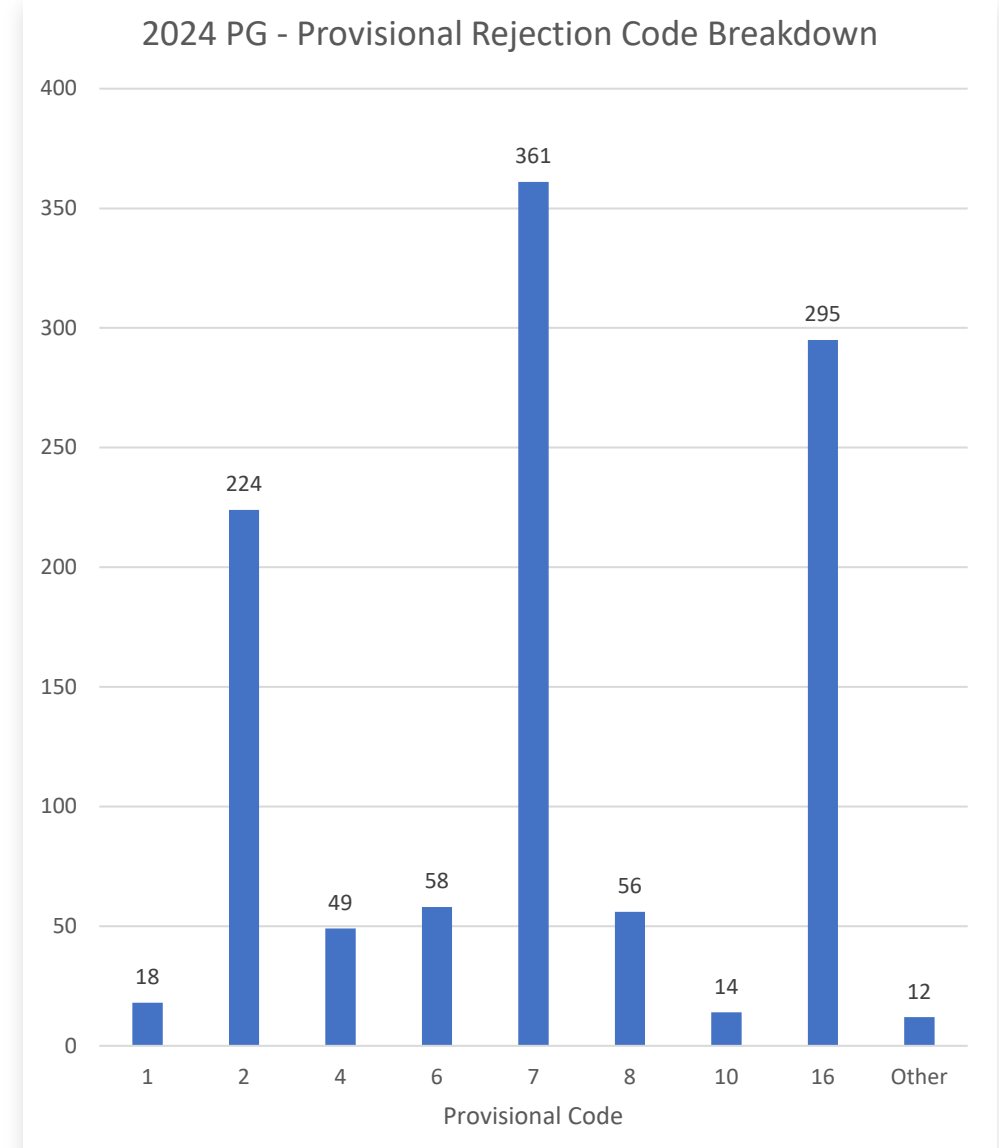

- 16 – Proof of residency was not timely received.

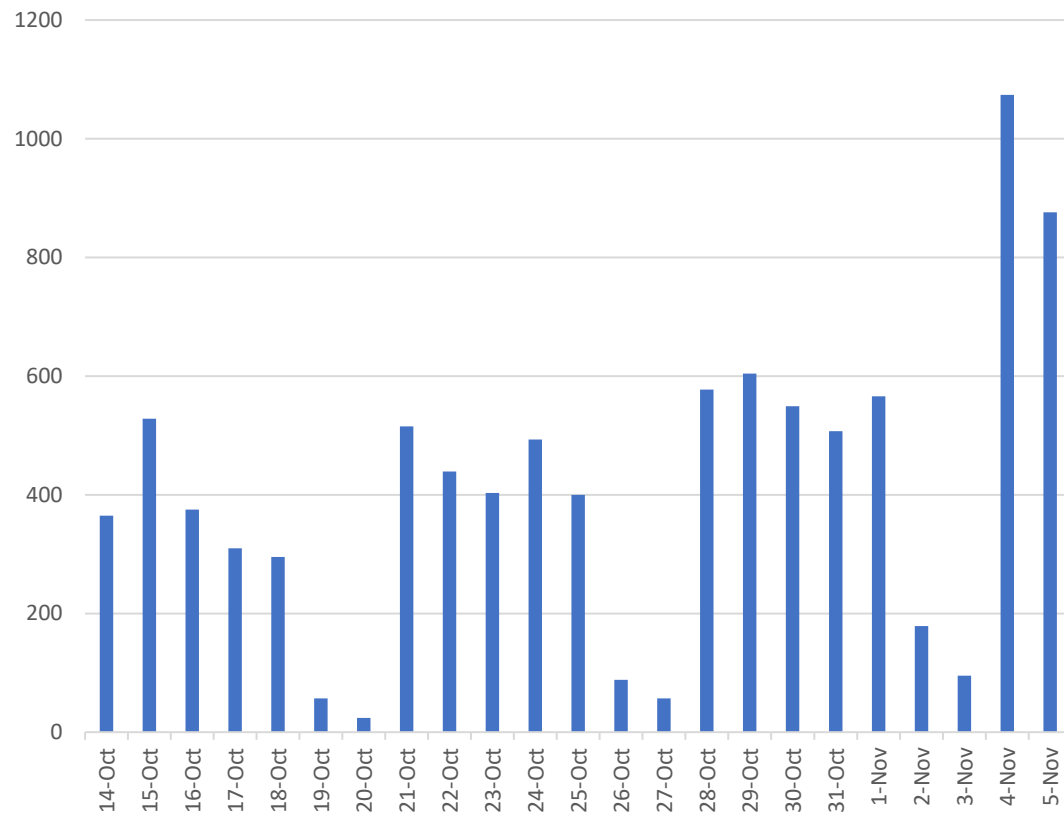




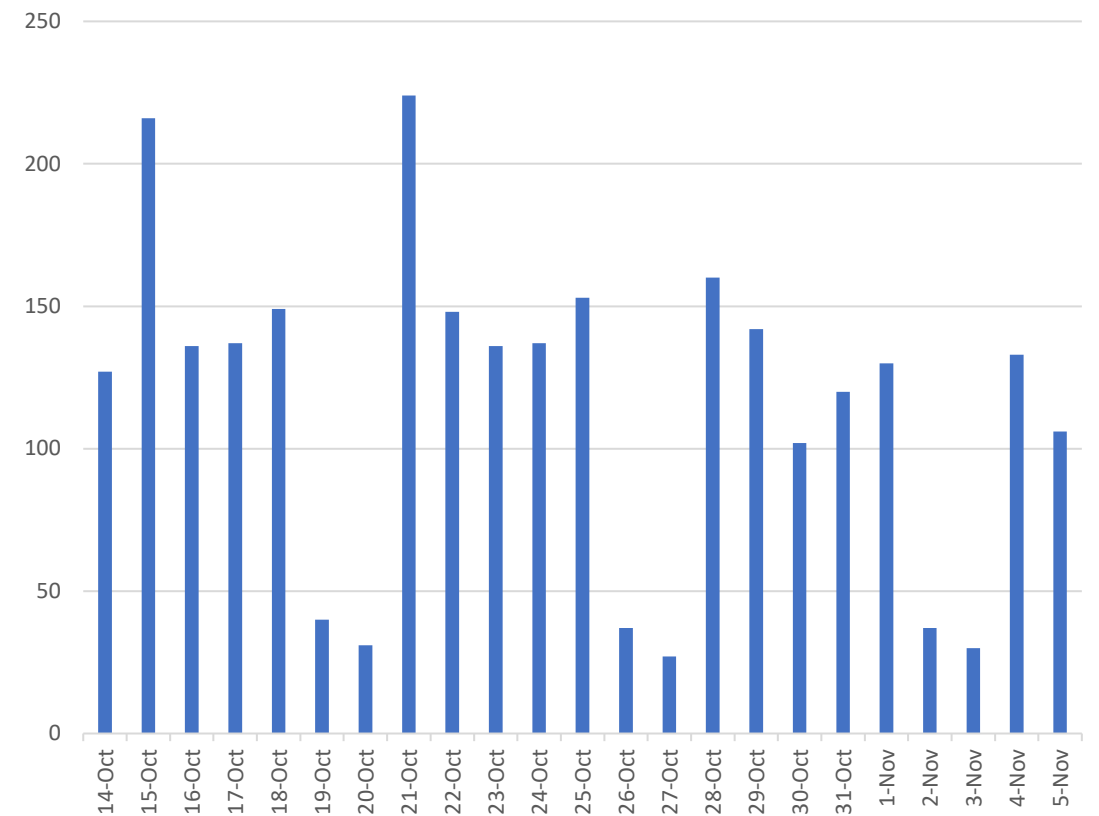

2024 PG - Daily Call Volume (8500/Call Center)

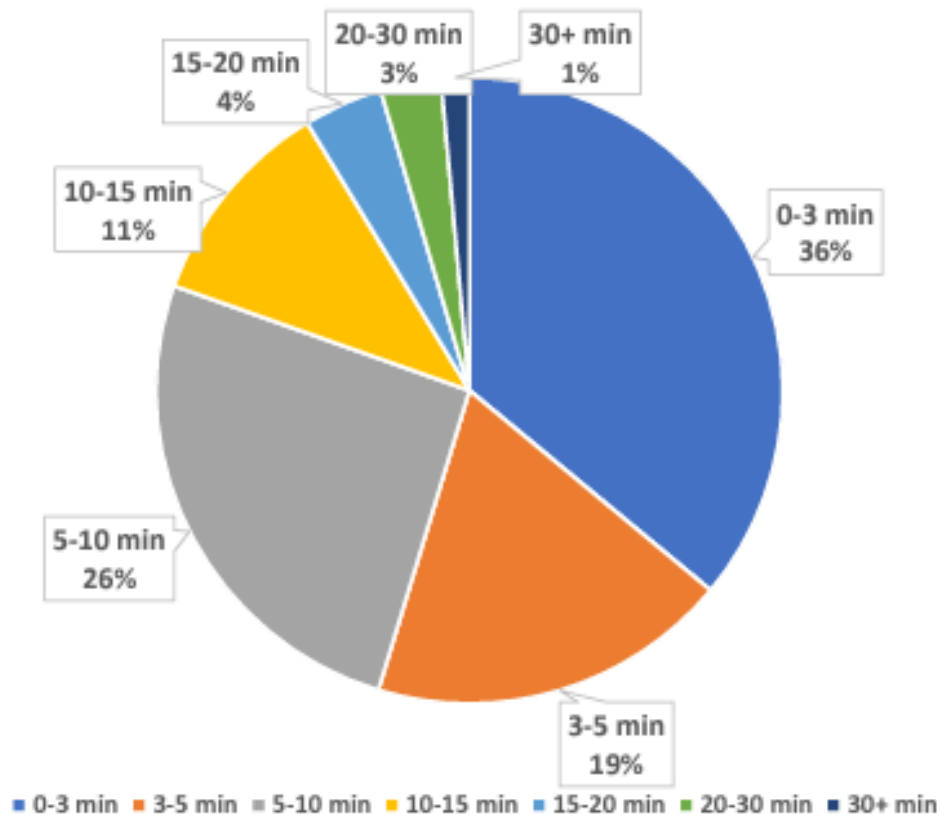


2024 PG - Daily Call Volume (8550/Vote By Mail)

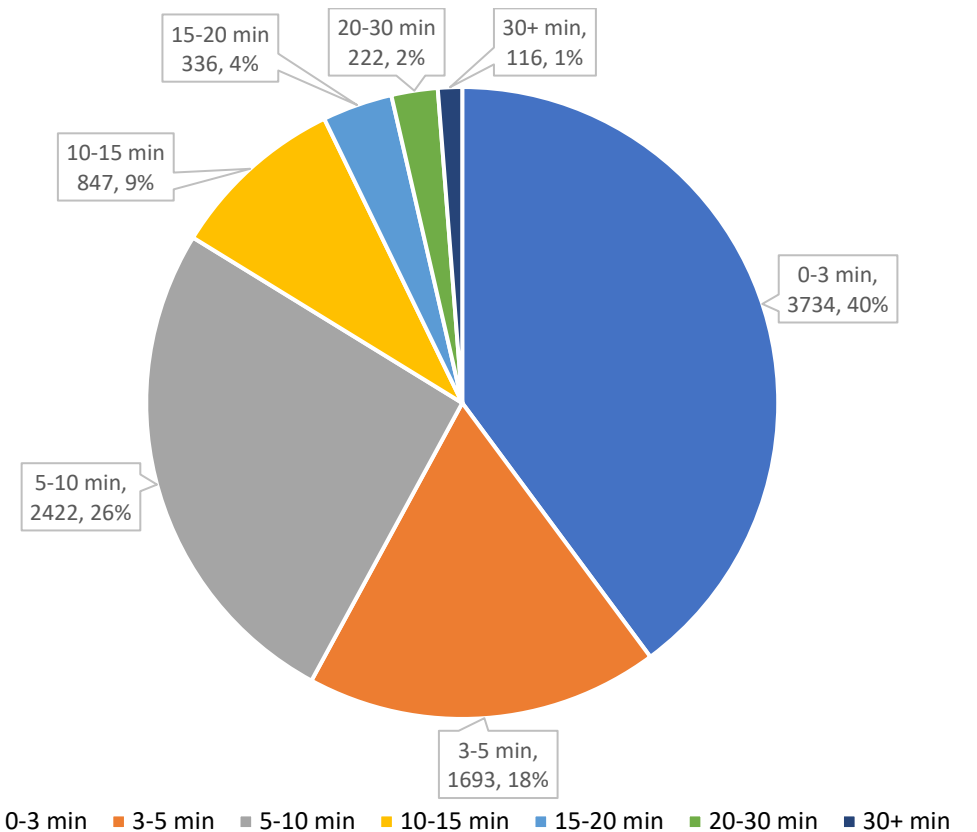

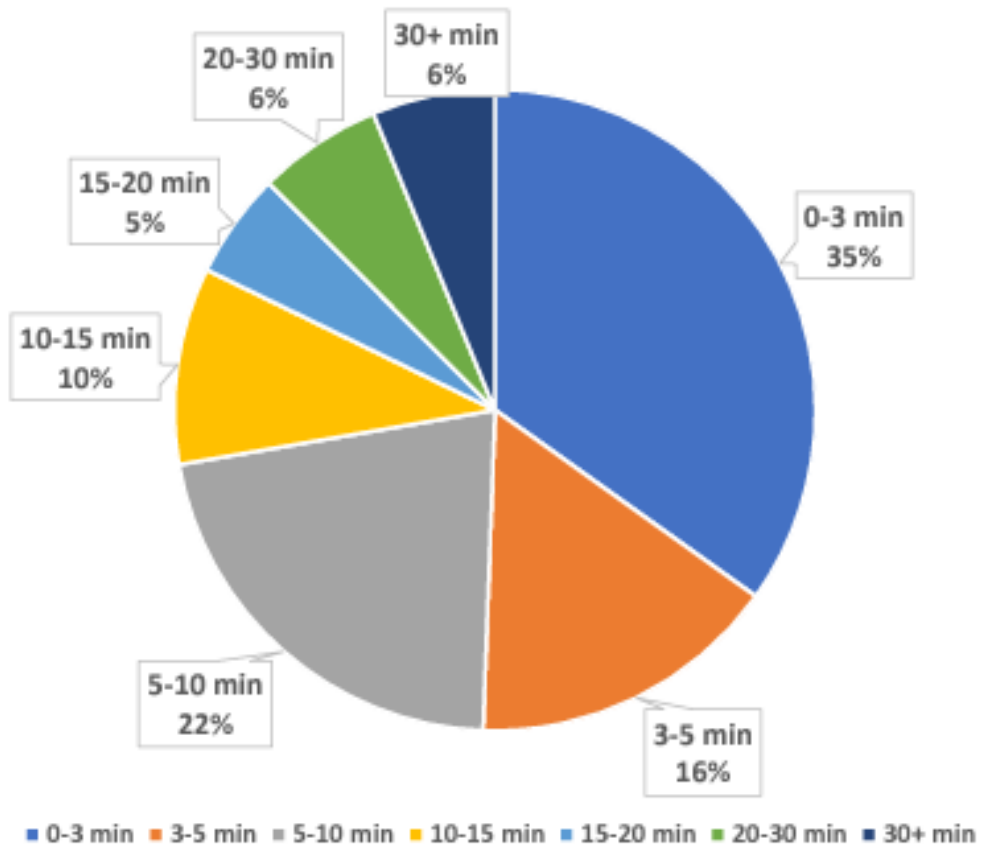

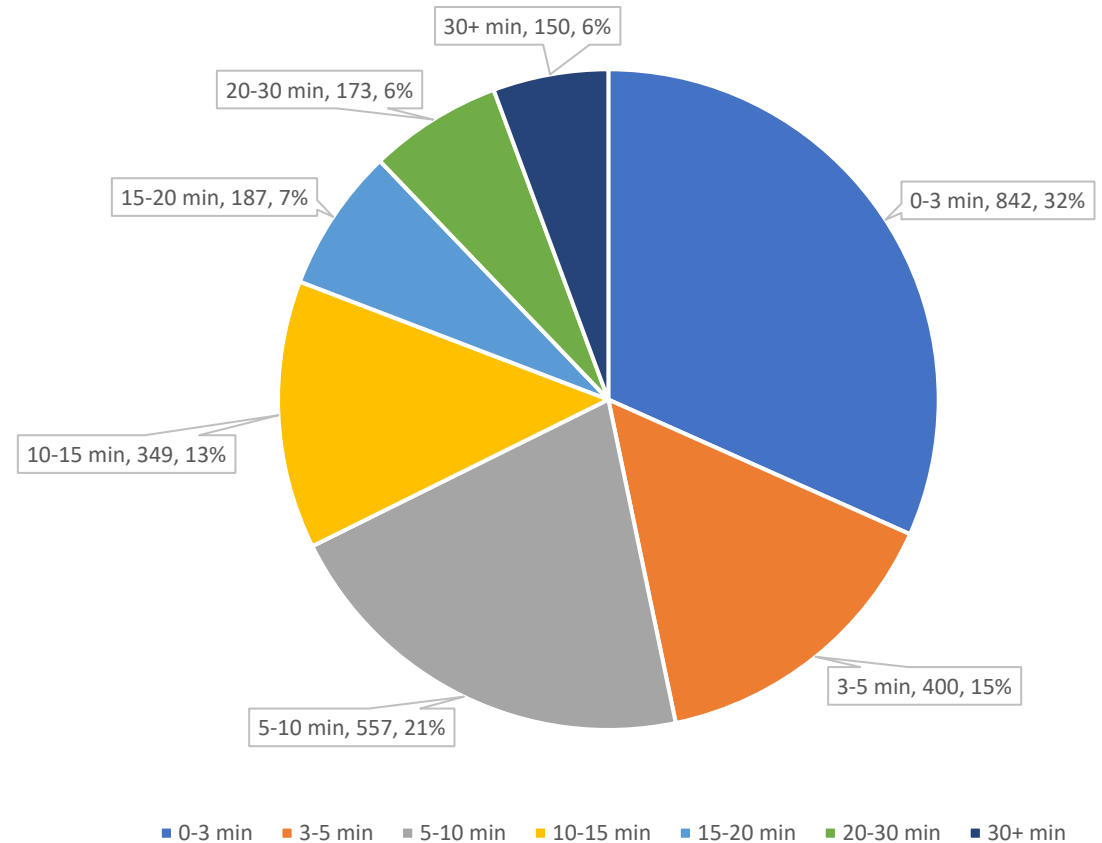


8550/VOTE BY MAIL CALL LENGTH

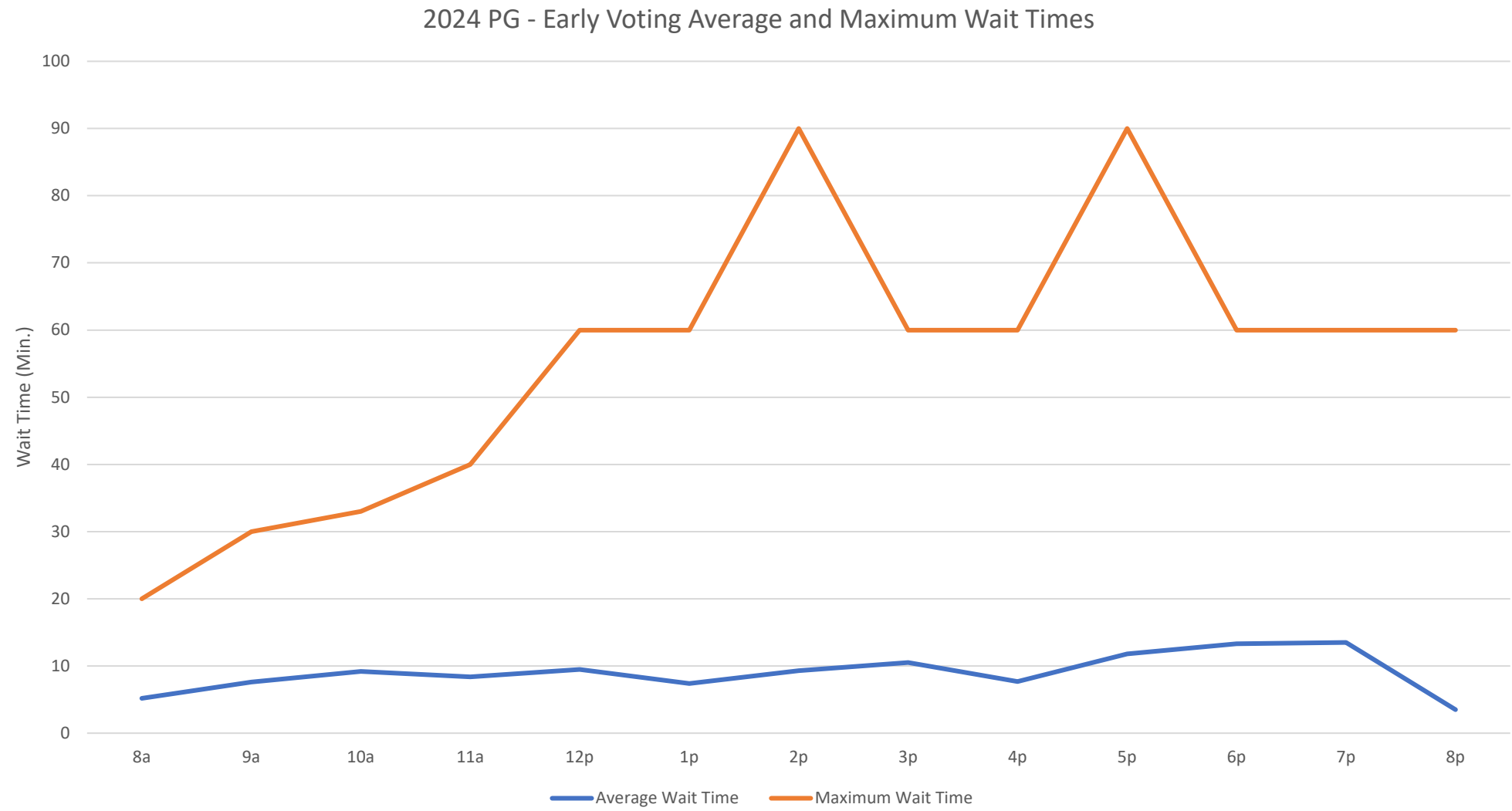

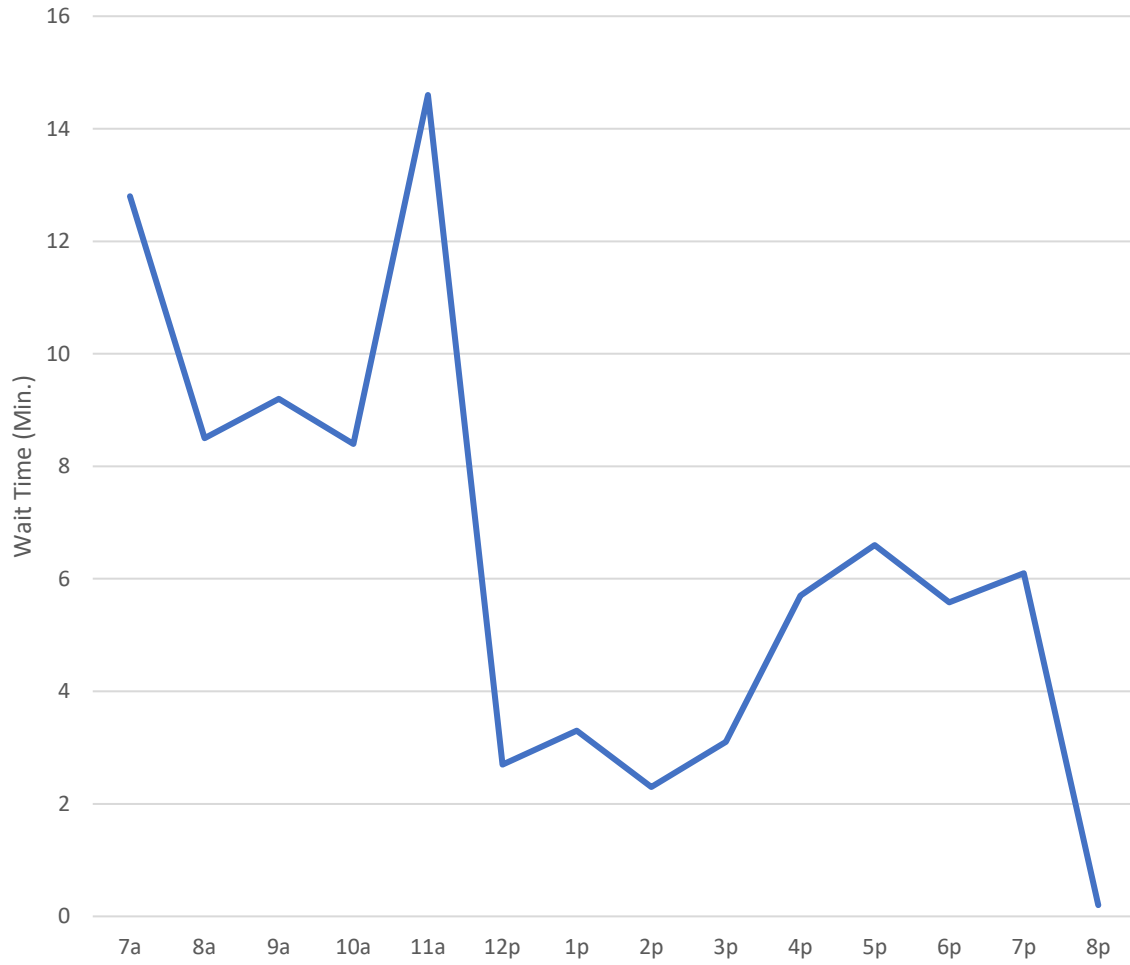

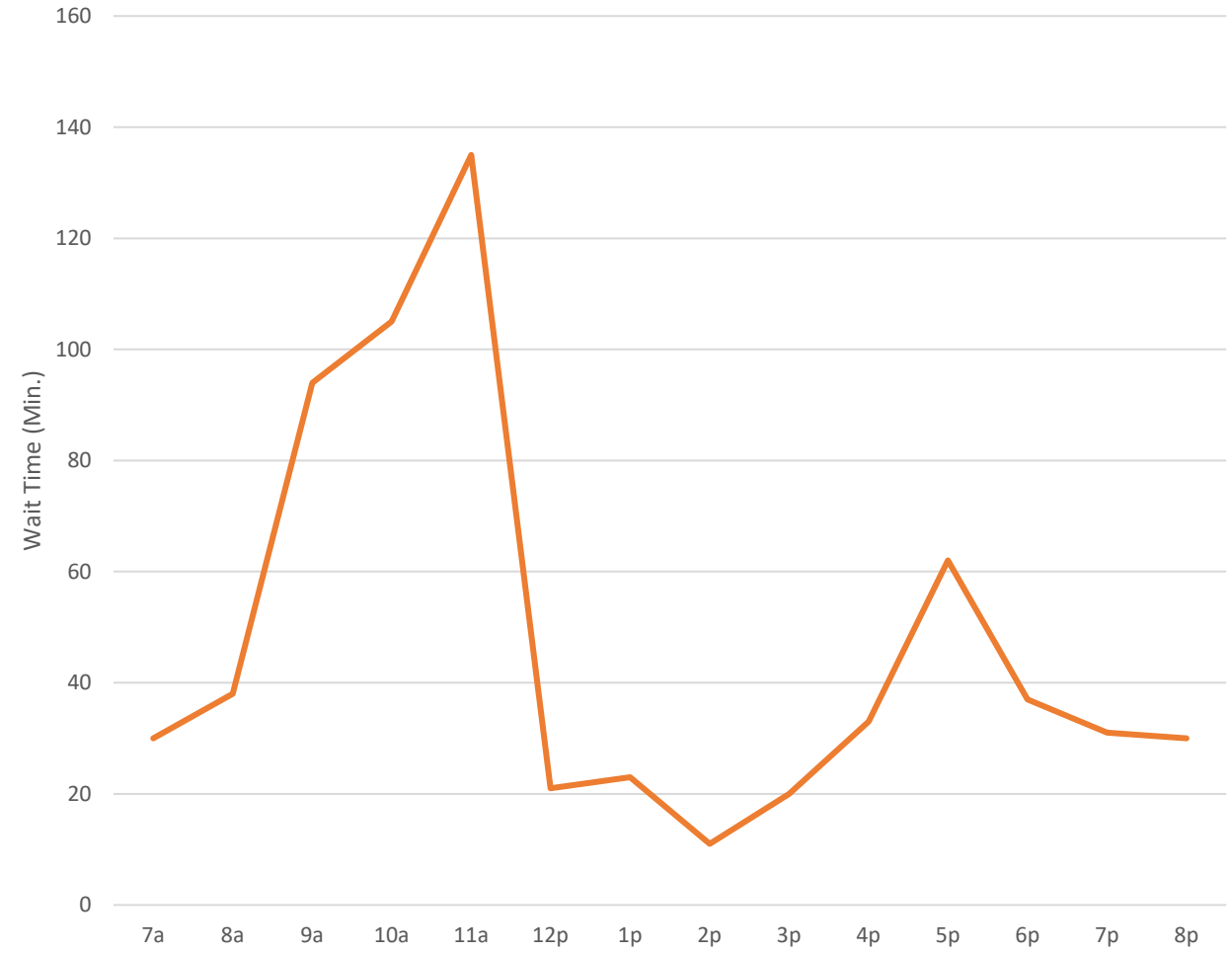
2024 PG - Number of Precincts Reporting Wait Time Per Hour



2024 PG – Election Day Average Wait Time



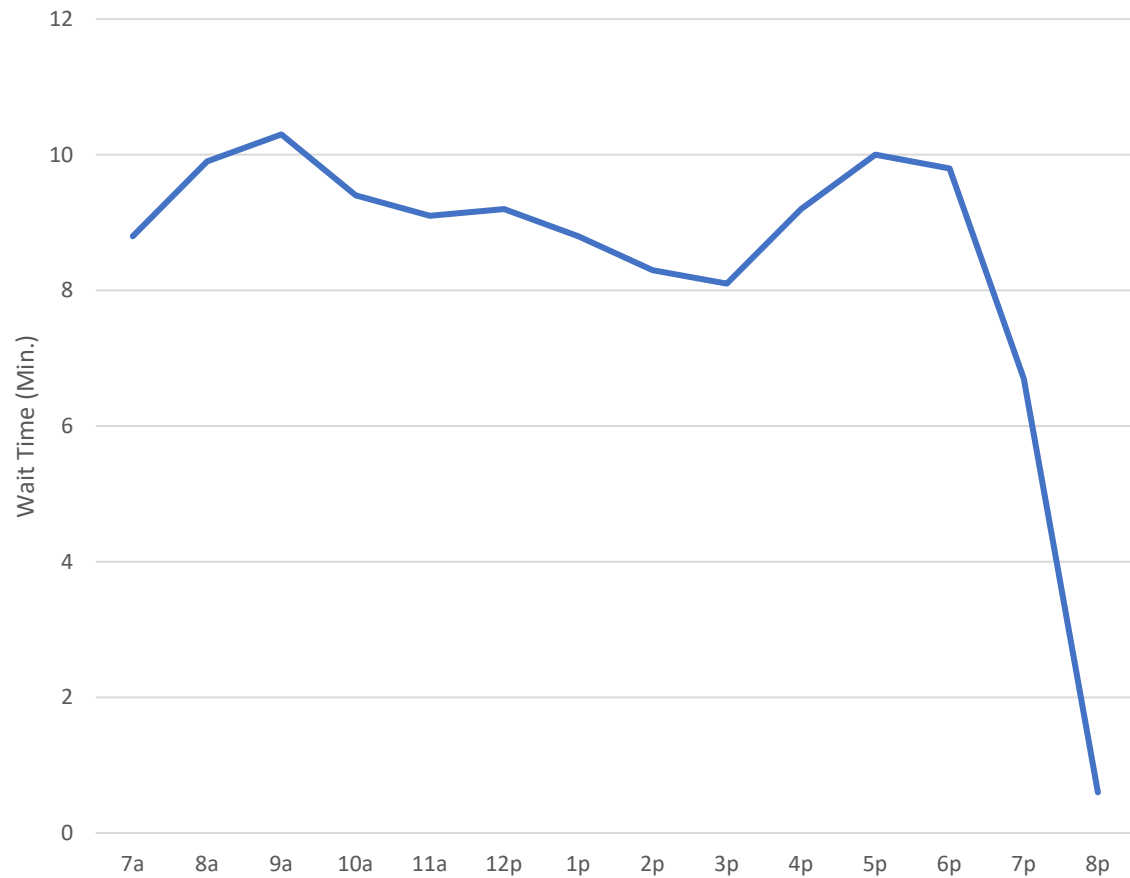
2024 PG - Election Day Maximum Wait Time



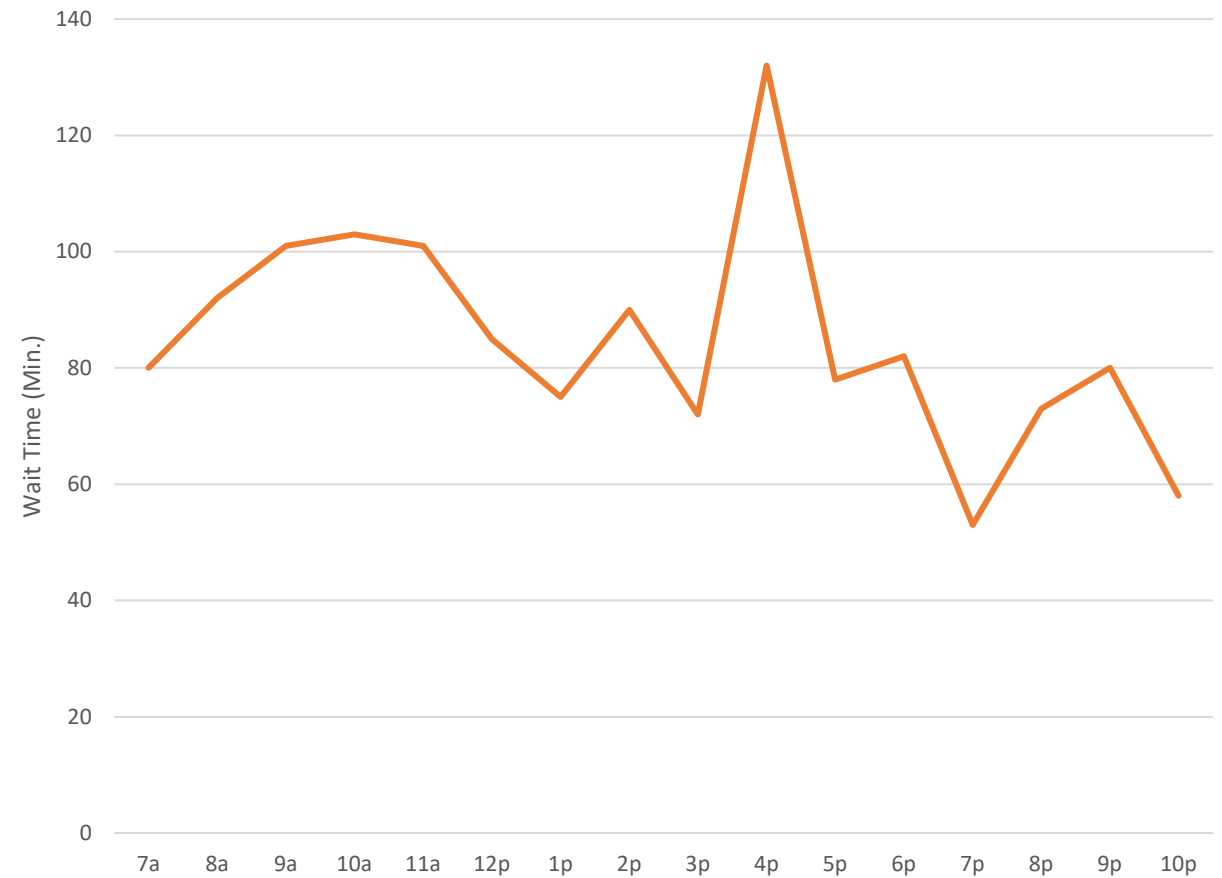

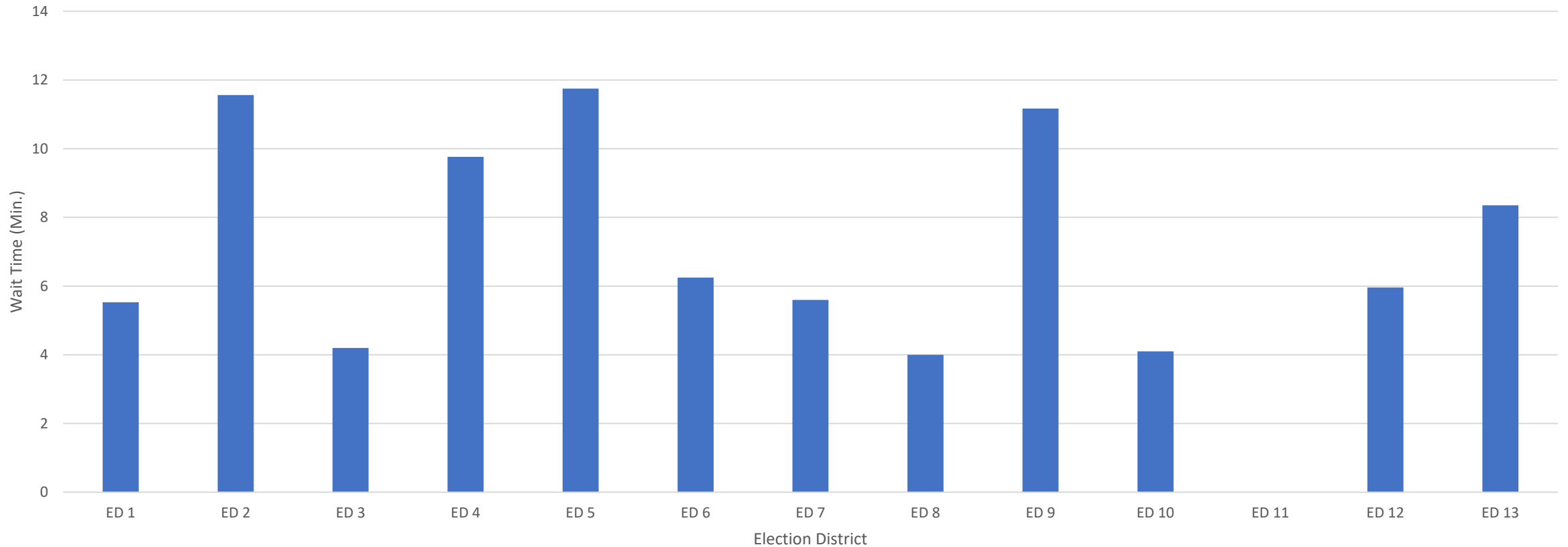


2024 PG - Election Day Provisional Maximum Wait Time



ED PROVISIONAL WAIT TIME BY ELECTION DISTRICT

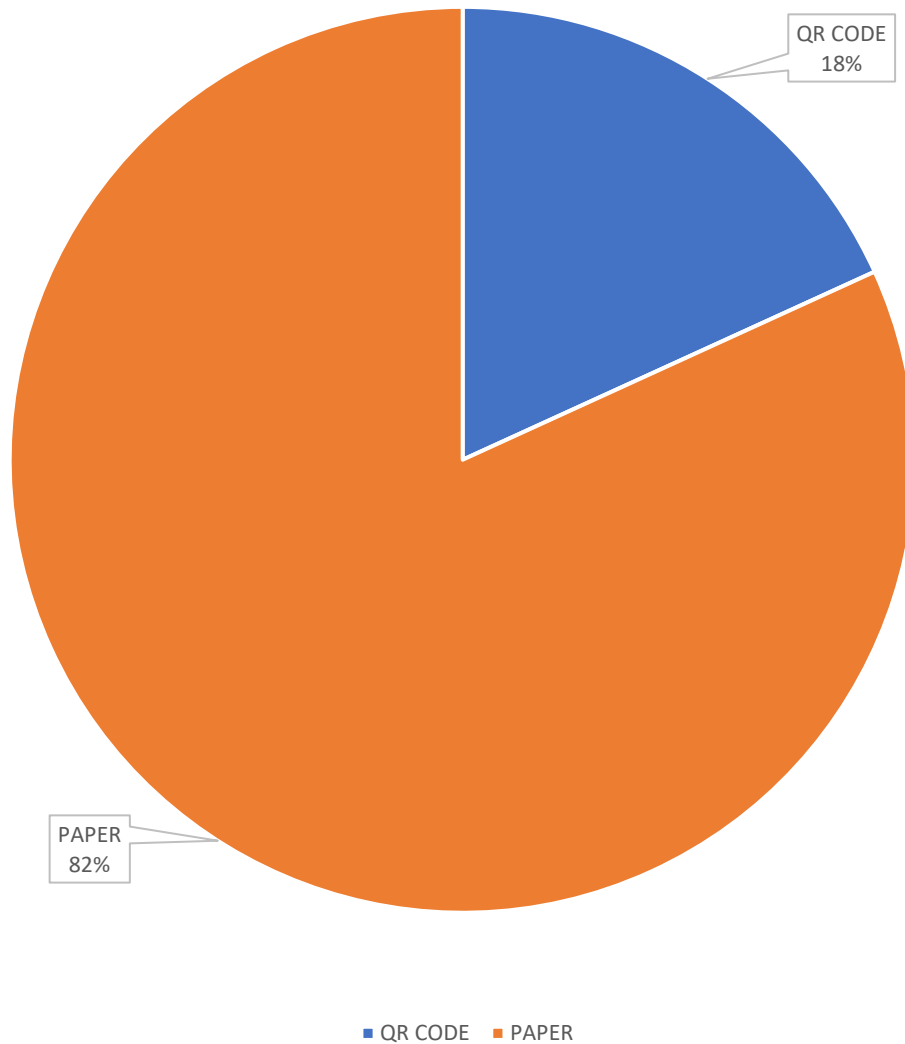

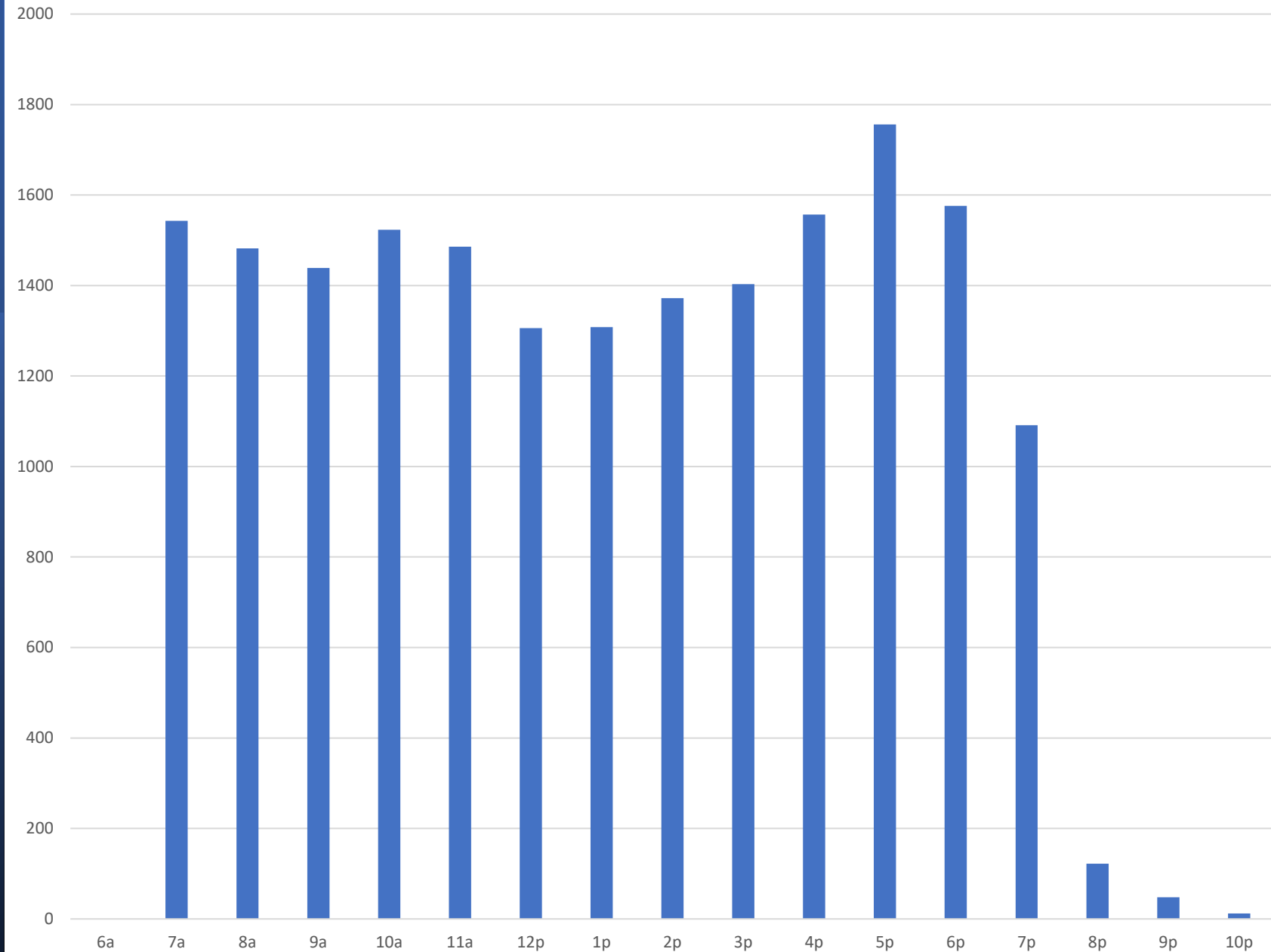

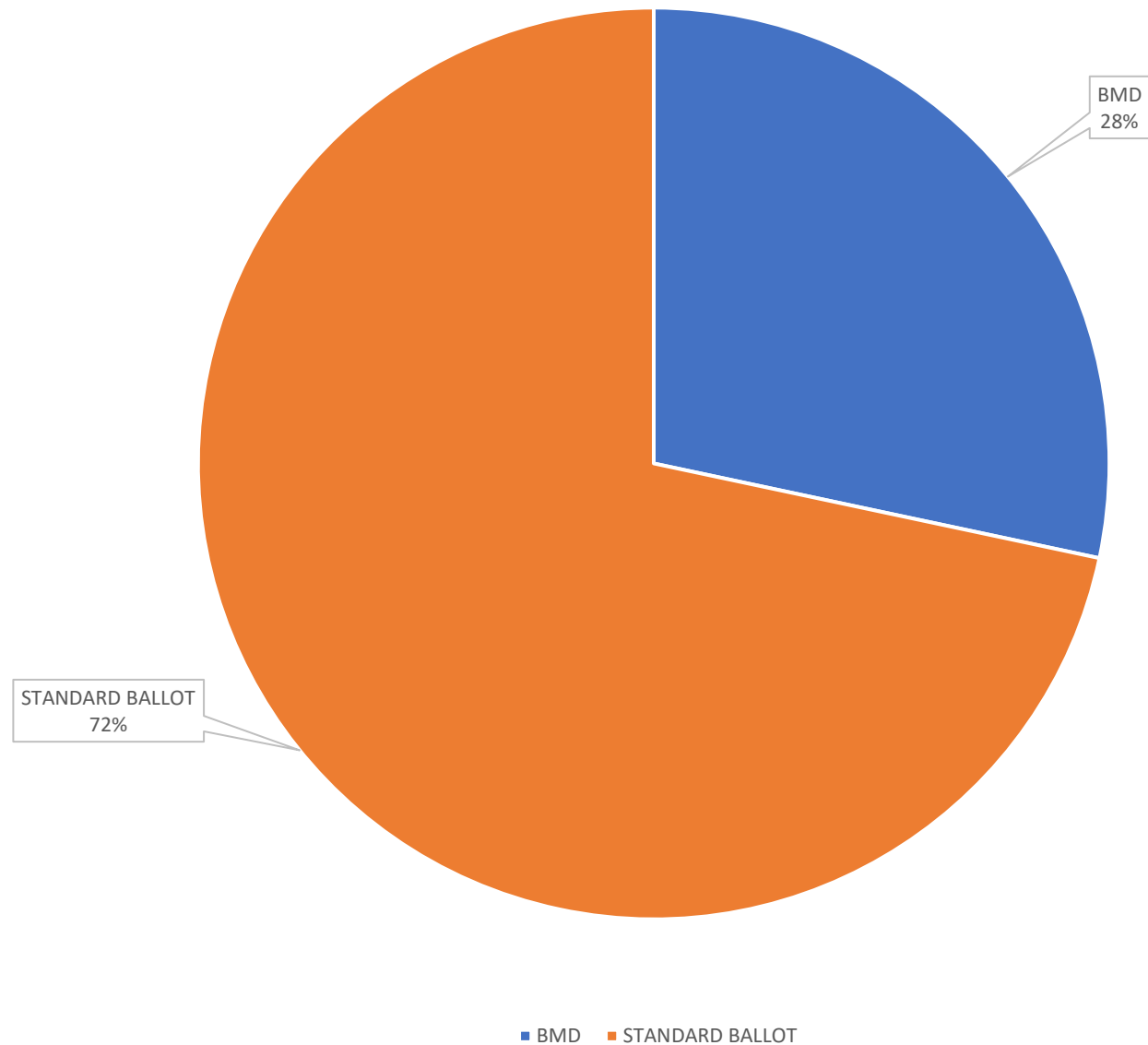

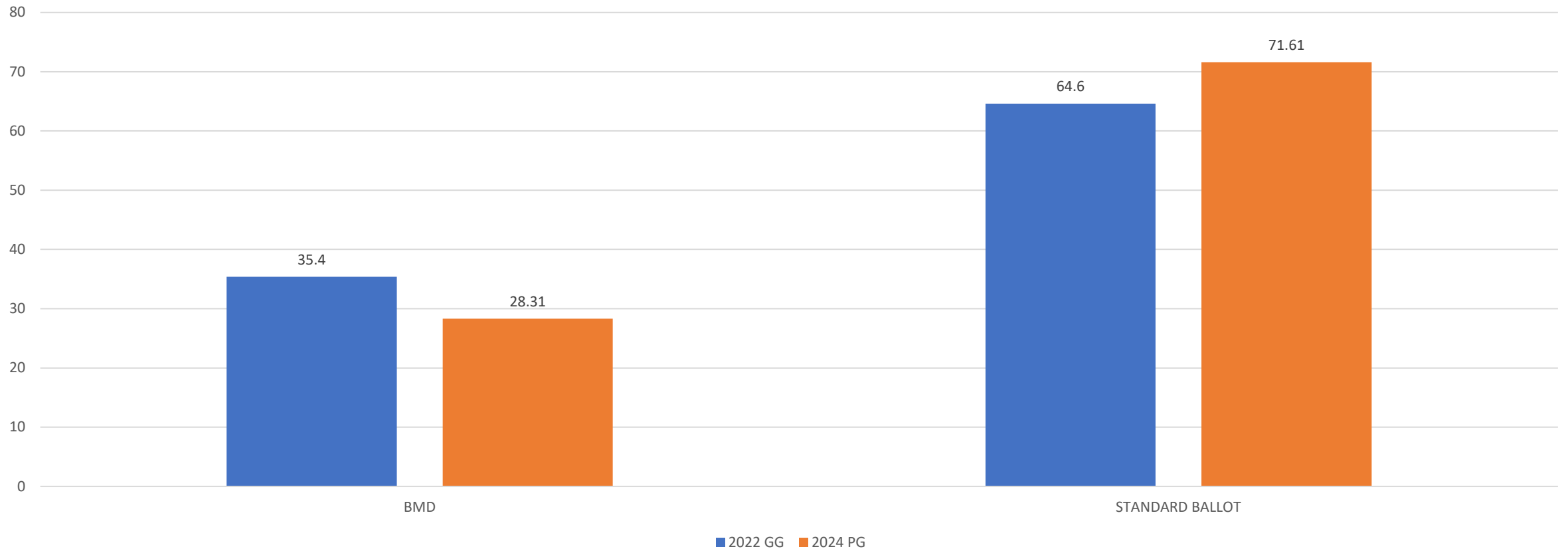

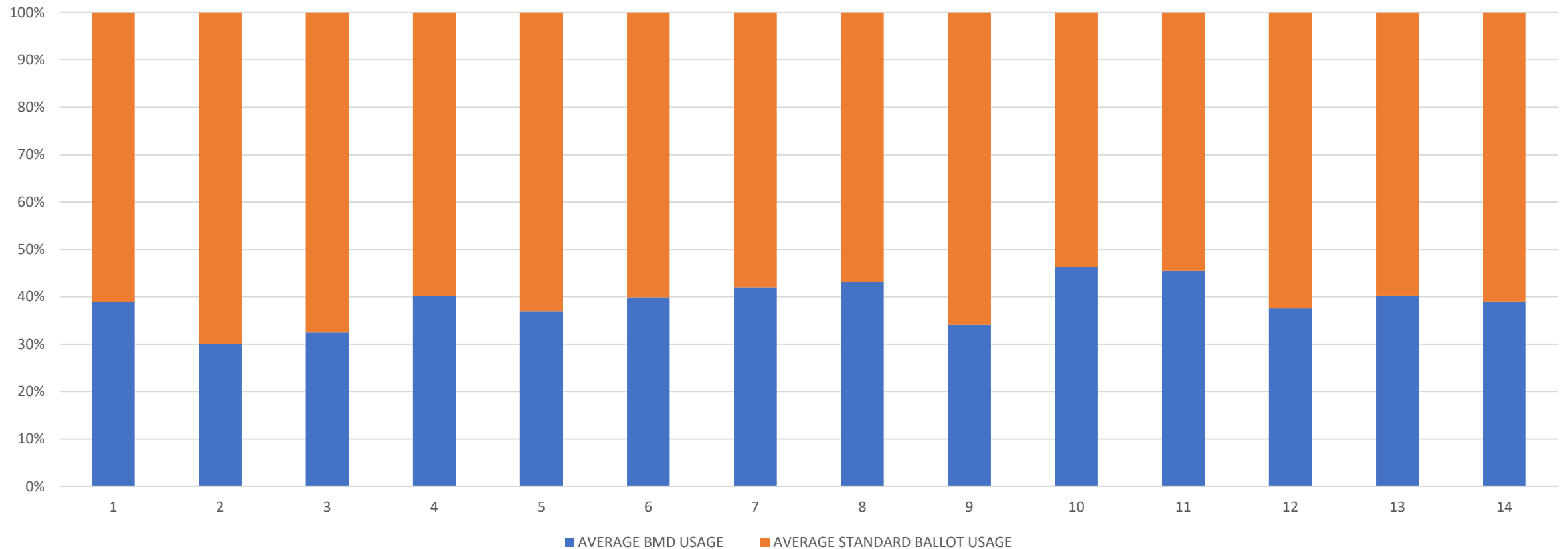

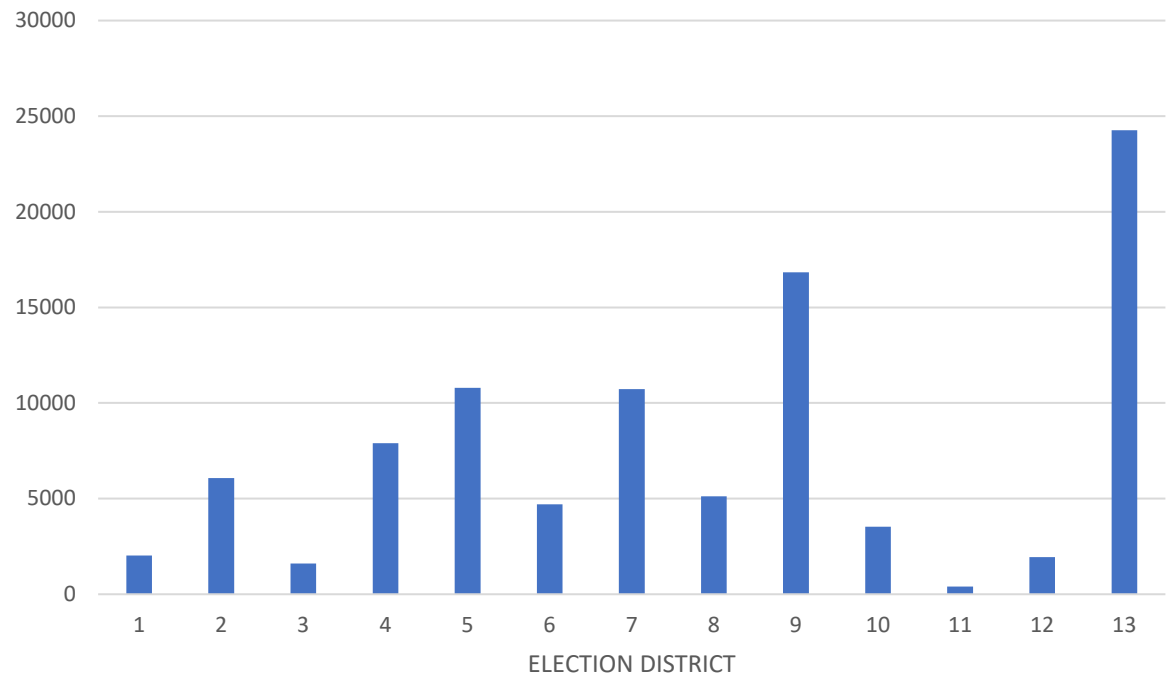

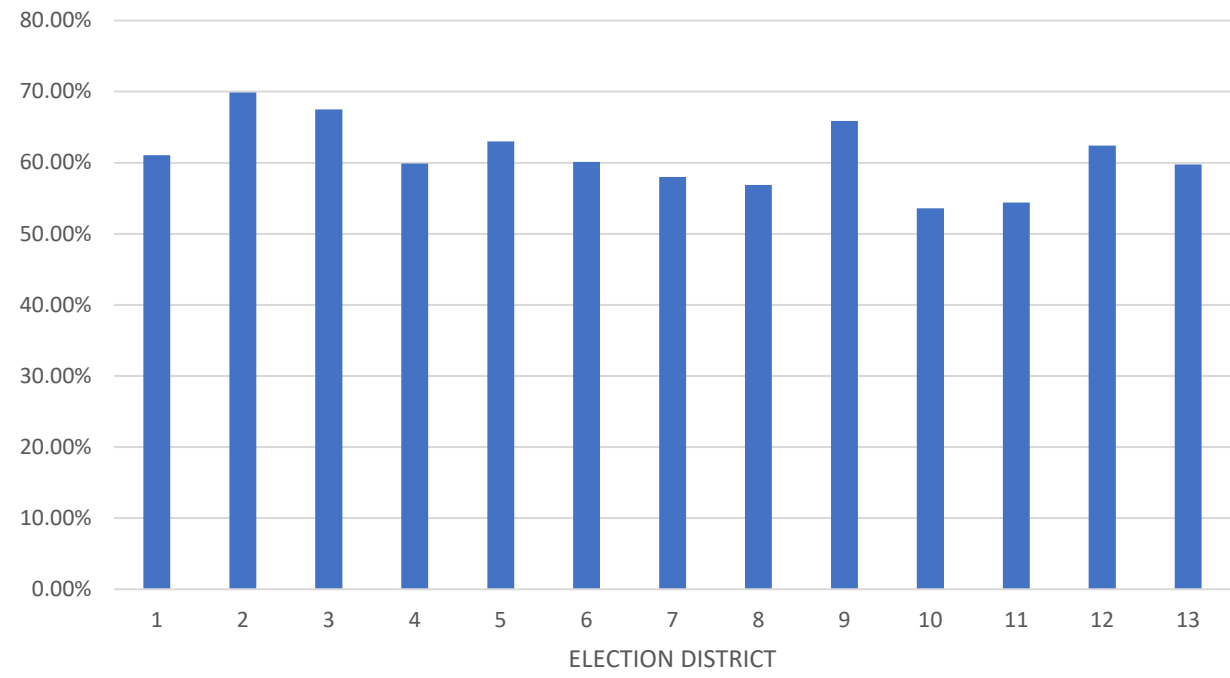


STANDARD BALLOT USAGE BY ELECTION DISTRICT

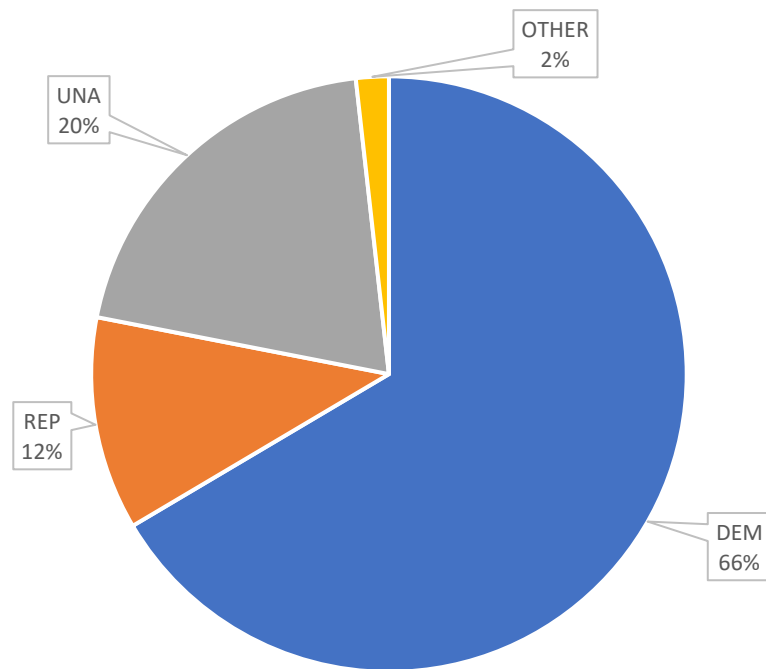

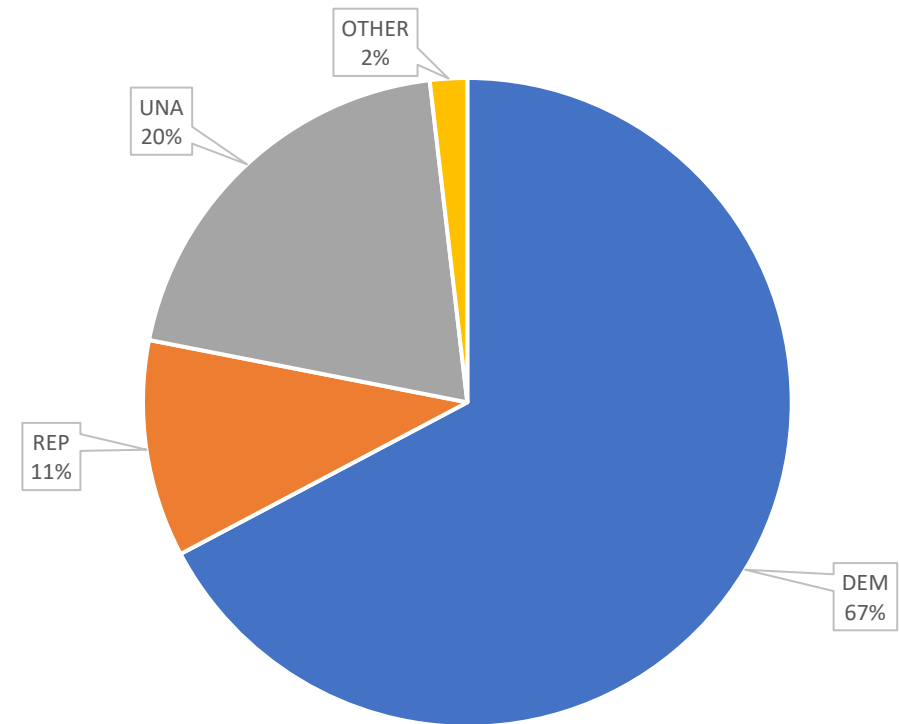

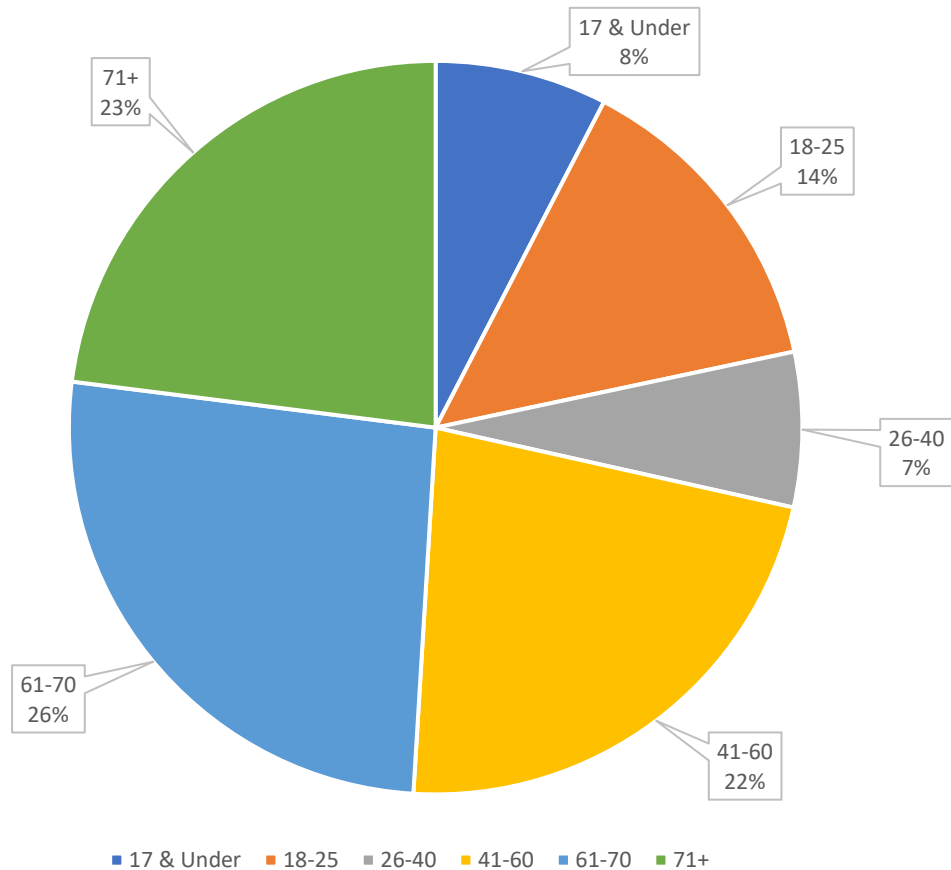

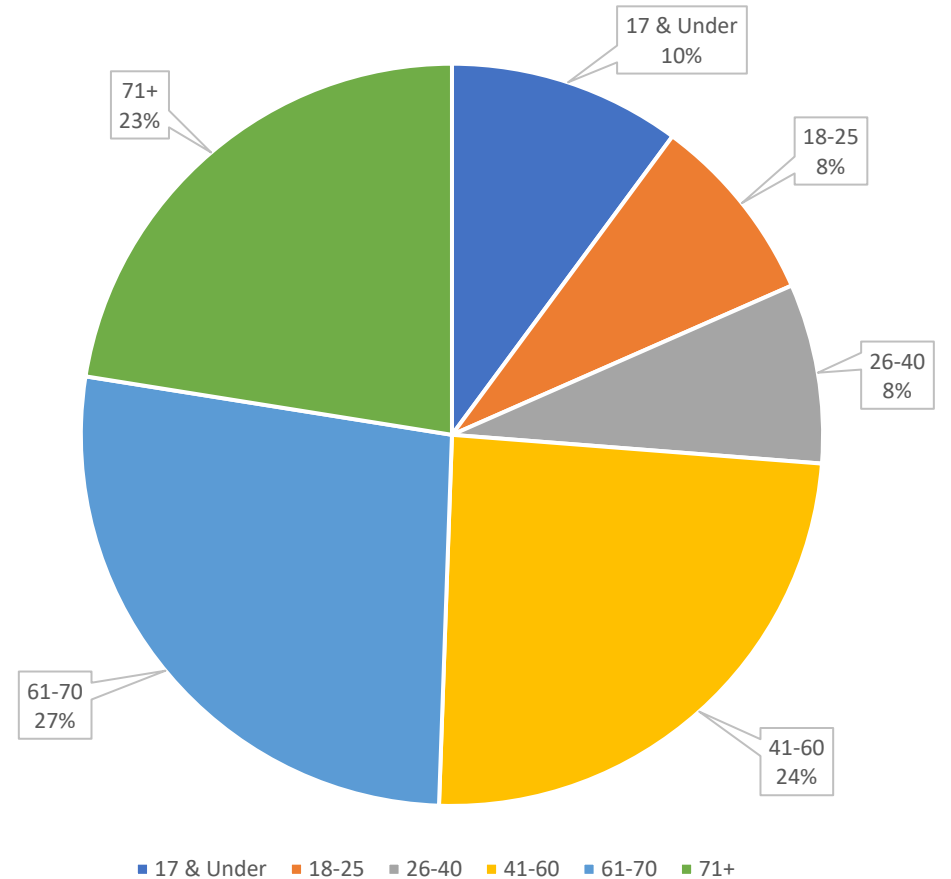

2024 PP - Election Judges - Age Distribution

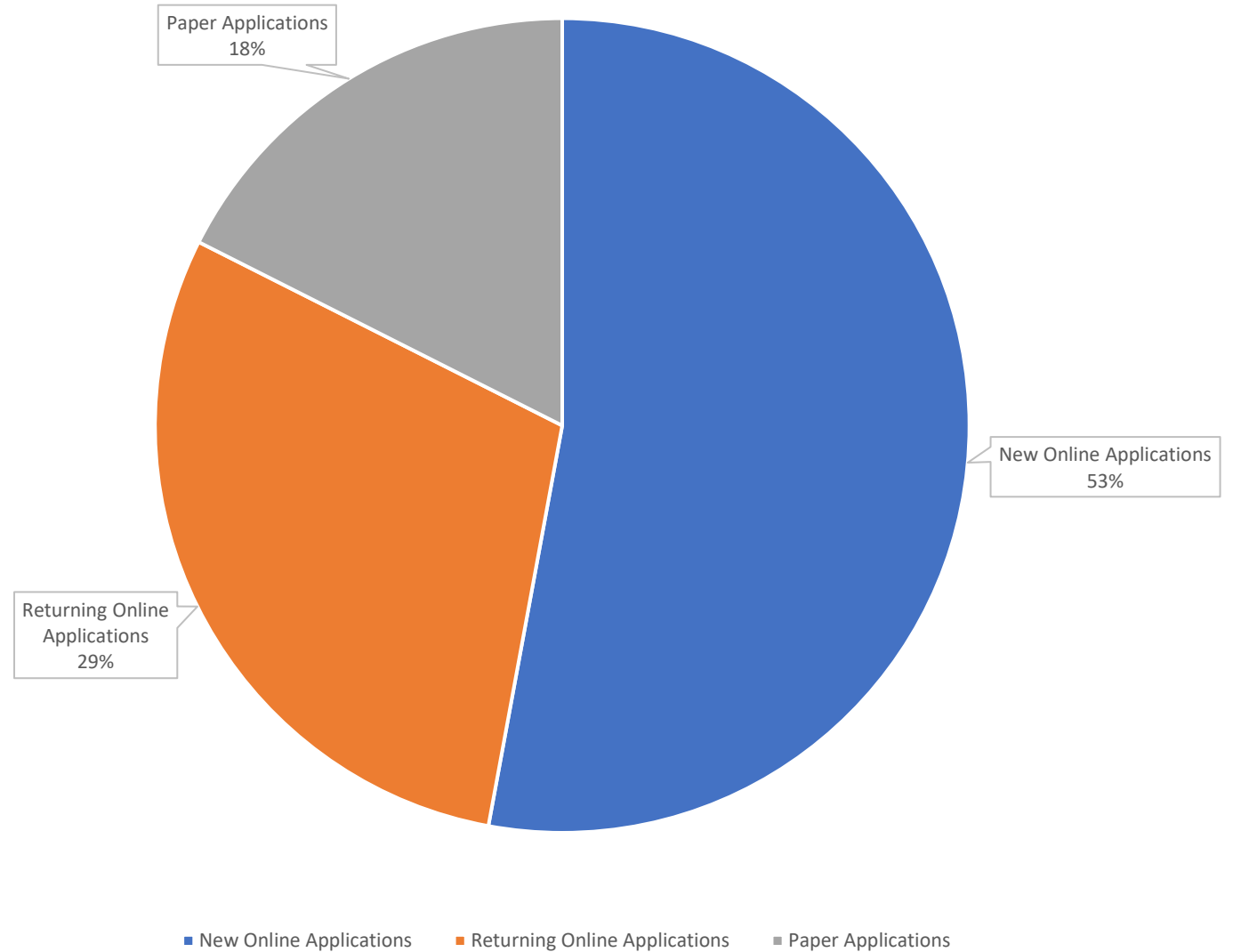


2024 PG - Election Workers Age Distribution

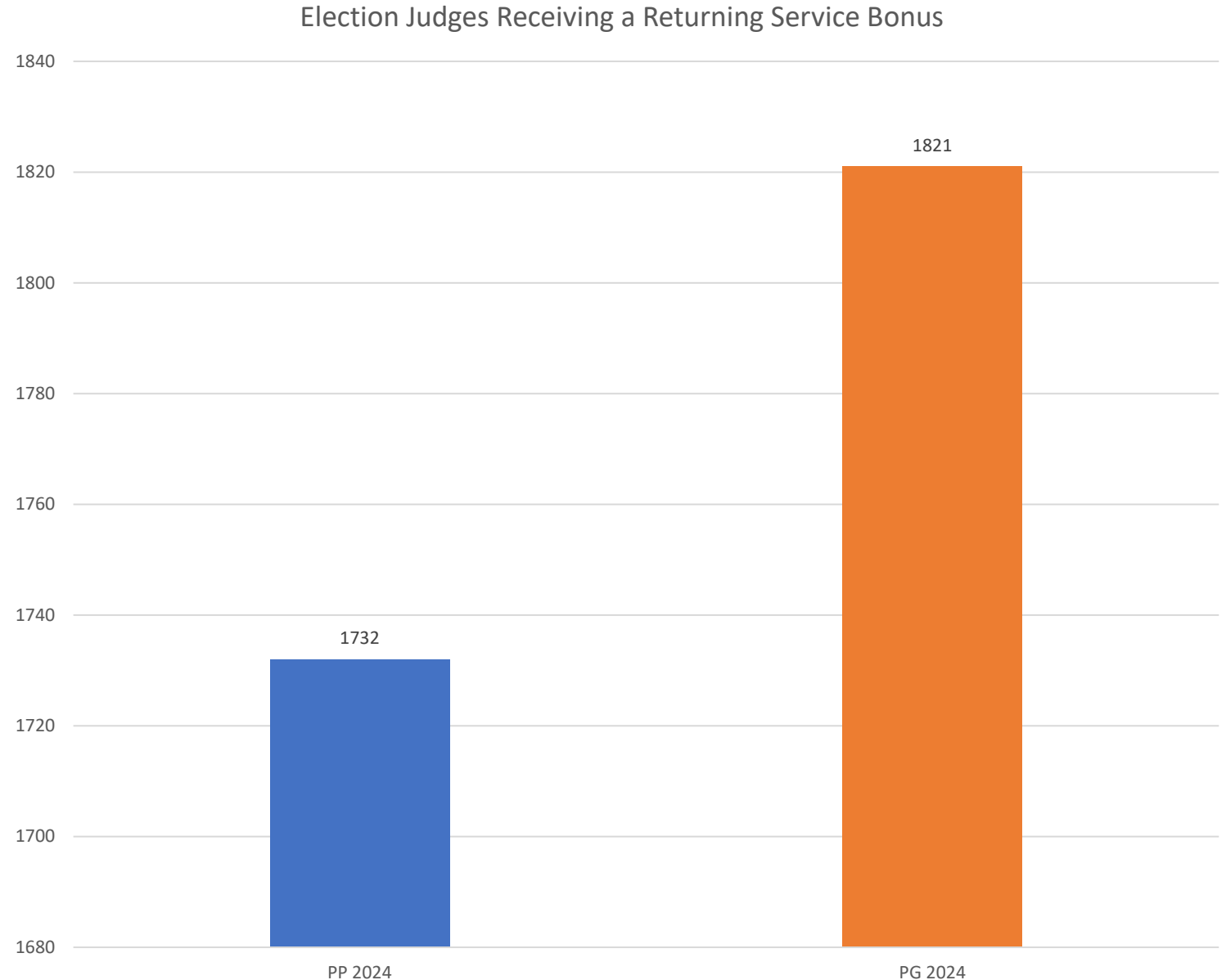





For this election, Montgomery County used seven regional sites. Six of the sites were located throughout the county and the Board of Elections Office in Gaithersburg was the main site.



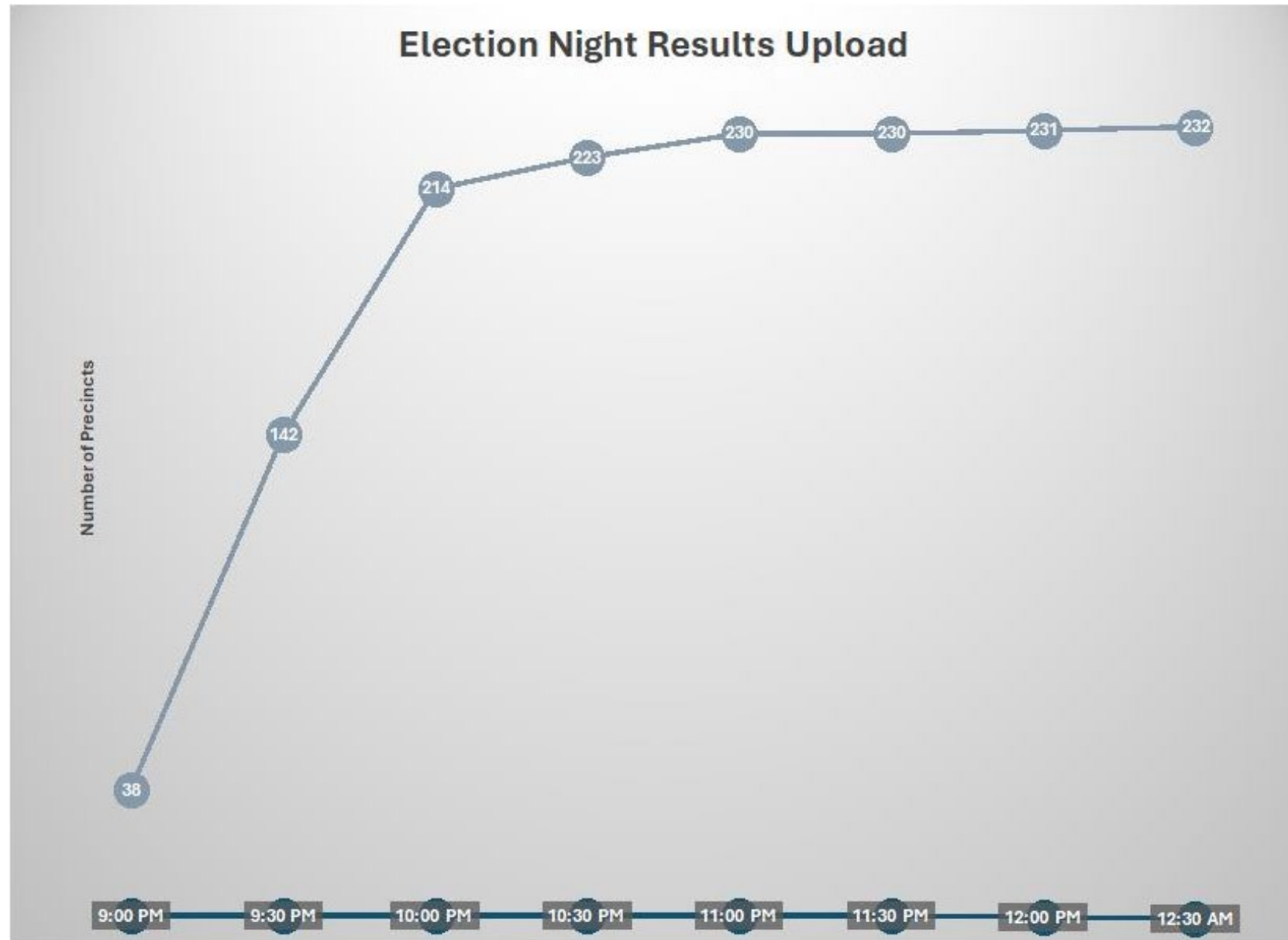
By 11:00 PM, 99.14% of the Election Day results were received and uploaded which is equivalent to 230 out of 232 precincts.
