## **MEDIA GUIDELINES**

The Montgomery County Board of Elections provides this set of guidelines to ensure the orderly conduct of elections, and to protect the rights of voters and candidates alike. Although the guidelines may seem elementary, we ask that you observe them closely. If you have any questions, or require additional information, please call Marjorie Roher at 240-777-8625.

### **Guidelines for Covering Activity at a Polling Place**

- Contact Marjorie Roher, at 240-777-8625, at least 72 hours in advance of your Early Voting or Election Day coverage to arrange for media credentials.
- Upon entering the voting area, contact one of the Chief Judges, located at the Voter Assistance table. These persons have supervisory authority in the polling place and are the individuals to whom you should make your presence known. Be prepared to present your media credentials.
- Do not converse with any voter in the voting area.
- Although you may take pictures in the polling place during voting hours, you must first confer with the Chief Judge regarding camera placement, lighting, etc.
- Do not disrupt the voting process or the work of the polling place staff.
- Do not in any way compromise or endanger the secrecy of a voter's ballot (e.g., taking a picture in such a way as to show how a ballot was voted).
- Your presence in the polling place is authorized for media coverage only. Please leave promptly after completing your work.

### **Guidelines for Exit Polling**

- Pollsters are not permitted in the voting room.
- Pollsters are not permitted to ask questions of a voter until the voter has left the voting room.
- Pollsters must inform the voters that their participation in the poll is voluntary.
- Pollsters are not permitted to electioneer. Therefore, the electioneering limits set forth in Section 16-206(b)(2) of the Election Law do not apply.

### Who Is Authorized to Be Present in the Polling Place?

Under the Election Code, the following individuals (and ONLY the following individuals) are permitted access to the voting room at a polling place:

- A voter;
- An individual who accompanies a voter in need of assistance;
- An individual under the age of 18 who accompanies a voter;
- Members of the polling place staff;
- Members or representatives of the State Board of Elections or the county board of elections;
- Any accredited challenger/watcher (see below); and
- Any other individual authorized by the State Board of Elections or the county board of elections.

The State Board's regulations give express permission to representatives of the print and electronic media to be present in a polling place, and to use cameras there, as long as their activities do not cause disruption, infringe on voter privacy, inhibit election judges from performing their duties, or otherwise interfere with the orderly conduct of the election. Cell phones, pagers, or other audible electronic devices may not be used in a polling place by anyone (including a representative of the media) other than an election official or law enforcement officer acting in an official capacity.

State Board regulations also permit members of the media or others to conduct exit polling, whether by questionnaire or interview, within the "no electioneering" zone outside a polling place, as long as pollsters do not enter the voting room, do not ask questions of a voter until the voter has left the voting room, tell each voter being surveyed that the voter's participation is voluntary, and do not electioneer.

### Challengers/Watchers

The Election Code specifically authorizes the State and local election boards, candidates, recognized political parties, and other groups supporting or opposing a candidate or question on the ballot to designate registered voters as challengers or watchers. The board, candidate, party, or group designating a challenger or watcher must accredit the challenger/watcher by signing a certification form provided by the State Board of Elections. An accreditation certificate must bear the signature of an authorized officer of the designating authority, but the signature need not be an original. If the election judges have any question about the accreditation of a challenger/watcher, the chief judge should contact the local election director to perform any verification; meanwhile, the individual should be permitted to remain in the polling place.

It has been the practice to permit any candidate or party to designate more than one challenger/watcher for a particular polling place. The election judges retain ultimate authority, however, to limit the number of challengers/watchers as necessary to assure the orderly flow of election business. When imposing a limit, election judges should be careful to restrict all candidates, parties, and other groups equally.

A challenger or watcher has the right to:

- Enter the polling place more than 30 minutes before the polls open;
- Be present in the polling place whenever the polls are open;
- Be positioned near the election judges so that he/she may see and hear each person who appears to vote;
- Remain in the polling place after the polls close, until the election judges leave;
- Maintain a list of registered voters who have voted and take the list outside the polling place; and
- Enter and leave the polling place to take out information that indicates registered voters who have cast ballots.

Challengers/watchers are expressly prohibited from:

- Ascertaining how a voter voted or intends to vote;
- Conversing in the polling place with any voter;
- Assisting any voter in voting; or
- Physically handling any original election document;
- Interfering with the duties of the Election Judge.

If a challenger or watcher violates any of these prohibitions, an election judge may eject the challenger/watcher from the polling place. A challenger/watcher may challenge the right of any person to vote, but only on the grounds that the challenged individual is not the registered voter he or she claims to be. The challenger must be prepared to state, under oath, a reason for believing that the particular voter is claiming a false identify. The challenger/watcher may NOT routinely question voters.

If you do not have a *Challenger and Watcher Certificate*, you are considered a "non-accredited challenger and watcher." Non-accredited challengers and watchers are permitted in a polling place for one purpose – to challenge an individual voter's right to vote. The **only** ground on which a challenge can be made is a challenge to the voter's identity (*i.e.*, that the voter is not who he or she says he or she is). Once the challenged voter shows ID or you and the challenged voter complete the required paperwork, you must leave the polling place.

If the individual does not present one of the forms of ID, the chief judge will:

- Require you to provide, in writing and under penalty of perjury, the reason for the challenge (see Appendix B for the *Affidavit for Challenger and Challenged Voter*);
- Offer the challenged voter the opportunity to cast a provisional ballot and submit a signed statement, witnessed by the election judge, of his or her identity; and
- Submit to the local board of elections the provisional ballot and other materials related to the challenge.

During the provisional ballot canvass (held on the second Wednesday after the election), the local board of canvassers will determine, based on the information submitted by you and the challenged voter, whether the voter is whom he or she claims to be and is otherwise qualified to vote. The voter is permitted to submit identification in accordance to regulations to respond to the identity challenge for the Provisional Canvass.

As a member of the media, or as a challenger and watcher, you do **not** have the right to challenge an act of an election judge. If, however, you are certain that an election judge either improperly performed a task or neglected to perform a required task, you should notify the local board of elections or follow the instructions provided by the individual or entity who designated you as a challenger and watcher.

**SUBJECT:** EXIT POLLING

**EXIT POLLING** is permitted at Maryland polling places under the following conditions:

1. Pollsters are not permitted in the voting room.
2. Pollsters are not permitted to ask questions of a voter until the voter has left the voting room.
3. Pollsters must inform the voters that their participation in the poll is voluntary.
4. Pollsters are not permitted to electioneer.
5. Pollsters therefore are not subject to the electioneering limits set forth in the Election Law Article, Section 16-206.

## ELECTION OBSERVER GUIDELINES

The purpose of an Election Observer is to provide an avenue for public observation and input into the election process. By promoting public participation, it ensures integrity and voter confidence in the electoral process.

## ELECTION NIGHT OBSERVERS

### CHECK IN PROCEDURES

1. All observers must contact Marjorie Roher, at 240-777-8625, in advance if they plan to visit the Board of Elections on election night. **All observers must arrive at the Board of Elections no later than 7:30 p.m. as traffic flow will prohibit access later in the evening. Access to the building is ONLY via Game Preserve Road; observers must turn on Game Preserve Road and follow the direction of Police and Security Officers. Please tell them you are here to observe the returns and they direct you accordingly. Observers must park on the south side of the building, in front of Suite 210. Parking on the north side of the building is prohibited.**
2. Upon arrival, they must sign in at the reception desk located at 18753 N. Frederick Avenue, Suite 210, Gaithersburg, MD 20879.
3. Observers will be escorted to a viewing area and, when ready to leave, will be escorted back to the reception desk.

### GENERAL RULES

1. No observer shall interfere with the orderly processing of Election Day supplies.
2. Observers will be permitted access to a designated observation area(s), sufficiently close to enable them to observe established procedures.
3. On election night radios, cameras, cell phones, blackberries or other forms of PDAs, and tape recorders are allowed in the observation area only. Additionally, pagers and cellular phones must be set to vibrate or off mode while observing the canvass.
4. Backpacks, briefcases, and large purses are allowed in the observation room on election night.

5. The individual's function is to observe that procedures are followed. Observers cannot assist in operations or handle any election related materials.
6. All questions concerning a procedure must be directed to a Board Representative or the Public Information Officer.
7. The number of observers may be limited so as not to interfere with the process. Observers must avoid physical contact with employees.
8. Operations will continue as scheduled whether or not an observer is present.
9. Observers must remain in the area they were assigned. If you are found unsupervised in an area that you were not assigned, you will be escorted from the building.

## **CANVASS OBSERVERS**

The vote by mail and provisional ballots are counted during special canvass sessions held during the weeks following the election. The results of the canvasses are then included with the Election Day totals and released as the official election results. The canvasses, which are open to the public, begin at 10 a.m. and are held at the Montgomery County Board of Elections, 18753 N. Frederick Avenue, Suite 105, in Gaithersburg. Canvasses for the 2016 Presidential Primary Election begin on: Absentee Canvass I, April 28; Provisional Canvass, May 4; and Absentee Canvass II, May 6. Canvasses for the 2016 Presidential General Election begin on: Absentee Canvass I, November 10; Provisional Canvass, November 16; and Absentee Canvass II, November 18.

### **CHECK IN PROCEDURES**

1. All observers must report and sign in at the reception desk located at 18753 N. Frederick Avenue, Suite 105, Gaithersburg, MD 20879.
2. Observers will be escorted to a viewing area and, when ready to leave, will be escorted back to the reception desk where they will return their issued badge.

### **GENERAL RULES**

1. No observer shall interfere with the orderly processing of vote by mail or provisional ballots, including touching or handling of the ballots or envelopes.
2. Observers will be permitted access to a designated observation area(s), sufficiently close to enable them to observe established procedures.
3. During the canvass period, radios, cameras, cell phones, blackberries or other forms of PDAs and pagers are **NOT PERMITTED**.

4. The individual's function is to observe that procedures are followed. Observers cannot assist in operations or handle any election related materials.
5. All questions concerning a procedure must be directed to Board Counsel or the Public Information Officer. No communication between canvass workers and observers will be allowed regardless of the topic. If you are seen communicating directly with a canvass worker, you will be asked to leave.
6. The number of observers may be limited so as not to interfere with the process. Observers must avoid physical contact with employees.
7. Observers will be allowed into the observation area only after employees are present.
8. Operations will continue as scheduled whether or not an observer is present.
9. Observers must remain in the area they were assigned. If you are found unsupervised in an area that you were not assigned, you will be escorted from the building.
10. **No food or drinks will be allowed in the canvass area around any ballots. We kindly ask observers to eat and drink at a local restaurant in our area during breaks.**

#### **HELPFUL HINTS FOR OBSERVERS**

1. Wear comfortable shoes as you may be standing for periods of time.
2. Please refrain from wearing strong perfume or aftershave while observing.
3. If staff can hear you breathe, back up, you're too close.

#### **BALLOT HANDLING CHALLENGES**

1. Observers shall be permitted to observe and challenge the manner in which the ballots are handled, from the processing of the ballot return envelopes through the counting and disposition of the ballots.
2. Observers may not challenge signatures on oaths.
3. Observers may challenge whether the individuals handling ballots are following established procedures.



## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How many registered voters are in Montgomery County?

As of September 9, 2016, there were 648,302 active registered voters.

Where will election results be released?

Early Voting results will be posted on the Board of Elections' website – [www.777vote.org](http://www.777vote.org) – on Election Day as soon after 8:00 p.m. as possible.

Election Day precinct results will be posted on the Board of Elections' website – [www.777vote.org](http://www.777vote.org) – beginning at 9:00 p.m. Final results will be posted following State certification. Statewide results are also available on the Maryland State Board of Elections' website - <http://elections.maryland.gov>.

A viewing center for the media has been established at the Board of Elections' office at 18753 N. Frederick Avenue, Suite 210, in Gaithersburg. Interested persons should contact Marjorie Roher at 240-777-8625 for additional information and instruction.

How do I arrange to interview a Board Member or representative of the Board of Elections?

Election Day interviews are scheduled upon request. For specific media locations, or to arrange for an interview on Election Day, please contact Marjorie Roher at 240-777-8625 at least 72 hours prior to Election Day.

May I take photographs inside the polling place?

Yes. You must check in with the Chief Election Judge and follow all regulations provided in the "**Media Guidelines**" section of this manual. You may **NOT** take close up shots showing how a voter is registering his vote. Photographs may only be taken from a distance and, at no time, are you allowed to interfere with the voting process.

May I conduct "man on the street" interviews in a polling place?

No. All interviews, unless prearranged by the Board of Elections, must be conducted outside of the polling place. Specific information is contained in the "**Media Guidelines**" section of this manual.

## WHAT'S NEW SINCE THE LAST PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION?



**NEW VOTING SYSTEM:** This year the State of Maryland is implementing a new, paper based, optical scan voting system. Voters will mark their selections with a pen on paper ballots prior to inserting them in an optical scanner for tabulation. For a list of upcoming outreach events, where the new system may be seen, visit our website at [www.777vote.org](http://www.777vote.org).

**SAME DAY VOTER REGISTRATION:** Did you miss the October 18 deadline to register to vote? During Early Voting you may register to vote the same day you vote. You must have a valid Maryland driver's license or MVA issued photo id and proof of residency to register. Once you register you will be issued a ballot. *This opportunity is NOT available on Election Day!* If you're still not registered and want to vote, visit an Early Voting Site between October 27 and November 3. You may not change your party affiliation at this time – only new registrants or current registrants who need to change their address may take advantage of this opportunity.

**EARLY VOTING:** In 2016 the Maryland Legislature increased the number of Early Voting locations in Montgomery County to ten. What is early voting? Early voting provides the voter with an opportunity to vote in advance of Election Day by visiting an Early Voting Center located in their jurisdiction. Voters may choose any of the ten Centers most convenient to their normal routine at which to vote. Votes cast during early voting are tabulated on Election Day and released as a separate total prior to the release of Election Day totals.

**On-Line Ballots:** You may now choose how you want to receive your vote by mail ballot. Election officials can mail or fax your ballot to you, or you may download your ballot from the States' website at [http://elections.maryland.gov/voting/documents/2014\\_Absentee\\_Ballot\\_Application\\_English.pdf](http://elections.maryland.gov/voting/documents/2014_Absentee_Ballot_Application_English.pdf).

When you request a ballot, you pick how you want to receive your ballot. If you want to download it, make sure you provide your email address.

Ballots are sent or posted to the website approximately three weeks before an election. If you want to download your ballot, we will send you an email when your ballot is ready. The email will include your ballot tracking number and a link where you can print your ballot and instructions for completing it and returning it to the Board of Elections. You must enter the ballot tracking number to access your absentee ballot. Once your ballot is completed, it shall be mailed or hand delivered to the Board of Elections.

**Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting:** The State Board of Elections (SBE) is now the single point of contact for all voters covered under the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA). This includes all voters who are members of the military and their dependents as well as all voters who will be out of the USA and who wish to vote a vote by mail ballot. ## ABSENTEE BALLOT INFORMATION (HOW TO, TRENDS, COUNTING)



**An Interesting History**.....Absentee (or voting by mail) voting goes back a long way. In fact it all began during the Civil War when the first absentee ballots were allowed by the North for the soldiers and sailors. Universal absentee voting began in 1978. Prior to 1978, absentee ballots were available only to the ill and disabled, those who lived too far from the polls and other special circumstances. As a result of the change in legislation allowing any person unable to vote in their polling place on Election Day to vote by mail, it has become a very popular means to cast a ballot. For the 2012 General Election 44,948 vote by mail ballots were requested and 38,938 vote by mail ballots were cast; for the 2014 General Election 17,127 vote by mail ballots were requested and 13,731 were cast.

Vote by mail ballots may be requested in one of three ways:

- By letter to the Montgomery Board of Elections, P.O. Box 10159, Rockville, MD 20849-10159;
- By downloading the absentee voting application from the Board's website, [www.777vote.org](http://www.777vote.org) and either mailing it to the P.O. Box listed above or faxing it to 240-777-8590; or
- In person at the Gaithersburg office – 18753 N. Frederick Avenue, Suite 210, Gaithersburg, Maryland 20879.

You may now also **choose how you want to receive your vote by mail ballot**. Election officials can mail or fax your ballot to you, or you may download your ballot from the States' website at

When you request a ballot, you pick how you want to receive your ballot. If you want to download the ballot, make sure you provide your email address. Ballots are sent or posted to the website approximately three weeks before an election. If you want to download your ballot, we will send you an email when your ballot is ready. The email will include your ballot tracking number and a link where you can print your ballot and instructions for completing it and returning it to the Board of Elections. You must enter the ballot tracking number to access your vote by mail ballot. Once your ballot is completed, it shall be mailed or hand delivered to the Board of Elections.

**The following provides a list of remedies if you apply for a vote by mail ballot and have not received it within a week after mailing your application:**

- Request a replacement vote by mail ballot be mailed;
- Vote at the Board of Elections during the absentee voting period (from 29 days prior to the election through election day);
- Vote at your neighborhood polling location.

Under special circumstances a voter may request an emergency vote by mail ballot from April 19 - 26, for the Primary Election, and November 1 - 8 for the General Election. The Board of Elections office will be open during the hours noted below. For additional information regarding this service, or any questions regarding vote by mail voting, you may call 240-777-8500 between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

## PROVISIONAL VOTING IN THE STATE OF MARYLAND



The Provisional Ballot is a safeguard to ensure that no individual who asserts that he or she is registered and eligible to vote is prevented from casting a ballot on Election Day. The Provisional Ballot is only counted after the local Board of Elections has reviewed the Provisional Ballot Application and made a determination that the individual is registered and eligible to vote. The Provisional Ballot is not an alternative to the electronic voting equipment. The voter must be eligible to receive a Provisional Ballot. A Provisional Ballot cast by a voter who is ineligible to vote provisionally will be rejected.

1. **Who Votes a Provisional Ballot?** A person who believes he/she is registered to vote in the State of Maryland and is eligible to vote.
2. **Which Provisional Ballots will be counted?** The Board of Canvassers confirms the person is a registered voter in the State of Maryland, is eligible to vote, and was
  - a. not listed on the Precinct Register, or
  - b. listed on the Precinct Register but indicated a change of address, or
  - c. listed on the Precinct Register but claims to have a different party affiliation (Primary Election only), or
  - d. listed in the Precinct Register as an Absentee Voter (ABS), or
  - e. listed in the Precinct Register as an Identification Required Voter (ID) and unable to provide valid or current Maryland identification to qualify for a regular electronic ballot, or
  - f. challenged on their right to vote.







Early voting starts October 27. Not sure where to vote or what choices will be on the ballot? Check your mail. If you are registered to vote, the Montgomery County Board of Elections is mailing you a personalized sample ballot, along with all of the information you will need to vote in the 2016 Presidential Election, depending on which political party you are registered with and where you live. Don't mistake it for junk mail - the sample ballot is an 8 ½ x 11 booklet and has information on Early Voting locations on the front cover and your Election Day polling place on the back cover.

Review your sample ballot carefully for the following information:

- The locations of the Montgomery County Early Voting Centers where you may choose to cast your ballot between October 27 and November 3;
- The location of your assigned polling place on Election Day – November 8;
- Instructions on how to use the new paper based, digital image scan voting system;
- Directions on how to review your choices prior to casting a ballot;
- Pictures of the actual ballot;

Take the time to carefully read this information so you are familiar with it before you get to your polling place. To facilitate the voting process, the Board of Elections encourages you to mark your sample ballot in advance and take it with you – it saves you time.

The County's Early Voting Centers will be open from Thursday, October 27 through Thursday, November 3, from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. During Early Voting, the Board of Elections encourages voters to visit our website – [www.777vote.org](http://www.777vote.org) – to view the wait time scroll bar and for voting locations and information.

On Election Day, November 8, many people will vote during the peak hours, you may want to avoid voting during these hours: 7 a.m. to 9 a.m., 11 a.m. to 2 p.m., and 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. To avoid the longest lines you may want to vote outside of these hours.

### WHAT IS AN ELECTION JUDGE?

An election worker is a registered Maryland voter who volunteers to assist voters on Election Day. The role of an election worker is to ensure fair and accessible elections for all voters and to protect the integrity of the election process. In accordance with Federal and State law, they must perform all of the duties assigned by the local Board of Elections and perform their duties faithfully, diligently, and without partiality or prejudice.

An election worker who serves in the polling place is a very important part of the electoral process. This individual is the point of contact between the Board of Elections and the general public during voting hours. He/She is responsible for administering the actual voting procedures in each precinct and making sure that the voters have a positive voting experience. Without these individuals, it would be impossible to conduct successful elections.

**QUALIFICATIONS:**

- Be a registered voter in Maryland
- Clearly and fluently speak, read and legibly write the English language
- Under Maryland law, an election worker may not hold or be a candidate for any elective public or political party office or any office created under the Constitution or Laws of the State and may not serve as a campaign manager for a candidate or as the treasurer for a campaign finance entity.
- Be able to work the hours required for the position selected
- Lift approximately 50 pounds with assistance
- Successfully complete Stage One (online) and Stage Two (hands-on) training
- Deal courteously and patiently with the public and coworkers
- Attend a mandatory meeting on the Monday evening prior to each election at the assigned polling precinct

**ADA STATEMENT**

The Montgomery County Board of Elections is sensitive to the needs of individuals with disabilities and the elderly who wish to serve as election workers and participate in the election process. Upon request reasonable accommodation will be made by the Board of Elections to facilitate opportunities for training and service.

All election workers in the service of the Board of Elections must be sensitive to the needs of voters with disabilities and the elderly. Reasonable accommodations will be made to assist these voters so as to enable them to vote.

**BILINGUAL ELECTION WORKERS AND THE VOTING RIGHTS ACT**

On August 11, 2001 the US Department of Justice informed the Montgomery County Board of Elections of its legal obligation to implement Section 203 of the 1975 Voters Rights Act, which requires that all materials related to voting and Election Day activities be prepared in both English and Spanish to allow citizens to effectively participate in the political process. Determinations are based on data from the most recent Census, and the determinations are made by the Director of the Census.

Voters with Spanish speaking fluency are especially needed because the county places election workers who are fluent in Spanish at every polling place in accordance with the requirements of Section 203 of the 1975 Voting Rights Act. Bilingual workers are needed for Early Voting and Election Day.

The Election Law of Maryland requires that election workers must be registered to vote in the State of Maryland, 17 years of age or older, and a U.S. citizen. Bilingual workers must also be able to speak, read, and write in English. All election workers will be compensated for training and for Election Day service.

On July 27, 2006, President George W. Bush signed legislation which extended the Voting Rights Act to 2031, reaffirming Congress' belief that all men/women

are created equal by outlawing racist voting practices and beliefs. Concerns with this legislation should be addressed to your federal representative. A synopsis of Section 203 as developed by the U.S. Department of Justice can be reviewed at the following link ( [here](#) ).

### **ELECTION JUDGE CODE OF CONDUCT**

To ensure that Montgomery County citizens are provided with the best election experience, we ask that everyone adhere to the Election Worker Code of Conduct (COC) which governs individual responsibilities and polling place behavior. Violation of one or more of the codes of conduct may result in removal from the Montgomery County Election Worker program. The Code of Conduct is available online and will be reviewed in training.

### **TRAINING**

Maryland law requires all registered voters who desire to become an election worker to attend a training session as a condition of appointment. Training is conducted online and in-person for those serving on Election Day. Separate training sessions are held for workers selected to work Early Voting. Applicants are required to pass BOTH a written and hands on training in order to serve. In person, hands-on training sessions are held primarily at the Board's offices but may be offered at other locations in the county.

It is necessary to review the laws and procedures that govern elections each year. Each year the General Assembly of Maryland passes legislation that changes the way elections are conducted. An accurately informed and properly trained worker decreases the possibility of errors in the operation of a precinct on Election Day. ( *See Training for more information* )



# VOTÉ

In 1992 federal legislation (Public Law 102-344) passed extending the minority language provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965. Any county with more than 10,000 residents whose native language is not English and who indicated on their U.S. census form a lack of proficiency in English is required to provide election materials in the identified languages. In Montgomery County these language requirements extend to Spanish.

Our department's website has been expanded to include information on voting and voter services for persons requiring assistance in Spanish (the language mandated for translation in compliance with the U.S. Voting Rights Act).

**Board of Elections Launches Recruitment for the “Future Vote” Program**

The Montgomery County Board of Elections is seeking school-age students, grades 6-12, to participate in its “Future Vote” Program. Future Vote students will serve as Election Day student aides during the 2016 Presidential General Election on Tuesday, November 8. There are also opportunities for students to assist the Board of Elections with a variety of activities before Election Day.

Students and their guardians must attend mandatory training to participate in the Future Vote Program and, if applicable, students will receive Student Service Learning (SSL) credits. Most students work in precincts near their home. This initiative combines civic participation and the opportunity to observe democracy in action.

The Future Vote Program is available to all Montgomery County students within public, private, independent, religious or home-schools. U.S. citizenship is not a pre-requisite and students with bilingual and American Sign Language skills are encouraged to apply.

In the 2012 Presidential Election, more than two thousand Montgomery County students participated in the Future Vote Program, including 473 students with bilingual skills and 15 students who were available at polling places to assist voters using American Sign Language.

## ELECTION DAY/NIGHT

### SPEED OF BALLOT COUNTING ELECTION NIGHT - HISTORICAL TRENDS

Early Voting results will be posted on the Board of Elections' website – [www.777vote.org](http://www.777vote.org) – on Election Day as soon after 8:00 p.m. as possible.

Montgomery County tabulates the vote using the State of Maryland certified voting system. There is tabulation at each precinct. The implementation of the new paper based, digital image scan voting system was mandated by an Act of the Maryland Legislature. Early Voting results will be posted on Election Day as soon after 8:00 p.m. as possible. The first Election Day results will be posted at 9:00 p.m. with results posted every 20 minutes until all results have been received at the Board's Office.

### HOW DO THE BALLOTS GET TO GAITHERSBURG?

On election night, ballots from all voting precincts are transmitted to the Board's headquarters in Gaithersburg for tabulation.

- After the polls close at 8 p.m., the poll worker teams must close down the optical scan tabulation unit and deliver the flash drive containing the results to a regional tabulation site which will transmit the results to the local Board of Elections. Precinct officials will return all critical supplies to Board of Elections, usually arriving between 9:30 p.m. and 12:30 a.m.

Thousands of dedicated individuals are involved in ballot transport, preparation and tabulation. We appreciate the massive effort undertaken by our staff, our poll workers and our polling place hosts!

### INCOMPLETE TABULATION

There are two categories of ballots which cannot be processed on Election Night:

- Vote by mail (absentee) ballots
- Provisional ballots voted at the polls

## **VOTE BY MAIL (ABSENTEE) BALLOTS**

State law requires vote by mail ballot tabulation to begin on the Thursday after the election. All vote by mail ballots must be pre-processed before they are counted – this includes verifying every absentee voter prior to opening the absentee ballot envelopes to remove the ballots in preparation for the counting.

Paper ballot counting will take place at 10:00 a.m. every day beginning the first Thursday following the election. Therefore, the first optical scan count will be held on Thursday, April 28 (Primary) and November 10 (General) at 10:00 a.m. with our goal to have the majority of absentee ballots tabulated by Tuesday, May 3 (Primary) and Tuesday, November 15 (General). Absentee ballots are accepted through 10 a.m. on May 6, when the second Absentee Canvass convenes; ballots must be postmarked or received at the Board of Elections, no later than 8 p.m. on Election Day, April 26, in order to be counted. However, due to the extra research required to validate provisional ballots, these ballots are usually the last to be tallied prior to the completion of the official canvass.

## **PROVISIONAL BALLOTS**

Provisional ballots are voted at the polls when a voter's registration is in question, or when our records indicate the voter was already sent an absentee ballot. Provisional ballots are sealed in special envelopes at the polls and must be individually researched and verified at the Board's Office before ballots are counted or rejected in accordance with election laws. Provisional ballot counting will take place at 10:00 a.m. every day beginning the second Wednesday following the election. Therefore, the count will be held on Wednesday, May 4 (Primary) and Wednesday, November 16 (General).

We realize it is difficult for candidates/campaigns involved in close races to wait days and sometimes weeks to know whether or not they won or lost the election. However, we hope that the reasons for the delays in the final ballot tally have been explained fully in this memo. If you have any additional questions, please call Marjorie Roher at 240-777-8525.

## **WRAPPING UP THE ELECTION – CANVASSING AND RECONCILIATION**

### **WHAT IS THE VOTE CANVASS?**

The election canvass process is an internal reconciliation and is required by state law to ensure the accuracy of election results. Maryland election law allows 20 days for the conduct of the official canvass of final election results. The canvass begins on Thursday after the election and will be concluded no later than the second Monday after the election. All aspects of the canvass are open to public viewing. Prior to the canvass, provisional ballots are researched to determine eligibility. Eligibility recommendations are provided to the Board of Canvassers during the canvass and ballots are counted beginning on Thursday and every day until completed. The canvass concludes with the certification and issuance of official election results.

## **WHAT IS THE RECONCILIATION/AUDIT PROCESS?**

Election Judges ensure compliance in the precinct with all Laws and Regulations related to the conduct of the election. Following the election, at the same time the canvasses are being held additional staff begins the reconciliation/audit process. The post-election, pre-certification assessment and reconciliation is a comparison of the number of votes cast on the voting machines to the number of persons with posted credit by precinct. The review requires local board of elections' staff to examine the mandatory paperwork completed by the election judge relating to the documentation from the electronic poll book and the voting units assigned to the precinct. Staff will validate documentation provided to election judges including the successful closing of the units used related to the precinct reporting of results. A thorough review is made of information from each precinct to identify human error by voters or election judges and to correct such errors in order to accurately record and report voter credit to meet State Board of Elections Certification Deadlines.

### **Why is the number of voters at check-in different than the number of votes on the machines?**

- A voter decides not to vote and leaves the Polling Place
- The judges check-in the wrong voter by mistake
- The voter ends up voting a Provisional Ballot

### **How do we reconcile the numbers so that they are an accurate reflection of what happened in the Polling Place?**

- Compare both databases (Scanning Unit and Voter Credit)
- Examine Polling Place Resources: Given the correct information we can adjust voter credit to reflect what actually happened

## **SUMMARY**

Optical scan ballot counting of absentee and provisional ballots will occur in the days/weeks following the election. Based on past trends, the number of ballots remaining to be counted after election night is anticipated to exceed 10,000 countywide for this election cycle. These ballots are not segregated by district prior to counting. Therefore, the number of outstanding ballots for any specific electoral district will be unknown until the computer tallies these ballots. Our staff will be working extra shifts to prepare all outstanding ballots for tabulation.

Maryland law permits 20 days to complete the final, official canvass and certify the election results. This provision of the law recognizes the complexity of completing the ballot count and conducting a thorough reconciliation of the election results to ensure accuracy.

**§ 12-101. Petition for recount**

Currentness

In general

(a) A candidate for public or party office who has been defeated based on the certified results of any election conducted under this article may petition for a recount of the votes cast for the office sought.

Contents of petition for recount

(b) The petition shall specify that the recount be conducted:

- (1) in all of the precincts in which the office was on the ballot; or
- (2) only in the precincts designated in the petition.

Place of filing

(c) The petition shall be filed with the board with which the candidate's certificate of candidacy was filed.

Time of filing

(d) The petition must be filed within 3 days after the results of the election have been certified.

Notice of filing petition

(e)(1) The State Board shall promptly notify each appropriate local board of a petition that is filed with the State Board.

(2) A local board shall promptly notify the State Board of a petition that is filed with the local board.

**§ 12-102. Counterpetition for recount**

Currentness

In general

(a) An opposing candidate of the petitioner under § 12-101 of this subtitle may file a counterpetition if:

- (1) the petition filed under § 12-101 of this subtitle did not specify all of the precincts in which the office was on the ballot; and
- (2) on completion of the recount, the winner of the election is changed.

Contents of counterpetition

(b) A counterpetition shall be a request for a recount of the votes for the office in the precincts not specified by the petitioner under § 12-101 of this subtitle.

Place of filing

(c) The opposing candidate shall file the counterpetition with the board with which the candidate's certificate of candidacy was filed.

Time of filing

(d) The petition must be filed within 2 days of the determination under subsection (a)(2) of this section.

Notice of filing counterpetition

(e)(1) The State Board shall promptly notify each appropriate local board of a counterpetition that is filed with the State Board.

(2) A local board shall promptly notify the State Board of a counterpetition that is filed with the local board.

**§ 12-103. Recount on a question; petition**

Currentness

In general

(a) A petition for a recount based on the certified results of a question on the ballot in an election conducted under this article may be filed by a registered voter eligible to vote for that question.

Contents of petition for recount

(b) The petition shall specify that the recount be conducted:

- (1) in all of the precincts in which the office was on the ballot; or
- (2) only in precincts designated in the petition.

Place of filing

(c)(1) If the question was on the ballot in one county, the petition shall be filed in that county.

(2) If the question was on the ballot in more than one county, the petition shall be filed with the State Board.

Time of filing

(d) The petition must be filed within 2 days after the results of the election are certified.

Notice of filing petitions

(e)(1) The State Board shall promptly notify each appropriate local board of a petition that is filed with the State Board.

(2) A local board shall promptly notify the State Board of a petition that is filed with the local board.

**§ 12-104. Recount on a question; counterpetition**

Currentness

In general

(a) A counterpetition to a question filed under § 12-103 of this subtitle may be filed by a voter eligible to vote for that question, if:

- (1) the petition filed under § 12-103 of this subtitle did not specify all of the precincts in which the question was on the ballot; and
- (2) on completion of the recount, the outcome of the election is changed.

#### Contents of counterpetition

(b) A counterpetition shall be a request for a recount of the votes for the question in the precincts not specified by the petitioner under § 12-103 of this subtitle.

#### Place of filing

(c)(1) If the question was on the ballot in one county, the counterpetition shall be filed in that county.

(2) If the question was on the ballot in more than one county, the counterpetition shall be filed with the State Board.

#### Time of filing

(d) The petition shall be filed within 2 days of the determination under subsection (a)(2) of this section.

#### Notice of filing counterpetition

(e)(1) The State Board shall promptly notify each appropriate local board of a counterpetition that is filed with the State Board.

(2) A local board shall promptly notify the State Board of a counterpetition that is filed with the local board.

### § 12-105. Bond requirements for recount petition or counterpetition

#### Currentness

#### In general

(a) A petition or counterpetition filed under this subtitle shall be filed with a bond as provided under subsection (b) of this section.

#### Determination and setting bond

(b)(1) If a recount is being conducted in only one county, a judge of the circuit court of the county shall determine and set the bond to be filed by the petitioner or counterpetitioner sufficient to pay the reasonable costs of the recount.

(2) If the recount is being conducted in more than one county, a judge of the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County shall determine and set the bond.

### § 12-106. Duties of State and local boards

#### Currentness

#### Duties of local boards

(a) In accordance with regulations adopted by the State Board, the local board shall:

(1) conduct the recount and certify the official result of the election or question which is the subject of the recount; and

(2) ensure the public's ability to be present while the recount is conducted.

#### State Board to monitor conduct of recount

(b) The State Board shall monitor and support the work of any local board conducting a recount to

ensure compliance with this subtitle.

#### Termination of recount

(c) The State Board shall establish a procedure that will allow petitioners and counterpetitioners to request that a recount be terminated prior to its completion.

#### Correction returns

(d) When a recount is completed, the local board, and when appropriate the State Board, shall correct the primary, general, or special election returns and certificates that were made by a canvassing board.

### § 12-107. Costs of recount

#### Currentness

#### Petitioner defined

(a) In this section, "petitioner" includes a counterpetitioner.

#### In general

(b)(1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, each petitioner shall pay the cost of a recount requested under this subtitle and the petitioner's bond is liable for the cost.

(2) The petitioner is not liable for the costs of the recount if:

(i) the outcome of the election is changed;

(ii) the petitioner has gained a number of votes, for the petitioner's candidacy or for or against the question that is the subject of the petition, equal to 2% or more of the total votes cast for the office or on the question, in all precincts being recounted; or

(iii) 1. the margin of difference in the number of votes received by an apparent winner and the losing candidate with the highest number of votes for an office is 0.1% or less of the total votes cast for those candidates; or

2. in the case of a question, the margin of difference between the number of votes cast for and the number cast against the question is 0.1% or less.

#### Payment by county

(c) If the petitioner is not liable for the costs of the recount as provided in subsection (b) of this section, a county shall pay the costs of the recount in that county.

### § 12-201. Application of subtitle

#### Currentness

This subtitle applies to an issue arising in an election conducted under this article.

## § 12-202. Judicial challenges

### Currentness

#### In general

(a) If no other timely and adequate remedy is provided by this article, a registered voter may seek judicial relief from any act or omission relating to an election, whether or not the election has been held, on the grounds that the act or omission:

- (1) is inconsistent with this article or other law applicable to the elections process; and
- (2) may change or has changed the outcome of the election.

#### Place and time of filing

(b) A registered voter may seek judicial relief under this section in the appropriate circuit court within the earlier of:

- (1) 10 days after the act or omission or the date the act or omission became known to the petitioner; or
- (2) 7 days after the election results are certified, unless the election was a gubernatorial primary or special primary election, in which case 3 days after the election results are certified.

## § 12-203. Appeal proceedings

### Currentness

#### In general

(a) A proceeding under this subtitle shall be conducted in accordance with the Maryland Rules, except that:

- (1) the proceeding shall be heard and decided without a jury and as expeditiously as the circumstances require;
- (2) on the request of a party or *sua sponte*, the chief administrative judge of the circuit court may assign the case to a three Judge panel of circuit court judges; and
- (3) an appeal shall be taken directly to the Court of Appeals within 5 days of the date of the decision of the circuit court.

#### Expedited appeal

(b) The Court of Appeals shall give priority to hear and decide an appeal brought under subsection (a)(3) of this section as expeditiously as the circumstances require.

## § 12-204. Judgment of court

### Currentness

#### In general

(a) The court may provide a remedy as provided in subsection (b) or (c) of this section if the court determines that the alleged act or omission materially affected the rights of interested parties or the purity of the elections process and:

- (1) may have changed the outcome of an election already held; or
- (2) may change the outcome of a pending election.

Act or omission that changed election outcome

(b) If the court makes an affirmative determination that an act or omission was committed that changed the outcome of an election already held, the court shall:

- (1) declare void the election for the office or question involved and order that the election be held again at a date set by the court; or
- (2) order any other relief that will provide an adequate remedy.

Act or omission that may change outcome of pending election

(c) If the court makes an affirmative determination that an act or omission has been committed that may change the outcome of a pending election, the court may:

- (1) order any relief it considers appropriate under the circumstances; and
- (2) if the court determines that it is the only relief that will provide a remedy, direct that the election for the office or question involved be postponed and rescheduled on a date set by the court.

Clear and convincing evidence

(d) A determination of the court under subsection (a) of this section shall be based on clear and convincing evidence.




### 1 Mark Ballot

### 3 Scan Ballot

Insert your ballot into the ballot scanner. Your ballot can be tabulated in any orientation (right side up, backward, or upside down). A Thank you for voting screen will appear after your ballot is accepted.

- Completely fill in the oval next to your choice using a black ballpoint pen. Do not use an "x" or other notation.
- Do not mark more than the allowable number of selections per contest.
- If you make a mistake when marking your ballot, ask an election worker for a replacement ballot.
- Make sure all of the contests you intend to vote in are marked appropriately.

DO NOT FOLD YOUR BALLOT BEFORE INSERTING IT INTO THE BALLOT SCANNER.

*Voting System Information*

- The voting system used in Maryland is Election Systems & Software's EVS 5.2.0.3.
- All voters in Maryland vote on paper ballots. This means that voted ballots can be re-tabulated if there is a need to do so.
- Maryland's voting system has ballot scanners, devices for voters with disabilities to mark ballots privately and independently, and a computer network at each local board of elections.
  - Each ballot scanner has a removable USB memory drive. This memory drive stores individual and accumulated results and digital images of all voted ballots<sup>1</sup>.
  - The ballot marking device does **not** store or count votes. It simply marks the ballot.
  - The network adds the results from the memory drives and generates the official election results.
- Maryland's voting system has been rigorously tested by a federally accredited testing laboratory and certified by the U.S. Election Assistance Commission. The certification program tests a voting system against federal performance and security standards.
- No part of the certified voting system is connected to the Internet.
  - Ballot scanners are **never** connected to the Internet.
  - Ballot marking devices are **never** connected to the Internet.
  - Election results are **never** sent via modem over telephone lines.
  - The system's certified network is **never** connected to the Internet or the State Board of Elections' (SBE) network.
  - A local election official puts the results onto a memory device and takes the memory device to a computer with access to SBE's Secure File Transport Protocol (SFTP).
- Results released election night are not official election results. The day after the election, all USB memory drives are re-uploaded. This process starts the official election results process.

*Duties and Responsibilities of Election Officials*

- Election officials test each ballot scanner before each election. They scan pre-voted ballots and compare the results against expected results. If the results match, the unit can be used.
- After testing, election officials seal each ballot scanner and store it in a secure location until it is securely moved to a voting location. Each scanner is sealed until it is ready to use.
- SBE and the local boards of elections have contingency plans if the ballot scanner cannot be used. Each ballot scanner has a locked and secure place to store voted ballots that cannot be scanned because the ballot scanner is not working.
- After the 2016 General Election, SBE will use independent audit software to re-tabulate digital images of all voted ballots. This will verify the accuracy of the voting system's tabulation.

*Security Best Practices*

- All State and local election official receive regular security training.
- Only those election officials that need network access have access.
- All employees with network access have had background checks.
- All administrative functions in the network and ballot scanners are logged.
- Data stored on the memory device are encrypted.
- Memory devices are assigned to a specific ballot scanner. If the ballot scanner detects a different memory device, the ballot scanner will not accept ballots.
- Before the 2016 Primary Election, a third party performed a security review on the election night results network. Recommendations have been implemented to ensure the system's security.

<sup>1</sup> As each voted ballot is scanned, the ballot scanner captures a digital image of the ballot. This digital image can be retrieved and reviewed later.

# SECURITY, ACCURACY, AND RELIABILITY OF MONTGOMERY COUNTY'S VOTING SYSTEM

## INTRODUCTION

Montgomery County is implementing a new, paper based, digital image scan voting system in 2016. ES & S' voting system is used throughout the State of Maryland. This document is provided for Montgomery County voters who have concerns regarding electronic voting systems and who want to know whether their paper ballot cast on an electronic voting device is safe and secure. The information provided in this document can provide confidence to the vast majority of Montgomery County voters that their vote will be accurately counted and reported by our voting system.

While no voting system is perfect, studies show that electronic voting systems offer the most accurate and secure method of voting available:

- Voters are immediately able to completely correct a vote for the wrong candidate.
- Voters must view a summary screen of all races and measures before casting the ballot – this gives an opportunity to review and change their choices before a vote is cast.
- Voters are alerted to un-voted, over-voted, or under-voted races on the summary screen.
- Votes are redundantly stored in multiple physical memory locations to preserve election results in the event of equipment failure.

It is also important to remember that voting equipment is only one component of an overall election system that includes citizen involvement, transparency, external security measures, management policies and procedures, and professional election officials. All of these people, procedures, and technologies work together to ensure reliable and trustworthy election results.

## WHY WE REPLACED OUR ELECTION DAY VOTING SYSTEM

The Maryland Legislature, in response to concern from the voting public, passed legislation in 2010 to utilize a paper based, optical scan, voting system to provide a paper copy of each vote cast. Funding was provided in 2015 and the new system will be implemented state-wide for the Presidential Primary Election in 2016.

## DESIGN OF THE ES&S DIGITAL IMAGE SCAN VOTING SYSTEM

### EQUIPMENT SAFEGUARDS AGAINST UNAUTHORIZED ACCESS

The digital scan voting system includes both physical and electronic intrusion detection controls, such as numbered seals (commonly used in elections), and time-stamped transaction logs that record every system action related to the voting process. Data cannot be inserted or altered by unauthorized personnel because the database structure is proprietary and is protected by encrypted passwords determined by the State Board of Elections' Administrator.

#### CLEAR AUDIT TRAIL

Each component of the digital scan voting system creates an audit record every time it is accessed or information is changed. All audit records can be extracted and printed in hard copy. All audit reports, audit trail documents, databases, and election reports can be archived in hard copy and/or saved electronically to CD-ROM to preserve information as required by the Election Code. Ballot images are captured of each vote cast.

### **VOTING SYSTEMS CERTIFICATION & INDEPENDENT TESTING**

#### FEDERAL CERTIFICATION TESTING

Voting system certification standards employed in Maryland are among the most stringent in the nation. The voting system certified for use in Maryland must comply with the Federal Voting System Standards promulgated by the Federal Election Commission. An Independent Testing Authority (ITA) selected and approved by the National Association of State Election Directors (NASSED) rigorously tests each voting system's hardware, firmware, and software for compliance with the Federal Voting System Standards. Voting systems certified by the ITA are issued a NASSED Qualified Identification number to show that they meet or exceed the Federal Voting System Standards.

#### STATE CERTIFICATION TESTING

In addition, Maryland election law requires the Election Administrator to certify the state voting system. The Election Administrator's testing involves a team of six examiners. The Election Administrator appoints four examiners, one of whom must be a full-time employee of the Maryland State Board of Elections. The Attorney General appoints two examiners, one of whom must be a full-time employee of the Office of the Attorney General. Two of the Election Administrator's appointees must have demonstrated ability and experience in mechanics or electronics appropriate to the system or equipment to be examined, and two of the Election Administrator's appointees must have demonstrated knowledge of and experience in election law and procedure. Before the Maryland examination of a voting system, the system must be tested by a Nationally Recognized Test Laboratory (NRTL) and shall meet or exceed the minimum requirements set forth in the Performance and Test Standards for Punch Card, Mark

Sense, and Direct Recording Electronic Voting Systems, or in any successor voluntary standard document developed and promulgated by the Federal Election Commission.

Voting systems vendors must submit each hardware, firmware, and/or software update to the ITA and the Election Administrator for testing in order to maintain their voting system's certification.

## **VOTING SYSTEM TRANSPARENCY – TESTING, TESTING, TESTING . . .**

### **LOGIC AND ACCURACY TESTING**

The accuracy of digital scan voting devices are tested by "Logic and Accuracy" testing before and after each election as required by the Election Code to make certain that the voting system is working properly. Votes from a hand-marked paper ballot are entered into the electronic voting devices. Printed totals from the electronic system are then compared to the hand-counted results. Additional functional tests are performed manually on each voting device.

In addition, the digital scan voting system prints a "zero report" when the machines are opened and powered-up at the polling place to document that there are no prior votes stored within the system.

## **OTHER SECURITY MEASURES AND PROCEDURES**

### **SECURITY AT THE COUNTY ELECTIONS OFFICE**

An upgrade of physical security features was conducted within the Board of Elections including video surveillance of all areas of the office where voting equipment is to be stored and rooms where ballot origination computers and election tabulation computers are located. Access into certain secure areas (where ballot origination and tabulation computers are kept) is limited to key Election staff members.

### **SECURITY AT THE POLLING PLACE**

Voting devices are delivered to the polling places several days before Election Day. They are kept in a secure location at each polling place until Election Day. Each voting unit is stored inside a locked, secure case and sealed with a numbered seal to prevent unauthorized access. The presiding election judge is required to verify that the correct seals are intact on the voting devices and to certify this information on a chain-of-custody log before the equipment may be opened and used in the election.

## OTHER MANAGEMENT AND OPERATIONAL PROCEDURES

Internal management and operational procedures are crucial to the success and reliability of any voting system, including our previous voting systems. The following procedures will be carried forward or instituted:

- An audit of each precinct's electronic tally of the number of votes cast is conducted against the number of signatures in the precinct's poll book roster.
- Polling place officials are required to certify in writing that the proper locks and seals were found to be intact on the voting equipment before the polls open.
- Polling place officials are required to print and keep a "zero tape" from the voting system before the polls open to ensure that no votes have been pre-loaded into the system.
- A physical inventory of all voting devices is conducted before and after each election to ensure custody of all voting devices is maintained.
- All election judges, early voting workers, county Election staff, and central counting workers undergo extensive training in both voting equipment operation and election law/procedure.
- Bi-partisan staffing is encouraged and employed to the extent possible at Election Day polling places and the central counting station.

## SUMMARY REMARKS

Montgomery County's voting equipment is only one component of an overall election system that includes citizen involvement, transparency, external security measures, management policies and procedures, and professional election officials. All of these people, procedures, and technologies work together to ensure reliable and trustworthy election results.

The Montgomery County Board of Elections is keenly aware that it has front-line responsibility for the integrity of the voting process. We have a commitment to each Montgomery County voter, taxpayer, candidate, elected official, and citizen that each vote is correctly tabulated and reported.
