- 1. Introductions for current and new COA members were made
- 2. **Minutes** from October meeting were approved.
- 3. **Presentation**: Judy Levy presented background information and a summary of the AMSS Roundtable on Mental Health among seniors. In recent years this organization has held a number of events related to mental health has focused on mental health, which has emerged as an issue of primary and urgent concern. Four areas were addressed at the Roundtable:
 - a. Impact on Education
 - b. Access to care
 - c. Funding and Public Policy
 - d. Best practices

AMSS has developed a program that trains and sends individuals into the community to provide information about County programs and services and to conduct research. Significant issues that have arisen among this population include:

- Language barriers
- 2. Isolation among seniors
- 3. Food insecurity
- 4. Documentation concerns
- 5. Cultural differences and in some cases, lack of language to describe mental health issues
- 6. Stigma
- 7. Trust

Concerns moving forward:

- 1. Funding for priorities and access to services and care
- 2. Developing a broad coalition to advocate for services and funding
- 3. The complexity of the mental health system and need for developing a road map to help people navigate the system
- 4. Lack of providers to serve this community
- 5. A need for "one stop shopping" to make information and access easier for all.

Follow up Discussion:

- Judy stated there will be another roundtable on December 10: she will provide information to Tina for those who wish to attend.
- Possible steps to consider:
 - Investigate other commissions that might be working on this topic or that might want to work on this topic with the COA, such as veterans affairs.
 - Translate the COA's new Transitions document for this community and their families
 - o Create a fact sheet on relevant county resources
 - o Recommend Mental Health as a topic for the Spring COA Public Forum.
 - Consider a caregiver support group for older caregivers or those who care for them within this population
- Finally, the central issue for this group is finding a focus within the topic with which the COA can have a positive effect. Committee members formed a subgroup that will meet before the next committee meeting to try to narrow and focus on a direction for the committee to pursue.

The group will report back at the next meeting, scheduled for December 5, 2023.
