- IHAS, in Gaithersburg, lite care in HOC buildings

- Community Reach- based in Rockville

-Home Care Plus, in Friends House in Silver Spring & in Kentlands in Gaithersburg; difficult model financially and is a loss leader; conceptually interesting because it allows flexibility in the number of hours any one client has as a minimum- flex care

- Meals on Wheels- some " branches " offer not only meals but friendly calls, home repairs, grocery shopping and even pet care.

-Pace program-extensive wrap around services for dual ly eligible individuals (Medicare & Medicaid);

Holy Cross had applied- status unclear at this point.

-Capable program- (Hopkins affiliated-?) case management

The next topic was the upcoming Forum : "Home and Community-Based Services"

- it is being planned as an in- person event

-several people expressed the opinion that there should be a virtual back up plan in place in view of the unpredictable Covid situation. Agreement all around.

- COA may record the next Forum and it may lend itself to a fact sheet such as the one that came out of the Social Isolation Forum.

- there are procurement issues at present

- Garrett Co has received funding for hearing aids

-Baltimore City has received case management funding

-Barbara suggested that MOU's and sole source contracts are possible ways around the current issues.

- there is new legislation coming pertaining to dental care
