AAA Director updates- Dr. Patrice McGhee, Director Area Agencies on Aging

- About the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds: waiting for MDOA to give
 information on project scope and budget. The Montgomery County Office of
 Procurement will need to approve the project. She will share information with CoA once
 it is approved.
- Home Care Community Services Task force
 The Co- chairs are Professor Dr. Monique Davis from Montgomery College and Cynthia
 Grissom from Workforce Montgomery, Barbara Selter and Eddie Rivas are also
 members. The taskforce held a meeting on March 31st that went very well. The group
 will split into four subgroups: Career Path- Including training, recruitment, mentorship,
 and internship led by Monique Davis; Communication -led by Asha Hamilton; Wages &
 Benefits led by Patrice McGhee; and Partnerships & Working Conditions to include
 technology and translation -led by Cynthia Grissom.

- Nursing Home Inspections: Dr. McGhee said there have not been any annual inspections, inspections have only been because of complaints.
- Telehealth Survey: Dr. McGhee said there is a focus group and they conducted a telehealth survey and have received the results. They will compile the data and share the results, and recommendations, which may influence the ARPA and tech projects.

Liaison Updates- Liaisons from Other Boards and Commissions and CoA commissioners to other Boards and Commissions

- Sara Swarr- Recreation and Parks
 - Longwood Community Center will open their doors on May 16th and to the community on May 21st. On June 6th they will have a week of activities for seniors from 9:00am to 4:00pm.
 - In June they will have two sessions of Senior summer camps (Long branch from June 21-24 and Damascus from June 23-29). The fee is \$24. There will be fun activities including painting classes, field trips, dancing, board games, and arts and crafts. On June 22 they are planning a B-B-Q for older adults at Smokey Glen from 10 am- 2 pm. Seniors will need to register for the event. Buses will pick seniors up from the various community centers.
 - New Silver Spring Center new location in downtown Silver Spring is being built.
 The recreation department will have two levels, an aquatic pool in the basement and rooms on the entrance floor with space for meetings and planning for senior activities. The ten levels above will be for senior apartments.
- Denise Isreal Dept. of Transportation
 - On Ride on Buses, masks are encouraged but not required and masks are available on the buses.
 - The Department of Transportation had a table at the Brookside Greenfest event great turn out.
 - May 5th they will have a table at the Active Aging Expo.
 - May 12th they will have a translator working with Vietnamese older adults.
 - Rapid Transit for Bethesda: input from the community on routes and information is due April 29.
- Marcia Pruzan- Senior Fellow
 - Age friendly is actively involved in ten workgroups. They are working on a progress report reflecting the last three years which will reflect accomplishments, where they are now, and plans. The goal is to have this done by the middle of June.

Marcia is actively engaged in planning for an October 12th regional effort with the four other regions (DC, Hyattsville, Alexandria, and Arlington) with the Center on Aging, Health and Humanities at GW University. The four topics for the October event will be transportation, specifically vision zero; the long-term care workforce; multi-purpose housing; and emergency preparedness and resilience, with a focus on the 311 system.

• Phoebe Shin- Asian American Health Initiative

- She collaborates with community-based organizations to better meet the needs of groups and individuals.
- Will participate in the Active Aging Expo on May 5 and an international group in June.
- They had a memory loss presentation at which 44 seniors attended (April 21).
 This tells us how much our seniors enjoy the presentations.
- There will be a Germantown celebration in the spring to share resources, enjoy fun activities. Will send flyer to CoA.
- Kendell Matthews, CoA Liaison to Recreation and Parks
 - Wheaton stables are being reviewed for renovation, remodeling or rebuilding for other usage. The stables provide engaging programing for students with disabilities. This is the only program like this in the county.

 - There are 35 Pickleball courts in down county. Now looking to turn some up county tennis courts into Pickleball courts.
 - Adult Activities that were phenomenally successful: Appetizers in the Park and Cocktails in the Park.
