Offers healthcare for military, Veterans, and their family members. They accept TRICARE, private insurance, and we are a partner in the VA Community care program. There are also special programs to assist those who are uninsured. Their sites are located Silver Spring, Kensington, and Germantown, Maryland. There are six voluntary behavioral health beds at Holy Cross Hospital in Germantown. Behavioral health patients are screened in the emergency department and referred to appropriate services at other facilities in the county. Holy Cross Health has a Military and Veterans Health Program. All patients are asked if they served in the military as well as a series of behavioral health questions as Holy Cross Health recognizes PTSD, TBI and a number of other conditions can manifest as behavioral health issues. Holy Cross Health also recognizes spouses and children can have behavioral health issues secondary to the Veterans issues. Staff are trained on military cultural competency to meet the specific needs of military service members, veterans, and their family members.
