BCC VOTING PROCEDURES

Unless your board's enabling legislation states otherwise:

- 1. <u>Definition of a Quorum</u>: A quorum is a simple majority of the authorized voting membership of a board. Even when voting positions on the board are vacant, the quorum does not change. If a quorum is not present at a meeting, a binding vote may not be taken.
- 2. <u>Quorum of the Full Board Must Vote</u>: A quorum of the voting members of the full board must vote on all formal actions, including approving correspondence and other documents sent on behalf of the board. A subcommittee may not vote in place of the full board.
- 3. <u>Voting by Email</u>: At this time, voting by email or by any other online electronic means is not permitted.
- 4. <u>Voting by Conference Call</u>: Occasionally, when a voting member cannot attend a meeting in person, that member may attend by conference call. A member may vote on an issue if he or she has been part of all discussions pertinent to the issue preceding the vote at that meeting.
- 5. <u>Voting by Proxy</u>: Voting by proxy is not permitted.
