Veterans First is a Friendship Place program providing supportive housing services to veterans and their families in the DC Metro area. Provide case management to assist with locating affordable housing, assistance with paying first month's rent and security deposit, and emergency rental and utility assistance. To participate in the program, Veterans must: Not have a dishonorable discharge; Be below the 50% median income for their area; and Be homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. National Guard and Reservists who were activated by Presidential Order to serve in another State or Country (beyond their initial training) and received a DD-214 with an other than dishonorable discharge are also eligible for this program.

"One Stop Shop", started by the Virginia Mid-Atlantic Chapter of the Paralyzed Veterans Association, was developed to make all veterans as independent as possible by remodeling their present living space, or finding them a government grant to have a home built to their specific needs. Specially adapted grants can drastically reduce the cost of building a home. The medical staff of their local Department of Veterans Affairs will also schedule a home visit to determine what medical equipment, if any, the VA can supply them with materials needed in home free of cost to all eligible veterans. Provide a free consultation for all eligible veterans who are interested in participating in this program. DVCH has partnered with R.L. Seely Homes, LLC. They have been approved by the Veterans Affairs Special Adapted Housing Section, and they know all the proper building requirements that will be needed for a disabled veteran to have the home built to his/her specifications.
