Post-deployment related conditions refer to a wide range of problems include physical, psychological, and socio-cultural concerns. Offer multidisciplinary health evaluations for recently returned veterans who are concerned about new health problems. Clinical services focus on environmental exposure assessments and comprehensive medical evaluations for combat veterans who have chronic and difficult to diagnose symptoms. An Exposure Assessment Clinic is designed to address veterans' post-deployment-related exposure concerns. Also provide a variety of classes for veterans on topics ranging from environmental exposures to post-deployment-related conditions and symptoms.
