Child Find provides free developmental screenings for children from three years of age until kindergarten. It is also the single point of entry for families moving into Montgomery County whose preschool-aged child has been previously identified with a disability. Nonresident families with developmental concerns about their child who does NOT have an IEP and attends a preschool or child care center located in Montgomery County may contact Child Find. Parentally placed private school students' parents/guardians with schoolaged students (5-21 years of age) may contact Mrs. Anna E. Szilagyi-Weichbrod at 240-740-3855 or via email at anna e szilagyi-weichbrod@mcpsmd.org for a Child Find referral packet. Parents of children between birth and two years, 10 months of age should contact Montgomery County Infants and Toddlers Program to request an evaluation if they have concerns about their child's development at 240-777-3997. Parents of students in kindergarten through age 21 should contact their neighborhood school to request an evaluation.

Local system of early intervention services for children birth through thirty four and a half months of age and their families. When an infant or toddler is suspected of having a developmental delay, a referral is made to the program. Children are eligible if they meet the following criteria: demonstrate a 25% delay in one of the developmental domains, have atypical development or have a high probability condition that would likely result in developmental delays. The program includes a developmental assessment; a review of family concerns; priorities and resources; meetings with the family to develop an individualized family service plan; service coordination to ensure that the individual and his or her family receive needed services which may include but are not limited to physical therapy, occupational therapy, audiology, assistive technology, health/medical services, nursing services, nutrition services, psychological services including specialized play groups or therapy sessions, counseling, speech and language assistance, special instructional services, transportation, and parenting skills development; and ongoing evaluation of the child's progress and his or her changing enrichment needs. These services are provided in a family centered practice model where families participate with service providers to learn skills and strategies to support their children's development. All services are provided at no cost in the child's natural environment (home and community settings where a child is during the day).
