VA offers comprehensive dental care benefits to certain qualifying veterans. To better understand if you are eligible for VA dental care, check out [What VA dental care benefits do I qualify for?](#) If eligible but not yet enrolled in VA health care, you can apply online using the [Apply for health care benefits](#) webpage. If not eligible, veterans enrolled in VA health care can purchase dental insurance at a reduced cost through the [VA Dental Insurance Program](#) (VADIP). Additionally, see the "Not Eligible?" tab section below for more information.

If you are a veteran who has recently served (e.g. OEF/OIF/OND), you may be entitled to a one-time course of free dental care, but you must apply for dental care within 180 days of your discharge (under conditions other than dishonorable) from a period of active duty of 90 days or more.
