Veterans First is a Friendship Place program providing supportive housing services to Veterans and their families in the DC Metro area. Provide case management to assist with locating affordable housing, assistance with paying first month's rent and security deposit, and emergency rental and utility assistance. To participate in the program, Veterans must: not have a dishonorable discharge; be below the 50% median income for their area; and be homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. National Guard and Reservists who were activated by Presidential Order to serve in another State or Country (beyond their initial training) and received a DD-214 with an other than dishonorable discharge are also eligible for this program. Friendship Place is a recipient of the Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) grant from the Department of Veterans Affairs. Serves Washington D.C. and the counties of Prince George (MD), Montgomery (MD), Frederick (MD), Fairfax (VA), Loudoun (VA), Prince William (VA), Arlington (VA), as well as the City of Alexandria (VA).

The Roanoke Regional Loan Center (RLC) is one of eight VA RLCs administering VA's Home Loan Guaranty program, which helps Veterans obtain mortgage loans from private lenders by guaranteeing a portion of the loan against loss. In administering VA Home Loan Guaranty benefits, the RLC is the direct contact for the lending, appraising, and building communities and for Veterans with questions or concerns about their home loan benefit. The RLC trains and oversees the program's private-sector stakeholders and conducts outreach to the housing and Veteran communities. RLC staff also work with loan servicers to help Veterans avoid foreclosure and assist service-disabled Veterans with applying for VA's Specially Adapted Housing benefit. Provide loan servicing and guaranty origination of VA home loans in the following states: District of Columbia, Kentucky, Maryland, Virginia, and West Virginia.
