Testing Program: Services include diagnostic testing, exams and treatment of STD's and epidemiological follow up. Free, anonymous and confidential HIV testing is also offered. All persons tested for HIV receive pre- and post-test counseling. **Clinical**

Services: The Patient Services Diagnostic Unit provides additional lab test and diagnostic evaluations of persons tested positive for HIV. Patients diagnosed with STD are also treated. **HIV Case Management:**

Provide HIV Seropositive Services including case management, diagnostic evaluation unit, HIV outpatient clinic services, HIV dental care and nutritional and addictions counseling. On-going support groups are available for anyone who is HIV positive or has AIDS. Home health care services are offered as needed. Education and outreach to at risk populations are also provided.
