"Smart Home – Smarter Care: A Conversation about the Technology Forum"

Opening Remarks from the Co-Chairs: Wayne welcomed everyone and reviewed the agenda for today's meeting that featured a presentation by Kathleen McGuiness (Director of Community Relations, Smith-Life Homecare) and a discussion on the upcoming CoA Forum, title "Smart Homes-Smarter Care: The Role of Technology to Support Aging in Place".

Approval of the Minutes: The minutes of the January 10, 2023, meeting were reviewed and approved.

PRESENTATION:

Kathleen McGuiness presented the story of how she used technology to assist in caring for her aged parents as well as her husband who had dementiaShe stated that she used five essential family caregiving products:

- CaringBridge.org: A website for community and family support as well as respite care.
- Smart Soles: A GPS Tracker for individuals who wander.
- Apple Watch with GPS.
- Alexa / Google Assistant: For remote communications, caregiving, and fun.
- The Internet

Much of Kathleen's presentation focused on how she used each of these technologies andservices to help her in her role as caregiver, given the different circumstances she had to deal with between her parents and her husband. She tailored all these technologies to suit her varying needs. She also stated that she learned a lot from YouTube videos and Wikihow on how to use the medical technology and to troubleshoot technologies that were not working well. A very engaging question and answer session followed Kathleen's presentation. Her presentation "Care Giving and Tech 101" is attached for further information.

DISCUSSION ON THE PUBLIC FORUM

Following Kathleen McGuiness' presentation, Wayne reviewed progress made to date on the CoA's upcoming public Forum: Smart Homes-Smarter Care: Technology that Supports Aging in Place. He reviewed the particulars of the Forum as follows:

Following Wayne's presentation, he opened up the floor to questions and comments on the Forum and its progress. The AIC Committee was very supportive and enthusiastic about the Forum and its topic. Several suggestions were offered:

- It would be good to include the challenges of Telemedicine,
- Representatives from the Villages should attend,
- Incorporate the need for one-on-one support to help educate older adults on technology and get them started. A Intergenerational program with high school students would be beneficial in this regard.
- Advocated for some kind of train-the-trainer program,
- It is important to talk about "what happens after the Forum and who will assist in advancing the ideas coming from the forum. This might include the JCA, JSSA, the Recreation Department, Libraries, MCPS the Gilcrest Center, and the County Council.
- Must acknowledge the issue of privacy in the Forum,
- It will be useful to have the support of the JCA Interages Program,
- Need to address the costs and use of high tech and low-tech devices,
- It is important to help people access technology, not just hand out devices and walk away,
- Need to advocate for more investment to advance these concepts,
- Need some examples of Villages who help with technology,
- Look into have a representative from Oasis attend the forum,
- This Forum should not be a "One and Done" thing. The themes and outcomes need to continue and be part of advocacy, policy, and investment,
- Look into philanthropic opportunities to continue work, especially for intergenerational programs.

A lot of good discussion occurred about the Forum with the attendees reiterating their enthusiastic support for it. Lot of good ideas were stated.
