Full Commission Reconvenes/Subcommittee Report Outs – summary of drafts given, written drafts will be emailed

- Accessible Youth Spaces
 - Have 4 recommendations
 - Increasing access for smaller nonprofits and community organizations that can serve communities with higher poverty rates (such as through subsidizing fees),
 - Finding rec centers to adapt to the change in culture and virtual reality/tech spaces/interactive Realtime spaces and looking at open spaces that are culturally appropriate (changing a tennis court to pickleball courts – meet youth interests)
 - Prioritizing new spaces that are accessible to neighborhoods (walkable) and without transportation barriers
 - Have a countywide self-audit every 4 years that align with the election cycle
- Youth Employment Opportunities
 - Have 3 recommendations
 - Improve community outreach to youth consider a central website about programs and market consistently (through IG, Tick Tock, etc.) and consider parents as secondary platform for outreach (through Neighborhood, FB),
 - Working with youth to create a coalition to address issues and engage youth about the issues
 - Create more opportunities what could lead (recycling programs in high school can lead to waste management)
- Youth Advisory Group did not meet during breakout session (only 1 member present during the meeting)
- The Chair asks for drafts to be sent out via email for offline editing piece to be completed.
