# <u>Senior Nutrition Program – Carol Craig , Program Manager, Senior</u> Nutrition Program

- The Senior Nutrition Program provides daily meals in congregate settings where activities and services for seniors are available. Fifteen or more seniors will need to sign up for the meals at the site. They also have a Home Delivered Meals program (Meals on Wheels) for homebound senior.
- Congregate settings meals choices hot meal, cold meal, and vegetarian meal. Home Delivered Meals hot meal and cold meal.
- The meal programs are okay for now because of the AARP funds. Seniors are not coming into the centers to eat. But funding the program might be a problem in the future. She would like CoA to be an advocate for senior meals.
- AARP funds will focus on restaurant model, identifying a variety of restaurants that serve meals from various cultures. At this point they plan to partner with restaurants and see how the seniors like the meals before contracting with the restaurants.
- New program 2023 year of Surprises- little treats will be given to seniors who attend the meal programs, candy corn, ice cream cone, eggnog the goal is to encourage other seniors to attend the in-person meals.
- All adults 60 and older can participate in the meal programs there is no income eligibility because of the Older American Act. Ms. Craig shared a menu calendar of the meal programs.
- Arlee -East County and Mid-County do not have meal programs. Ms. Craig, big need to get these centers up and running. Need to do a better job of outreach.
- A great need to get information to older adults about the meal programs. Senior centers, 50+, word of mouth, community papers and radio announcements.
