Topic	Discussion Points	Decisions/Follow Up
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Food Security Presentations	Melanie Polk described the long established MC Senior Nutrition Program, which meets state requirements.  Approximately 6,000 seniors are served by this program at 40 different sites.  Various food contractors provide ethnic and cultural meals. In addition, approximately 1,500 meals are homedelivered. Meals are delivered 5 days a week.	Senior Nutrition Program concerns include weekend senior nutrition and ability to reach remote, vulnerable seniors.
	Diana Tato-Niktash spoke of the recently established MC Food Security Plan. Plan goals include increased senior participation in the Federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), as only 46% of eligible seniors are now enrolled, increased minority senior enrollment, and the establishment of a volunteer workforce to implement the Plan.	
	Heather Bruskin related the Food Council's, which is a non-profit organization, efforts to coordinate food providers and food distribution among 80 different partners. About half of the partners are faith-based organizations.	Food Council concerns include increased transportation options for seniors so they can easily access sites where food is available.
	Jenna Umbriac described the operations of MANNA whose food service currently	MANNA also is concerned that senior transportation is inadequate for seniors
