 - Want to expand the program and looking for county council funding

b. Ingleside Engaged

- Social Day model the same as Kensington Club, however can additionally take persons with some minor healthcare maintenance needs (see eligibility requirements) and for longer in progression of the disease due to high staff census and employment of Licensed Geriatric Nurse Assistant and Certified Dementia Practitioners.
- Accepts ages 45+ and early onset Alzheimer's Disease as well as other issues related to cognitive decline.
- Current program exists Monday Thursday, 10am to 4pm.
- Highly individualized program, up to 10 people per day with 2 staff and 2 volunteers.
- Open to the community outside of Ingleside at King Farm.
- In 2019 planning to expand to offer services up to 12 hrs/day and 7 days a week day and night services.
- Utilizes Ingleside's amenities and restaurants.

- May not be for best fit for minor Mild Cognitive
 Impairment. Accepts people in Early, late Early and Midstages of the progression based on abilities and eligibility requirements.
- c. Alzheimer's Association Memory Café focus on social interactions for early onset
 - Memory Café meets at twice a month at Rockville Senior Center and once a month at other locations through Montgomery County.
 - Interested persons must contact Alzheimer's Association to register for Memory Café program.
