4.0 Public Health Services Chief's Report-Mark Hodge

- There were 75 TB disease cases reported to the CDC in 2016, which is an increase of 25 cases from 2015. TB funding has been dropping for the last eight years.
- Care for Kids has continued its growth trend. Kaiser cut off its pro-bono work as of February 14, 2017 after seeing a total of 835 children.
- Dental Services continues to serve an increased number of clients compared to this time last year, mostly related to the increased funds for FY17. However, there is a much higher demand for services than we are able to fulfill and the waitlist for services is long.

4.0 Liaison to MCPS Report – Marla Caplon

- Six more schools have been added to the USDA Fresh Fruit and Vegetable program which provides kids with fresh fruit at no charge.
- Although the Division of Food and Nutrition Services is still receiving applications for the reduced/free meal program, many parents are not applying due to fear.

5.0 New Business

- Uma has asked if anyone from the COH would like to provide testimony in support of the Tobacco Control bill. The Senate hearing will be scheduled shortly.
- The Healthy Montgomery Health in All Policies Workgroup meeting will be on February 27, 2017 from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. A representative of the COH is invited to attend.
- The Health Literacy workgroup would like DHHS public health contracts (outreach) to include language recommending providers/navigators take the University of Maryland Smart Choice Training on Health Literacy.
- Parks in Montgomery County are being designed according to ADA requirements to promote activity, family events, comfort and relaxation.
- Cara D. Grant of MCPS will present on health and physical activity at the March 16th COH meeting.

• Two motions were made:

- Motion #1 Made by Sean Bailey and seconded by Dr. Alan Kaplan: To waive the 72-hour rule for the time frame of reviewing a letter before approving such letter. The motion was approved.
- Motion #2 Made by Tonya Saffer and seconded by Lenna Israbian-Jamgochian: The COH will write a letter in support of recommending to the Health Department to incorporate the University of Maryland Smart Choice Training Program into the health outreach and provider's contracts. The motion was seconded by Lenna Israbian-Jamgochian. The motion was approved.

- Men's Health The workgroup would like a day designated to men's health. The group is considering sending a letter to Linda McMillan to gather Council support.
- Obesity The workgroup updated the new member on the status of the workgroup. The workgroup has invited Cara Grant to speak at the March meeting.
- Health Literacy The workgroup has lined up a speaker from the Agency of Healthcare Research and Quality to present at the April 20, 2017 meeting.
