Health	Officer's Report – Dr. Chris Rogers provided an update in lieu of Dr. Travis Gayles	N/A	
1.	The community transmission levels in the County continue to be among the best in		
	the state. The most recent test positivity averages have been in the 0.4-0.45 range, rates between 0.7-1, and our daily new cases in the 5-10 range. The presence of		
	variant strains will continue to be monitored; the Alpha (UK) variant continues to		
	be the predominant strain in Maryland; there have been reports of the Delta (Indian) variant, but the % of cases is not as significant as seen in other countries, such as the UK.		
2.	The Governor is lifting the state declaration of emergency effective June 30. All		
	Covid related procedures and parameters, including face coverings, will be lifted.		
	Individual jurisdictions can make their own determinations of such requirements after such date, including requirements of coverings in schools, etc. The county is		
	currently reviewing its next steps and will make any announcements related to		
	such adjustments, if any, before the conclusion of the emergency declaration.		
3.	County vaccine rates continue to outpace the state and region. As of last week,		
	Montgomery County had the highest rates of vaccination, particularly amongst 12-		
	18 yo, in the country for counties with >300k residents (CDC). We continue to use		

epidemiological and surveillance data to identify areas of lower uptake to target vaccine efforts. The County will be consolidating its vaccine clinics into 3 pods, 1 in up-county, 1 in mid-county and 1 down county areas. Currently, there is no reportable information regarding access for those under 12 yo, or booster shots. Please stay tuned. Novavax has released preliminary data that suggests its vaccine is 90% effective at preventing Covid, and 100% effective at preventing Covid fatalities. No announcement has been made on an FDA hearing/authorization.

- 4. Healthy Montgomery is continuing the Public Health Services Community Needs Assessment process. Data will be forthcoming at the conclusion of both the quantitative and qualitative components.
- 5. Dr. Liu and his team are working on an updated status of health report for the County. The release date of the report is pending.
- 6. The County will be pivoting attention to post-Covid planning, a continuation of the work that was started pre-Covid, in the space of integration of social determinants of health into service delivery, modernization of public health infrastructure, and implementation of a health in all policies approach across county government. There will continue to be ample opportunities for input from the COH on these topics.

The Racial Equity workgroup met and reevaluated their goals. They plan to do additional research on the pressing issues in the County to refocus. They would like to have a strategic plan to be able to line up guest speakers for upcoming meetings.
