 COVID-19 cases are low*. Measles has turned down nationally. *Edit- In early August COVID-19 cases are trending slightly upward Dr. Davis is continuing to note Federal actions that will impact the ability of the County to discharge health responsibilities to County residents. The Medicaid and SNAP cuts will not take effect until after the federal mid-term election. The Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices has released its vaccine recommendations for this fall, including the removal of thimerosal from the flu vaccine.
