BCC Liaison Updates	(3) Vaccinations- Students 19-21yrs who require vaccinations for school but are uninsured are not eligible for free vaccines under vaccines for children. Commissioners discussed school health falls within DHHS and have advocated for school health in the past. Dr. Rogers shared if COH wants to advocate directly to MCPS, need to discuss with CE's office. Commissioner Alana serves as a liaison to School Health Council. Dr. Rogers shared PHS will be before County Council next week to review PHS proposed operating budget for FY24. Chair shared starting point for next priorities can be most recent advocacy efforts, be able to explain data behind priority (how many impacted, seriousness, etc.) and include ideas for what should happen. Important that it is clear why we are advocating and what we would like to see done. Commissioners worked in break out groups to discuss priorities. Three groups: Access to Care, Public Health Administration (PHA) and Environmental Health and Education. Chair and Dr. Rogers present for the PHA brainstorm of future direction. Betty Smith: COH staff shared the Access to Care advocacy letter with the Community Action Board staff person. Some priorities overlap. One area of focus for CAB is affordable housing. Marcela Campoli: Latino Health Initiative has three advocacy priorities: bullying/harassment at MCPS schools, drug use at MCPS schools & offering trainings regarding overdoses in different languages and health for all.
