	 Dr. Nina Ashford and Ashley Miller captured questions to share with Dr. Davis from this month's Health Officer Report. Concern was expressed about budget cuts and health care for immigrants, and folks are noticing drops in encounters. Dr. Yuchi Huang inquired if there was a way to highlight data/areas of least and greatest concern included in the reports (example: red – high concern, yellow – some concern, green – low concern)? This feedback will be share with Dr. Davis. Wayne Swann asked how the State deficit and Federal cuts will impact the County? Dr. Ashford noted that the County should have a better picture of this in the coming weeks, but that County leadership will provide awareness and additional information when available. The County is in a better position as it is not solely Federal and State funding reliant. The County faced a difficult funding year in FY25 and anticipates there may be funding challenges for FY26. On behalf of Dr. Davis, Dr. Ashford inquired if members are seeing or hearing any concerns or changes in patient appointments due to immigration concerns? Mark Foraker noted that so far, trends have been variable across clinics. Some clinics report an increased rate of "no shows" and a reduction in appointments scheduled, some have had no change, and others are experiencing increases in appointments. Mark felt it was still early to gauge the ripple effects and said he would continue to monitor and provide updates. Vahe Hovian noted a reduction in CFK visits. Marisol Ortiz shared that this is because individuals that are active the previous year are not included in the count as a unique patient in the new fiscal year.			
5.	County Dental Programs Update See Presentation Dr. Tricia Boyce, Dental Director, Montgomery County DHHS, presented an update on the County Dental Programs and answered questions. Some items noted during the presentation: Data (for target population: high poverty schools) showed that the number of schools/students increased from FY24 – FY25. The Dental Program launched a new Pilot program with University of Maryland School of Dentistry. The program provides severely discounted specialty and regular dental services to eligible DHHS adult patients in need of regular and advanced dental procedures such as dentures, root canals, crowns, etc. Member Wayne Swann inquired if individuals with untreated decay are given priority appointments and thanked Dr. Tricia Boyce for her worked.
