The Advisory Board on Victims and Their Families, also known as the VICTIM SERVICES ADVISORY BOARD (VSAB) was established to support Montgomery County's commitment to serve victims of crime and their families, including rape, domestic violence, sexual assault, homicide survivors, adults molested as children, terrorism, assault, battery, arjacking, burglary, hate violence, and other crimes.

The Advisory Board on Victims and Their Families, known as Victim Services Advisory Board (VSAB), was established by Montgomery County Bill 22-86. With the reorganization of the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), VSAB was recodified in Art. VII - Sec. 24-56, Bill 95.

### **Membership**

The VSAB has 18 voting members and four non-voting members. Membership comprised of five individuals from among the mental health, legal, medical, dental and nursing professions, ten citizens at-large who do not belong to any of the professions mentioned above; one member of the clergy; and representatives designated by the Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse Advisory Council and the Mental Health Advisory Committee.

The following two programs of Montgomery County's Department of Health and Human Services aid crime victims:

### **Victim Assistance and Sexual Assault Program (VASAP)**

- ⇒ 24-hour crisis outreach counseling for victims of sexual assault at hospitals and police stations.
- ⇒ Counseling and support groups for crime victims.
- ⇒ Support groups for surviving family and friends of homicide and DWI victims.
- ⇒ Victim assistance through the criminal justice system.
- ⇒ Compensation for eligible victims from the Montgomery County Crime Victims' Compensation Fund.
- ⇒ Liaison with the State Criminal Injuries Compensation Board

### **Abused Persons Program (APP)**

- ⇒ 24-hour accessible shelter for victims of domestic abuse and their dependent children.
- ⇒ Individual counseling, education and support groups for victims and abusers.

⇒ Victim assistance with the legal system and other County agencies.

Both VASAP and APP services are available to all Montgomery County residents and victims of crimes committed in Montgomery County and their families. Counseling fees are charged on a sliding scale. No one is denied services for inability to pay.

### **VSAB helps crime victims by:**

- ◆ Ensuring a Montgomery County system that is victim friendly.
- ◆ Advocating for funding for victim programs and services.
- ◆ Educating the community on victim related issues.

### **Accomplishments**

- ◆ Collaborated with the police department to enhance its response protocols for victims of sexual assault
- ◆ Testified before the County Council and met council members to lobby for victim program budget needs.
- ◆ Lobbied the Maryland House and Senate for statewide laws that supported victims of violent crime.
- ◆ Responded to the Office of Legislative Oversight's Study on Victim Services.
