Application Instructions

Questions to answer in **writing**:

1. Please provide your professional bio. If you don't have one written already, please share what you currently do and past experience that feels relevant.
2. What motivated you to get involved in social services? What brought you to this work?
3. How are you currently contributing to the goal of Ending Homelessness in Montgomery County, and how would you like to expand your impact in the community?
4. What would you (and/or others) say are your greatest leadership strengths? What about challenges or growth areas?
5. Do you have any scheduling conflicts with the group session dates? Thursdays, alternating in-person and virtual. In-person sessions will take place from 9:30am-2:30pm and virtual sessions from 9:30am-12:30pm: June 16 (in-person), July 21 (virtual), August 18 (in-person), September 15 (virtual), October 20 (virtual), November 17 (in-person)? If so, please indicate which days are in conflict.

Questions to answer on **video recording**:

1. Why did you decide to apply to be a part of Lead for Impact? What would you like to take away from the program?
2. In Lead for Impact we define leadership as “the ability to take responsibility for something that matters to you and then successfully engage others in bringing it to life.” (Amanda Blake). Using this definition, what's something you've done recently that demonstrates your leadership?
