## **Emergency Assistance Relief**

Montgomery County's Emergency Assistance Relief Payment (EARP) provides financial assistance to households in need. EARP seeks to fill the gaps for those who are not eligible for federal or state aid and unemployment benefits. Montgomery County's Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) has more information on the process, eligibility criteria, selection timeline.



Financial assistance for those who qualify will come in three phases:

- Phase I: DHHS will automatically send you
  a letter about the checks to families
  enrolled in the Care for Kids program.
  Residents will not have to open a Paypal
  accounts to receive funds.
- <u>Phase II:</u> DHHS will partner with nonprofits in the community to identify additional families in need of assistance. Please verify with DHHS that the nonprofit you are working with is a partner. Phase II will require an application process. <u>Only</u> the application provided by DHHS should be used.
- <u>Phase III:</u> DHHS will open an application process for residents who did not receive
