Expedited Fire and Rescue Services – Length of Bill 8-22 Service Awards Program for Volunteers – Amendments

SUMMARY

The Office of Legislative Oversight (OLO) anticipates that enacting Expedited Bill 8-22 would have an insignificant impact on economic conditions in the County in terms of the Council's priority indicators.

BACKGROUND

Expedited Bill 8-22 would increase the amount of the Length of Service benefit to certain local fire and rescue department volunteers by 2.5 percent.¹ If enacted, the benefit increase would take effect as soon as it becomes law.²

INFORMATION SOURCES, METHODOLOGIES, AND ASSUMPTIONS

Per Section 2-81B of the Montgomery County Code, the purpose of this Economic Impact Statement is to assess Expedited Bill 8-22's impacts on County-based private organizations and residents in terms of the Council's priority economic indicators.³ In its Fiscal Impact Statement for the Bill, the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) concludes that the 2.5 percent Length of Service benefit adjustment for certain eligible volunteers would increase County expenditures by \$23,175 over a six-year period, an average increase of \$3,863 per year. Residents who would receive the benefit would experience a net increase in household income, holding all else equal. However, given the minor overall increase in the Length of Service benefit, OLO concludes that the change in law would have negligible impacts on residents and private organizations in terms of the Council's priority indicators.
