Subject: Tax Levy Resolution - FY 2007

Action

The County Council for Montgomery County, Maryland approves the following resolution:

1. In accordance with Chapters 14 and 52 of the County Code and the Tax-Property Article of the Maryland Code, the Council sets the following tax rates and other charges on all assessable real and personal property for Fiscal Year 2007 (FY 2007). The rates are in dollars per \$100 of assessed value. In accordance with the Tax-Property Article the tax rate for personal property is 2.5 times the tax rate for real property.

Special Taxing Districts – Development Districts

Kingsview Village Center Development District special tax : \$0.065 per \$100 of assessed value.

Kingsview Village Center Development District special benefit assessment: \$140.96 per Equivalent Dwelling Unit.


West Germantown Development District special tax: \$0.161 per \$100 of assessed value.

West Germantown Development District special benefit assessment: \$549.35 per Equivalent Dwelling Unit.

2. Section 305 of the County Charter places a limit on the increase in property tax revenue from real property that exists in FY 2006. The limit is that 7 affirmative votes are required if the property tax revenue in FY 2007 from real property that existed in FY 2006 (with certain exceptions listed in Section 305) increases more than the rate of inflation. The property tax levied under this resolution will result in a revenue increase at the rate of inflation. Therefore, 7 affirmative votes are not required to adopt this resolution.
3. For the State, the Council sets the following tax rates on all assessable real property in Montgomery County for FY 2007. The rates are expressed in dollars per \$100 of assessed value.

On the property of public utilities	\$0.280
On all other real property	\$0.112
4. Section 310 of the Charter limits the target reserve in the General Fund planned for the end of FY 2007 to a maximum of 5% of the revenue in the General Fund in FY 2006. Revenue in the General Fund in FY 2006 is estimated in Schedule A-4 in the Executive’s FY 2007 Recommended Budget to be \$2,409.7 million, and 5% of this is \$120.5 million. The target reserve in the General Fund planned for the end of FY 2007 does not exceed the Charter limit.
5. The constant yield tax rate requirement applies only to the General Fund tax rate for real property. The State calculated this rate to be \$0.608 for FY 2007. The Council sets the General Fund rate at \$0.624. Since the rate the Council sets for the General Fund exceeds the constant yield tax rate, the Council was required to have previously informed the public and to have held a public hearing to give the public a chance to comment. On April 4, 2006, in Resolution 15-1384, the Council stated its intent to consider a General Fund rate of \$0.679, which exceeds the constant yield tax rate. On April 6, 2006, the Council placed an advertisement of this intent in a newspaper of general circulation, and the Council held the public hearing on April 27, 2006.
