DESCRIPTION

This project follows the Facility Planning recommendations to improve certain pedestrian areas on Georgia Avenue and some side streets in the commercial area of Montgomery Hills. Georgia Avenue improvements will be limited to ADA accessible new sidewalks (up to 2,000 linear feet), plant material (shrubs), and banners. The side streets will have new sidewalks, trees and streetlights (up to 1,000 linear feet).

The proposed improvements will be used daily by thousands of customers, employees, and residents.

JUSTIFICATION

The project is supported by the Silver Spring Citizens Advisory Board, the Silver Spring Urban District Advisory Committee, and the Greater Silver Spring Chamber of Commerce. The project provides up to 2,000 linear feet of improvements to the sidewalk area on Georgia Avenue, up to 1,000 linear feet of streetscape improvements on side streets such as Seminary Road, Columbia Road, Seminary Place, White Oak Drive, Corwin Drive, Flora Lane, and Luzerne Drive.

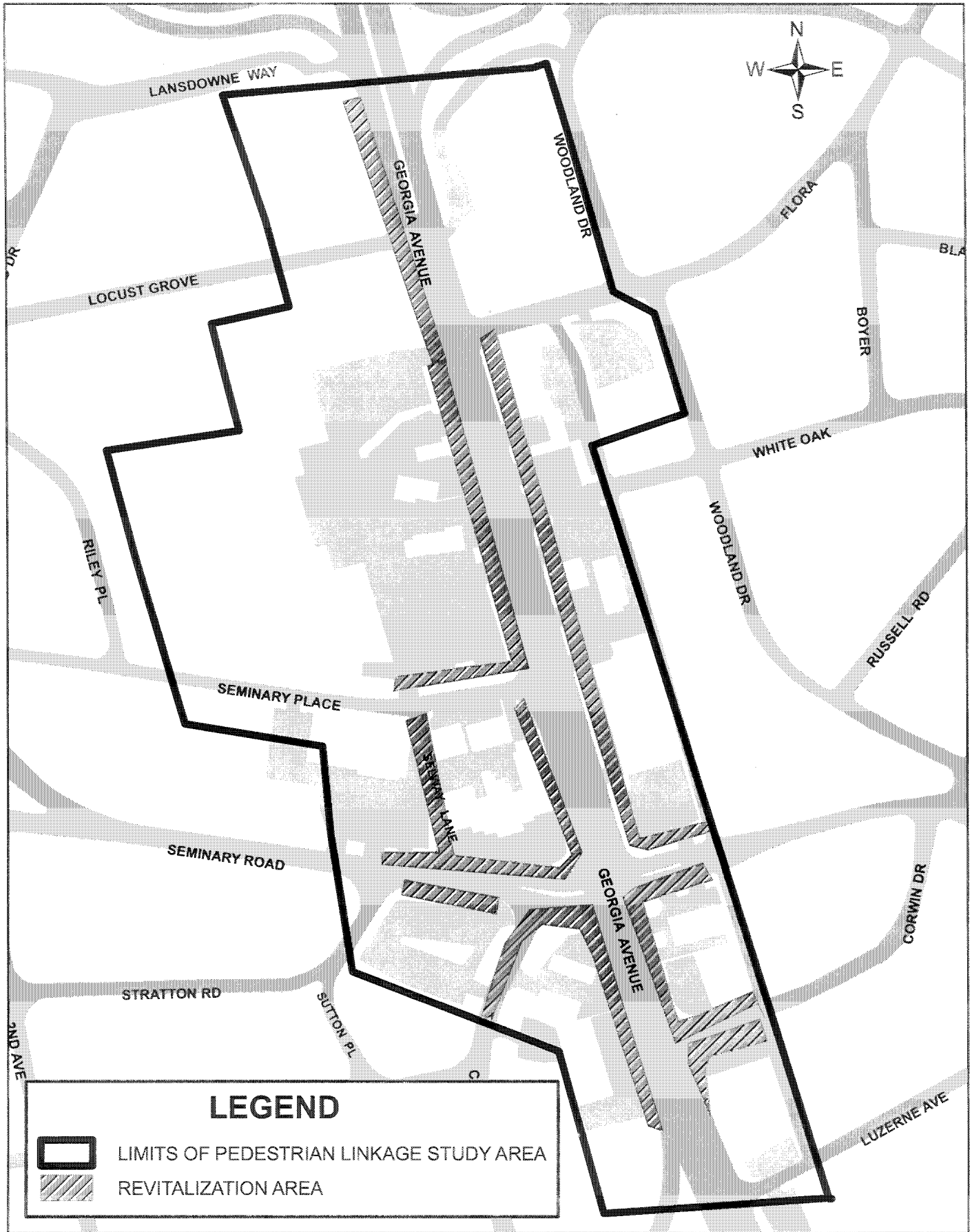
