- 22 need that conditional use. So that is why we are applying

11 where the two houses are, my house and their place is right

12 on the corner of Ewing and Johnson.

13 LYNN ROBESON: Ok. Let me just do this, I have so just

14 so I understand-

15 ETAI NEUMAN: I just want to explain the street

16 because I think there are some dynamics about the street

17 that I think would help explain some of my testimony.

18 LYNN ROBESON: Ok. Hold on one second. I am just

19 trying to get- There is a map in here. Here is a map. If

20 you could all approach please. I am showing you exhibit 27

21 which is the staff report page 10. Can you mark where your

22 house is in relation to-Ok. So just put an X there.

23 ETAI NEUMAN: This is my house. That is the daycare

24 center. This is marked as the middle school.

LYNN ROBESON: Alright. That is marked on the map.

ETAI NEUMAN: So, Ewing is a major thoroughfare. There

2 are a lot of cars go by and so is Johnson. So all of

these, all the busses, all the elementary school busses and

4 all the middle school busses. So the middle school busses

go right through here in the morning.

LYNN ROBESON: When you say go right through here the

transport doesn't know where-

ETAI NEUMAN: I am sorry. Ok. I am sorry.

LYNN ROBESON: It goes through- The busses-

ETAI NEUMAN: So Johnson is a major thoroughfare for

11 the middle school because Johnson is the entrance that all

12 of the busses go through when they drop off all of the kids

13 in the parking lot for North Bethesda Middle School. So

14 anyone who takes a school bus it goes through Johnson or up

15 Ewing and then goes in the street.

LYNN ROBESON: It goes South on Ewing and then right-

17 ETAI NEUMAN: Right but most of them come down

18 Johnson. It is convenient and come off because there is a

19 lot of feeder streets that come in there.

20 LYNN ROBESON: Ok.

ETAI NEUMAN: And the same thing with- My daughter

22 actually goes to Wyngate. So Wyngate busses they are after,

23 a lot of them come through Johnson and make a right on

24 Ewing and head over to Wyngate.

LYNN ROBESON: Ok. Wyngate-

ETAI NEUMAN: Wyngate Elementary. I am sorry. The

reason I made this point is that this is already a crowded

street and I think the fact that they have people parking,

getting out of the car. So people do not park in their

driveway. I would be very happy if they could find a

solution where somebody like if they created a circular

driveway or some kind of drop-off point but what happens

now is people park on the street. It is already a very

crowded street. They get out of their car and most of the

10 drop-offs are right around this school time. So most of

11 their drop-offs are between 7 and 8:30.

LYNN ROBESON: When are the school times? Is that the

13 same peak of the school in your opinion?

ETAI NEUMAN: Yes. So the busses- So school- I know

15 that Wyngate starts at around 8:50. I usually drop my

16 daughter off around 8:40. So the busses are coming a little

17 bit before then and North Bethesda is about half an hour to

18 45 minutes before that.

LYNN ROBESON: Ok. Now you can take your- You can go

20 back and sit.

21 ETAI NEUMAN: So, I mean they have two cars that are

22 almost always in their driveway. I don't know who lives at

23 this residence. I have never really spoken to them. So they

24 claim that only one of them lives there but there is always

25 two cars in their driveway. They have a small driveway

which barely fits two cars.

LYNN ROBESON: Is it a tandem? One behind the other or

side by side?

ETAI NEUMAN: They park like half on the grass. So it

gets thin and then gets a little bit wider but there is

always two cars there. So my issue, if they want to expand

now there is going to be- I know they claim that it is all

brothers and sisters but I think there is an issue now and

9 I think that is an issue that one needs to be addressed now

10 but secondly is not in the best interest of the community

11 to have more cars there. More people not appropriately

12 parking. I don't think they have really- I am sure they run

13 a great daycare. I have no issue with daycare but I don't

14 think they have really thought through this drop-off

15 process.

LYNN ROBESON: Ok and when you say not appropriately

17 parking what do you mean by that?

ETAI NEUMAN: Well, I am just saying as far as-Ok so

19 they have an appropriated parking for drop-offs. So whether

20 it is pull into some kind of driveway or some kind of area

21 verses just park anywhere on the street, get out, and then

22 either walk across or do whatever.

LYNN ROBESON: What staff has recommended is that they

24 have to park either on their side of Johnson or Ewing and

25 staff has recommended and I don't know if you have a copy

of the staff report.

ETAI NEUMAN: I don't and I am sorry, who is staff or

what is staff?

LYNN ROBESON: Staff is the Montgomery County Planning

Department.

ETAI NEUMAN: Ok. 6

LYNN ROBESON: And if you could or let me do this let

me get you a copy because you are going to look- They have

9 a number of conditions of approval that are designed to

10 address some of your concerns and what I want to know is

11 if- I want you to look at them and I would also like to see

12 how are we going to- We got to find a way to make sure that

13 people are parking where they should be parking. So if we

14 are going to go off the record for five minutes so that I

15 can get you a copy and give you a chance to read it. The

16 conditions of approval are on page 2. Ok? So let me- We

17 will go off the record for five minutes and I will have a

18 copy of this made so that you- Ok, we are back on the

19 record. Mr. Neuman if you look at page 2 what staff is

20 suggesting is a staggered drop-off time and that they have

21 no more than five cars within certain periods of time. I

22 guess my question when I read this is how are you going to

23 enforce that. They say you must enter into an agreement but

24 it doesn't say what happens if they don't obey. Now what I

25 can say is this, instead of I can say you must enter into

1 So we don't have children come in between 8 to 8:30.

LYNN ROBESON: Well, would you have an issue if I put

a condition on that says no drop-offs between 8 and 8:30?

DAMARIS TOVAR: No. I mean we can put that condition.

Yes because of the time the parents are coming and even

they are going to start to come in after 8:30. They start

to come 8:45, 8:40. Sometimes the children arrive at 9.

LYNN ROBESON: Mr. Neuman, now that you have seen the

condition do you have any comments on it?

ETAI NEUMAN: I do. So, a couple of things. Number 1)

11 so also my driveway to get out of my driveway there is

12 typically they have their customers or somebody parks right

13 across from me which makes it very difficult and dangerous

14 to come out of my driveway at times. So, imagine this, in

15 the morning it is a busy street. There are cars that are

16 dropping off their children to either for that hour and a

17 half to either North Bethesda or Wyngate as they are coming

18 down Johnson either going straight or turning onto Ewing. I

19 then am trying to navigate between that and another car

20 that is half the time parked or one of their customers that

21 is parked and getting out of a car as I am trying to get

22 out of my driveway. So I think that makes for a bit of an

23 issue. I think that they don't have a drop-off plan that I

24 think is in the best interest of the community. I think

25 that somebody just parking on the street- If they had

18

1 an agreement but I am also going to say that that is the

2 way it has to be. This just requires you to enter into an

agreement but it doesn't say what happens if you don't make

4 the agreement.

DAMARIS TOVAR: Ok. To that what we can do is like

6 usually when the parents enroll a child we have a handbook

and an agreement. So what we can do is like with this

specific time for parking as a policy in the handbook and I

9 mean one of the policies that we have in the handbook is

10 that if they don't follow the policies we are going to

11 finish the agreement with the parent. So what we are

12 thinking we are going to (inaudible) to the park.

LYNN ROBESON: Ok. So you are saying you are going to

14 put in your contract with each parent that you can

15 terminate them if they don't park in the right or come at

16 the right time?

17 DAMARIS TOVAR: Actually I mean, we have some policies

18 not just this. I mean this one of the policies that we are

19 going to add to the handbook and actually they know that if

20 they don't follow some policies the agreement is going to

21 end. So that is what we can do and actually regarding to

22 the parking, what I know is the North Bethesda, you know

23 the school they start at 8:30 and actually right now we

24 have like two children or three children come in before 8

25 AM and then the other children start to arrive after 8:30.

LYNN ROBESON: Are you saying that they are parking on

your side of the street or you are saying you don't have

enough room to come out?

5 ETAI NEUMAN: I think it is both. So sometimes they

park on my side of the street but sometimes they park on

the other end which makes it tight to come out of the

8 driveway.

9 LYNN ROBESON: Do you want to respond to that?

10 DAMARIS TOVAR: I get into that. Ok before he was

11 saying that we have two cars parking on our driveway all

12 the time that is not true. I mean my husband we have two

13 cars and my husband is working all day long. So he is

14 taking one car with him. Some of the parents they are

15 parking on the driveway. Especially we have a parent who is

16 parking almost all the time.

18 DAMARIS TOVAR: We have a parent.

19 LYNN ROBESON: Yeah.

20 DAMARIS TOVAR: He is parking sometimes on his side of

21 the street but I think he is not taking more than 10

22 minutes to park on there because usually they are parking

23 in front of Johnson Avenue Street. We have like some stairs

24 to getting to the front door. So usually they are parking

25 there and we have like three cars they are parking almost

2 LYNN ROBESON: The three cars for what?

3 DAMARIS TOVAR: Let's say that three parents are

4 coming to pick up the children.

5 LYNN ROBESON: Yeah.

DAMARIS TOVAR: So the three parents are parking on

7 Johnson Street on our side of the street. So and as if I

8 honest with you, we just have one parent or one mom and she

9 is parking in front of his house. It is not in front of his

10 driveway. It is close to the driveway but it is not in

11 front of the driveway.

LYNN ROBESON: Ok but if you get this conditional use

13 they have to park where this says they are going to park.

DAMARIS TOVAR: Yeah. And I may what also can I add is

15 if we need to make a commitment with the parents where they

16 need to sign we are willing to do it. I mean we understand

17 it is his side of the street and we understand that

18 sometimes this is bothering for him because his house or-

19 LYNN ROBESON: Well he is saying that even when they

20 park on your side of the street he has trouble getting out.

21 JUAN CARLOS GARZON: The street is for three lines the

22 cars. His side are one maybe for go through. It is bigger

23 enough the street. Not one street is smaller than one line

24 car.

25 LYNN ROBESON: How wide is the street?

1 DAMARIS TOVAR: Not two way, no.

2 JUAN CARLOS GARZON: No because to get that there is-

3 there can be there four lines. Like this case is three

4 lines. There is enough space.

6 are saying.

23 there right now.

occur. I can only ask you to be responsible for your cars.

2 DAMARIS TOVAR: Ok.

LYNN ROBESON: Not whoever parks on the street.

DAMARIS TOVAR: Ok.

5 LYNN ROBESON: Ok. So-

ETAI NEUMAN: How do you delineate that? I am just

curious. That it is a drop-off verses someone else because

couldn't they just claim it is somebody else?

LYNN ROBESON: We have actually had daycare cases and

10 as part of the contract they have to keep- Well I can ask

11 you as part of your contract to keep the registration, the

12 license numbers of all your parents.

13 ETAI NEUMAN: Oh I see. There you go. That is easy.

someone else parking there and them getting into trouble

7 for it.

8 LYNN ROBESON: They are and what I am saying-

ETAI NEUMAN: I understand that too.

10 LYNN ROBESON: What I am saying to you is, it is not,

11 I can only control you. So it is your, if somebody else is

12 parked there on Johnson Street at 8:45 that is not going to

13 be a violation.

DAMARIS TOVAR: Ok.

LYNN ROBESON: It is if one of your people park there. 15

16 Ok? I can ask you to keep a record of the license plates.

17 As I said most daycares-

18 DAMARIS TOVAR: Yeah we have more.

LYNN ROBESON: And we can do it that way and say no

20 parking on Johnson frontage between 7:15 and 8:45 which is

21 sounds to me like the peak period of congestion on your

22 street. They can park in the driveway and the garage or

23 they can park on Ewing.

DAMARIS TOVAR: Ewing. 24

25 LYNN ROBESON: Ewing. Correct. And then if you keep

1 the license and registration plates then DPS if he

complains you can say that wasn't our person.

DAMARIS TOVAR: Ok. Yeah we can do that.

4 LYNN ROBESON: But you cannot control the

construction. I am not saying that construction people

can't park there. I am just saying that you can't have your

people park there. Ok? Alright. With that, anything else?

DAMARIS TOVAR: No.

9 LYNN ROBESON: I see a question.

ETAI NEUMAN: No. I was just looking. I mean it sounds

11 like they were trying to put, so it says here no more than

12 2 cars arriving and leaving within a 15 minute window. I

13 just don't think these things are enforced. But I think by

14 you putting in the specifics around 7:15-8:45 I think would

15 alleviate all this, all this issue. Yes, I feel confident 16 about that.

17 LYNN ROBESON: Ok good.

ETAI NEUMAN: That will include the employees' cars 18

19 also?

20 LYNN ROBESON: I think the employee- Yes it is all

21 cars. But your employees- Oh yes they get dropped off by

22 car right? Right. It would include the employees' cars as

23 well. But I am not saying you don't have any dropped off.

24 You have Ewing and you have if you want to leave the garage

25 open. However you want to do it you can do that as well.
