**Re: LMA H-159 — Submission of Reference Excerpts – Stormwater Planning Context**

To the Office of Zoning and Administrative Hearings:

I am submitting the attached documents for inclusion in the record as reference materials related to public testimony concerning stormwater considerations associated with the proposed Notley Road development.

The submission consists of limited, excerpted pages from two publicly available planning and design documents:

**1. Montgomery County Drainage Design Criteria**

Excerpted pages are submitted solely to illustrate how the County defines design rainfall through intensity-duration-frequency data and how concentrated stormwater flows are addressed in County standards. These excerpts are provided for reference only and are not submitted as site-specific engineering analysis.

**2. Ellicott City Watershed Master Plan (Final Adopted)**
